The fifth Mid-America Conference for Teachers of Psychology will be held Friday and Saturday, October 14-15, in the University of Southern Indiana Conference Center. Among featured speakers on the "Commitment to Excellence" theme will be:

* Howard Pollio of the University of Tennessee, a Distinguished Research Professor, former National Phi Beta Kappa lecturer, author of several books including an introductory psychology textbook, and co-author of "Making Sense of College Grades." The title of his presentation will be "Making the Familiar Strange: Teaching Consciousness to Undergraduates."

* Robert S. Daniel of the University of Missouri, founding editor of the journal, *Teaching of Psychology*, and recipient of the Distinguished Service Award from the American Psychological Association Division on Teaching, the AMOCO Teaching Award, and the American Psychological Foundation Contribution to Teaching Award. His presentation title will be "Sex, Sin, and Shame."

* Stephen Davis of Emporia State College, president-elect of the APA Division on Teaching, most recent recipient of the APF Contribution to Teaching Award, and a consulting editor to *Teaching of Psychology*. He also is a recipient of the Florence Denmark Award for outstanding advising of a Psi Chi (National Honorary) chapter. He will participate in a session on improving teaching and "Saturday Morning Live" demonstrations for introductory psychology and present a session on "The Professional Psychologist: A Course Designed to Help Students Survive."

* Drew Appleby of Marian College, recipient of the Outstanding Advisor Award from the American College Testing Program and the National Academic Advising Association. He will present a session on "Facilitating Academic Advising with the Micro-computer" and participate in the "Saturday Morning Live" demonstrations.

The sessions will close around noon Saturday with a presentation of the popular "Psych Follies" by the USI Psi Chi Chapter. Dr. Joseph J. Palladino, chairman of the USI Psychology Department, is coordinating the annual program.
