FIVE-YEAR SERVICE AWARDS SET FOR MARCH 22 DINNER.

Clerical/support employees who completed five years of service during 1976 will be honored during the annual 5-Year Staff Recognition Dinner on March 22.

Five persons will receive silver pins and award certificates as a highlight of the social hour and dinner festivities in the University Dining Hall on the top level of the University Center.

The five persons to be honored are *MR. ED BURK*, Duplicating; *MRS. SUE CHASTAIN*, Financial Aids; *MR. LARRY FELDHAUS*, Mailroom; *MRS. MARGARET JONES*, Library, and *MRS. ROBERTA SCHWEIZER*, Switchboard.

An awards ceremony has been an annual dinner event at the University, providing co-workers and the University an opportunity to honor clerical/support personnel who complete five years. Honorees and spouse or guest will be guests of the University.

Clerical/support personnel and administrative supervisors of the honorees may make reservations for themselves and spouse or guest by returning the reservations form to the Personnel Office along with \$4.35 for each person planning to attend. Checks should be made payable to ISUE. The social hour (including refreshments) and the dinner are included in the cost. NEH FELLOWSHIPS. The National Endowment for the Humanities has announced fellowships for independent study and research. Awards will be for periods of six or twelve months and are for full-time studies. Included in the scope of support are the following: history, philosophy, languages, linguistics, literature, archaeology, jurisprudence, history and criticism of the arts, ethics, comparative religion, and those aspects of the social sciences that employ historical or philosophical approaches. The Endowment expresses a continuing interest in studies of the relationships between human values and science and technology. Applicants must have completed their professional training. The application deadline is June 1, 1977.

VISITATION DAY PLANNED BY ADMISSIONS. A campus Visitation Day is being planned for junior and senior high school students on March 30, 1977 at Indiana State University Evansville. The Visitation Day will allow students considering college to see ISUE, meet faculty members, and discuss course requirements and career opportunities. The program will begin at 10:00 a.m. and conclude at 2:00 p.m.

Students will lunch in the University Center Dining Room. They will also be allowed to sit in on college classes in afternoon sessions.

Campus Visitation Days are being sponsored by the ISUE Office of Admissions.

SONDRA MATTHEWS TO SPEAK AT HUMANITIES FORUM, The February 24 ISUE Humanities Forum will feature Ms. Sondra Matthews of Evansville presenting "The Demise of White Superiority as a Tool for Disciplining Generations of Blacks."

In her comments, Ms. Matthews will show historically how the values of whites have been imposed on the blacks in such a way that blacks were forced to accept them. She will point out that blacks have a new image of themselves and that the new image is not necessarily determined through white values.

She will also be presenting research documenting that the African man, not the American Indian, was the first settler of North America.

Her discussion will begin at 11:00 a.m. on February 24 in the Rare Books Room of the ISUE Library.

Ms. Matthews is editor of Black History newspaper, president of the Inner City Neighborhood Planning Council and public relations co-ordinator at Keller Crescent.

The ISUE Humanities Forum offers weekly discussion of local persons and members of the ISUE faculty on topics of current interest. The forum is sponsored by the Humanities Division and is open to the public.

EVENT PLANNED FOR COUNSELORS, The ISUE Office of Admissions and the ISUE Office of Alumni Affairs are jointly sponsoring a Hospitality Room, Thursday, February 24, from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the Evansville Executive Inn. This program is designed to help welcome Indiana High School Counselors to Evansville for the annual conference of the Indiana Personnel and Guidance Association. This is the first time the IPGA Conference has been held in Evansville.
