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**McGARRELL IS VISITING ARTIST.** The internationally-known artist James McGarrell will be conducting a printmaking workshop on campus from January 24 through January 28. Mr. McGarrell, who spent many years as professor of fine art and director of graduate painting studies at Indiana University, is presently professor of art at Washington University in St. Louis. His work is represented in important public collections including the Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden in Washington, D.C., the Whitney Museum of American Art and the Museum of Modern Art in New York City, and Centre Georges Pompidou in Paris. 1984 TAX GUIDE. The 1984 Tax Guide for College Teachers (and Other College Personnel) is now available to you through Library Services. This year's tax guide reflects the basic changes in the law for 1983 tax returns. This includes new rules for depreciation of books, equipment, automobiles; new rules for deducting medical expenses; a doubling of the marriage deduction; and various other changes in the law.

According to the publisher, this book contains special information which is hard to find in other tax guides and which is not always understood by most professional tax preparers. It is available on reserve by asking at the check-out desk.

FREE BROCHURES containing information on Tele-Tax also are available in the Library. Tele-tax is a new service provided by the IRS which allows persons with push-button telephones to obtain recorded tax information. The brochures are available at the check-out desk.
