ISUE MEN'S AND WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TEAMS WILL PLAY IN POST-SEASON TOURNAMENTS. ISUE's Screaming Eagles have earned a berth in the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional Tournament to be played at Western Illinois University in Macomb.

Tickets to the tournament may be obtained by calling the Development Office at extension 1918 by Wednesday, March 4. After Wednesday, ticket information may be obtained

by calling Rita Betz at 1846. The Development Office is also handling a bus trip package sponsored by the Varsity Club. Cost of the bus package is \$41.00 per person including tickets. The bus will depart from ISUE on Friday, March 6 at 7:30 a.m. and return March 8. Tickets without bus reservations are \$8.00 for both the Friday, March 6 and Saturday, March 7 contests. Arrangements for overnight accommodations are also being handled by ISUE.

Student activities has arranged a tournament package available to ISUE students which includes round-trip transportation, double room accommodations at the Western Illinois University Conference Center, and tickets. The buses will leave Friday, March 6 at 8:00 a.m. and return on Sunday, March 8 at 4:00 p.m. The bus package costs \$45.00. To make reservations, call Student Activities at extension 1862.

The ISUE Lady Eagles were assured a berth in the IAIW Tournament by finishing as runner-up in the IAIW Tournament February 27 and 28 at IU - Southeast in New Albany. The ISUE women will play Butler University, State Tournament host, on Friday, March 6, at 8:00 p.m. in Indianapolis. The State final game will be played at 2:00 p.m. Saturday. The Indiana champions will advance to the Region V Midwest Tournament at Franklin College. The national tournament will be held in Dayton, Ohio.

Since travel time may necessitate missing classes, proper arrangements should be made by faculty for class work to continue or be made up.
