
MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

The intercollegiate athletic program at Indiana State University Evansville is expanding in the field of women's sports to include tennis and softball. ISUE fielded its first women's basketball team last year and with the addition of these new sports offerings and a full-time women's coach, the program will provide competitive sports to ISUE women athletes. ISUE welcomes the opportunity to offer programs in varsity sports for women. This early stage of development in the athletic program provides an opportune time to add this new dimension.

Men will continue to compete in baseball, tennis, golf, and basketball in the ISUE men's athletic program.

A Health, Physical Education, and Recreation building is being planned for ISUE. The facility would provide a large playing area, adequate for playing a variety of games at one time; dressing rooms; a swimming pool; faculty offices; and classrooms. The building is being proposed for the 1979-80 academic year, with the request for funding to be presented in the 1977 legislature. It will be a welcome facility to the campus community. The Health, Physical Education, and Recreation building will allow the campus to strengthen its academic programs, physical education courses, and offer students a facility for maintaining good health through physical exercise.

COACH WAYNE BOULTINGHOUSE



This marks Coach Boultinghouse's third season at the helm of the ISUE athletic program. Since that time, there has been an expansion into women's sports and a greater emphasis for development of men's sports.

One of Coach Boultinghouse's primary objectives for up-grading the basketball program was to develop a competitive, attractive schedule. He has now reached that plateau with the 76-77 ISUE schedule. He has originated the season-opening River City Tip-Off Classic, scheduled former NCAA Champion Roanoke, powerful Tennessee State, major power Toledo, and Western Michigan, Western Illinois, and included his Eagles in the All-American Tournament hosted by Kentucky Wesleyan. The balance of the schedule includes the continued rivalries with some of the Midwest's finest basketball schools.

Coach Boultinghouse feels that this is an important year in the growth of the ISUE basketball program. "This represents a pivotal year for us," explained the Eagle's head coach. "Plenty of people have placed a lot of faith in me during the developmental stages of this sport. It is now time for us to reward those people with a productive season."

One of the reasons the coach is optimistic is because he returns six major letter winners. He supplemented this group with a fine recruiting season this past spring. After looking at the roster, it can be determined that the 76-77 version of the Eagles will excel in quickness. This should forewarn the opposition that they can expect a variety of pressure defenses and a fast break-oriented offense.

Coach Boultinghouse, the former University of Evansville basketball and baseball standout, knows what it takes to produce a champion. During his playing and coaching days for the Aces, they won two NCAA national basketball titles (1964, 1971). He hopes to bring the same type of success to ISUE.

Athletics is a focal point for the Boultinghouse family. Wayne's wife, Billie, teaches and coaches at Harrison High School. Her past two gymnastics teams have finished third in the state.

The basketball staff felt they had accomplished a recruiting coup last spring when they signed the talented, high-leaping Curl. The former Arkansas All-Stater has played the last two seasons at Westark Community College in Ft. Smith. During this span he averaged 19 points and 12 rebounds a game while leading his team to a combined 57-12 record.

"Randy is a fierce competitor," comments Coach Boultinghouse. "Combine this with his outstanding ability and you have a player that will make us a winner. He possesses an arsenal of offensive moves around the basket and is a strong rebounder."

At the conclusion of the state's high school All-Star game, Curl was selected the game's Most Valuable Player. Randy's jumping ability and speed enables him to shoot better than 50% from the field. ISUE is expecting the same type of performances from him this season.

Randy enjoys numerous sports and outdoor activities. He particularly likes to volunteer his time to counsel and work with youth groups. While at ISUE he plans on majoring in communications. He is the son of Mrs. Bernice Curl of Pine Bluff, Arkansas.

ISUE is delighted that Nelson Faulkner decided to return home. After attending his freshman year at North Dakota State, Nelson transferred to Muscatine (Iowa) Community College his sophomore season. He led the team in scoring (16,3) and rebounding (8.7). His finest performance was against nationally-ranked Burlington when he hit 16 of 19 shots from the field and finished with 36 points.

