1. School Fire Alarm:

At the present time our "In Building Alarm System" is not connected with the "Fire Department System". Therefore, in addition to pulling an alarm, we must phone the fire department(425-8141) to report a fire. The alarm system will sound within the building and will alert the occupants of the fire, but it will not alert the Fire Department. This situation will be corrected with the completion of work on St. Joseph Street, and you will be again notified of this correction.

2. Faculty and Staff Parking:

When the main parking lot and parking areas designated for faculty and staff parking are filled, street parking in the adjacent community should be utilized. Faculty and staff wishing to rent a parking spot from property owners in the adjacent community should contact the Business Office.

3. Vocational Counseling for Students:

Miss Maxine Nesbit, from the Indiana Employment Security Division, will be on the Evansville Campus of Indiana State University from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. each Thursday to provide vocational counseling for our students. We would like to urge the faculty to refer any student to Mrs. Nesbit who are in need of this kind of counseling. As a guide, you may use the following description of the kind of student that should be referred to her:

Veterans, recent high school graduates and other youth who:

1. Have no vocational choice and desire assistance in making such a choice.
2. Have a desire to change vocational goal.
3. Are undecided between two or more choices.
4. Want vocations considerable above or below capacities.
5. Want vocations for which there is little or no opportunity.
6. Have disabilities which present special problems.
7. Must leave school because of finances, but want further training along same line.
8. Need help in selecting suitable alternative training programs.
9. Are having problems related to budgeting time.
10. Are having problems related to "how to study".
11. Have problems of adjustment -- getting along with professors, teachers, fellow students, family groups -- which are effecting progress in college.

Dr. Maurice K. Townsend, dean of Stanislaus State College, Turlock, Calif., has been named vice president for academic affairs at Indiana State University and will take over the position here on January 1, 1969.

Dr. Townsend is a native of Yakima, Washington, and earned the A.B. degree (cum laude) at Bost University (1949) and the A.M. (1950) and Ph.D. (1954) degrees at the University of Chicago.

He has been dean of the college at Stanislaus State College since July, 1966, and holds the rank of professor of political science.

Dean Rice reports to the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs for faculty affairs.
