ISUE WINS GRANT. The Indiana Committee for the Humanities (ICH) has awarded a \$3,177 grant to ISUE for the project Growing Up in Evansville. In a previously funded ICH project, Dr. Darrel E. Bigham, professor of history, interviewed natives of a number of Evansville neighborhoods to create a slide-tape presentation depicting Evansville at the turn of the century. With this grant he will edit and transpose the program to half-inch videotape for school and library use, develop an oral history manual, and conduct an in-service training program for high school teachers. The project coordinator will be Sylvia Neff Weinzapfel, coordinator of special projects and programs for women at ISUE.

POLICY ON CANCELLATIONS DUE TO INCLEMENT WEATHER. Occasions when University functions will be cancelled will be extremely rare. Thus, even in severe weather conditions--heavy snowfall, ice storms, extreme cold--the University's academic programs, courses, classes and seminars will continue and administrative offices will remain open.

Even though inclement weather results in hardships and inconvenience for students, faculty and staff, the overall interests of the University are best served by keeping to the regular class (day and night) schedule, except in the rarest circumstances. The primary consideration is the safety of students traveling both to and from classes. Thus, conditions of area highways and city streets are considered as well as campus conditions.

The decision of the University to cancel classes will be made by the Vice President for Academic Affairs. When such a decision is made, the following procedures will be observed:

- (a) all campus offices and departments will remain open and function on their normal schedule;
- (b) members of the administrative and clerical-support staff are expected to fulfill their university assignments; and
- (c) members of the faculty are expected to fulfill their responsibilities in pursuit of scholarship in research activities, and in class preparation.

The decision of the University to close administrative offices will be made by the President of Campus. In such an event, some departments which provide essential functions must continue to operate. Supervisors of these departments are responsible for maintaining sufficient staff to accomplish these functions in the event of any administrative closing.

The policy on cancellations can be found in the University Handbook.

MESSAGE FROM THE AFFIRMATIVE ACTION OFFICE. Included in the recently distributed faculty and administrative handbook is a copy of the University's Affirmative Action Plan. Guidelines for Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era and Handicapped Persons are included in the plan. In addition, Guidelines on Sexual Harassment, Acting Appointments and Filling Open Positions are a part of the plan.

Indiana State University Evansville reaffirms its present policy of non-discrimination and equal employment opportunity with respect to recruitment, hiring, training, promotion, and treatment of persons in all organizations, services, and programs under the legal control of the Trustees of Indiana State University which shall be maintained on a nondiscriminatory basis in regard to race, sex, religion, handicap, age, or national origin at all times.

Indiana State University Evansville will continue to take positive actions to ensure against discrimination directed to all persons. All members of the faculty and staff are expected to give full support to the University's commitment to equal opportunity and affirmative action.

- (3) The University Library will be closed whenever University offices are closed, and will be open from 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on December 19-21, 27-30, and January 3-6, and 9-13.

PEOPLE IN THE NEWS. Dr. James Blevins, chairman, Division of Humanities, has been elected chairman of the Indiana Committee for the Humanities. This will be his second term as chairman.

Dr. Eliseo Da Rosa, professor of economics, is author of "Economics, Politics, and Hydroelectric Power: The Parana River Basin," published in the Autumn issue of the Latin American Research Review (vol XVII, number 3, 1983), pp. 77-107.

Dr. Da Rosa lectured in Asuncion, Paraguay, August 7, at the invitation of the Chancellor of the Catholic University, on "The First Ten Lessons of Itaipu and Yacyreta," and conducted a one-week seminar at the Law School of the Catholic University on the topic "The Economic Analysis of Law."

Dr. Da Rosa also lectured at the Economic Research Institute of the University of Tucuman August 15 and at the School of Engineering of the University of Belgrano, Buenos Aires August 18 while he was conducting research at the headquarters of the Binational Hydroelectric Corporations of Itaipu, Yacyreta, and Salto Grande, in Argentina, Brazil, and Uruguay.

At the International Conference of the Latin American Studies Association held in Mexico City September 28 - October 2, Dr. Da Rosa chaired a panel and delivered a paper entitled "Itaipu and Yacyreta Ten Years Later." He also attended the International Conference on "Models of Political and Economic Change in Latin America," organized by the Center for Latin American and Iberian Studies of Vanderbilt University, November 3-5 where he was moderator in the panel "The Cases of Argentina, Brazil, and Chile."