The often quiet, but personable, former Bosse standout is expected to play a big role in ISUE's success this season. Coach Boultinghouse injected these comments about Nelson, "Nelson has always been a fine all-around basketball talent. He has a great attitude and I'm sure the program will benefit from his efforts,"

Nelson's offensive effectiveness is evidenced by his 57% shooting last season. This same type of productivity earned him all-conference honors in his junior and senior years at Bosse. It is expected that the lithe Evansville native will perform as a guardforward in the Eagles high-powered attack.

"I feel we have recruited a player that will be a standout and a leader for the next four years." This was a quote following Coach Boultinghouse's official signing of Boonville High School star Dan Labhart.

Dan was one of the recruiting objectives of the ISUE athletic staff last season. The task became somewhat difficult as the classy guard led his team to the state's "Sweet Sixteen" before being eliminated by Jeffersonville. The team finished with an 18-8 record with Dan making several of the all-state teams.

Labhart Ir a strong defensive player and a great floor general. He still managed a 15.7 scoring average; shooting 47% from the field and 81% from the free throw line. His five assists per game led his teammates for the second straight season.

A two-sport standout, Labhart will also play baseball at ISUE. His .380 average and all-around play at shortstop earned him All-State honors.

Dan is an honor roll student. He was a student council representative and served as president of the senior class. He plans on majoring in math and entering the coaching profession upon graduation. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Labhart of Boonville.

John "P.K." Raybon has followed his Westark Community College teammate, Randy Curl, to ISUE. The lightning-quick guard arrives on the Eagles campus with impressive credentials. He was an ali-conference and ali-state selection. He is at his best when assuming the playmaking and leadership roles during the heat of the game.

"P.K." gives us another quality guard for this season. He knows how to play the game and has a great knack for getting the ball to the open man," commented Coach Boultinghouse.

Even though he stands only 6' "P.K." can dunk the basketball. His ball-handling and penetration ability should enable him to secure plenty of playing time for the Eagles this season.

It is anticipated that he should delight the Eagles fans with his great timing and jumping ability.

"Curtis should be an outstanding player for us. He plays both ends of the court and takes pride in his performance. I feel the fans will enjoy watching him play," injected Coach Boultinghouse.

Curtis is the only married player on the squad. He was married this past summer to JoAnn Williams of Detroit. He is pursuing a degree in elementary education. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. James Richards of Detroit, Michigan.

"Spider's" great determination and playing style has made him a favorite of the ISUE followers. The lanky forward uses every ounce of his ability to produce for the Eagles. His 15.9 scoring average and 9.4 rebounding average won him the team's "Most Valuable Player" award for the second straight season.

The 497 career rebounds that Spider has earned aiready rank him as the all-time ISUE leading rebounder. Plus, his 846 career total points is third behind Ernie Brothers' three year total of 1268 and Dave Williamson's four year total of 948.

"Spider's play, whether practice or game, exemplifies what coaches expect when they refer to intensity," relates Coach Boultinghouse. "He leads by example and this has a positive effect upon the entire squad. His play and leadership will be a tremendous asset to us this season."

The likeable Detroit native has done a lot to help the ISUE program. He is responsible for bringing his brother, Emanuel, and Curtis Richards to ISUE.

He likes all sports and music. He is majoring in elementary education. He is the son of Mrs. Ethel Caddell of Detroit, Michigan.

The coaching staff feels Emanuel has the ability to be one of the finest defensive players in the Midwest. With his size and quickness, the Eagles opposition could experience some difficulty in penetrating the ISUE pressure defenses this year. He is not one to be over-shadowed by his brother, "Spider." He is the son of Mrs. Ethel Caddell of Detroit, Michigan.

"Tony is really a catalyst for our program," explained Coach Boulinghouse. "He has the ability to inspire people with his unlimited enthusiasm and his aggressive play."

Tony had the misfortune of breaking his hand before the final game last season. Just two games prior to his accident, he scored a career high of 27 points against David Lipscomb. This could be an indication of what to expect from Tony this season. He is the son of Mrs. Frances Williams of Evansville.


