SOME SUMMER NONCREDIT CLASSES STILL OPEN. It is not too late to sign up for "Small Gasoline Engine Maintenance and Repair," "Disco Dancing," or "Football Officiating."

"Small Gasoline Engine Maintenance and Repair" includes instruction in disassembly, inspection, repair, and reassembly of small (single Cylinder) 2 and 4 cycle gasoline engines of the type used on lawnmowers, tillers, and chain saws. Participants must provide an engine; tools are supplied by ISUE. LARRY GOSS, associate professor of engineering technology, will conduct the course on five Tuesdays, July 3 through July 31 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the ISUE Technology Center, Room 114.

A number of sections of "Disco Dancing" are being offered this summer. Rex Berger, disco instructor, will conduct classes on five Wednesdays beginning today, June 27, through August 1 (no class on July 4), from 7:15 to 8:15 p.m. and from 8:30 to 9:30 p.m. The course is also offered on five Thursdays beginning June 28 through July 26, from 7:15 to 8:15 p.m. and from 8:30 to 9:30 p.m.

Designed for coaches and their staffs, fans and potential officials, "Football Officiating" is a thorough interpretation of the rules and officiating techniques of football including signals, procedures for penalty enforcement, the kicking game, pass interference, scoring plays and the mechanics of the three and four man crews. Jack Behme, IHSAA Certified Official, will teach the course on seven Mondays, July 19 through August 20, from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m.
