





1997-98 OUTLOOK



When the University of Southern Indiana had to fill holes made by the departure of two of its all-time greatest players — a two-time NCAA Division II Player of the Year and a 1996 Great Lakes Valley Conference Player of the Year — many people thought last season would be a down year.

When the team had to replace two starters in the middle of the year because of season-ending knee injuries, many thought the team would fold.

NOT THE USI SCREAMING EAGLES!

When the season was over, the Eagles, through hard work and determination, had a share of the Great Lakes Valley Conference title with a 16-4 league mark; had a 23-5 record; and made their fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA II Tournament.

Entering 1997-98, the Eagles will draw upon the same work ethic and determination to continue the trend which started five years ago.

USI Head Coach Bruce Pearl, who has directed the team since 1992-93, continues to lead the Eagles. Under his direction, USI has established itself as one of the premiere Division II programs in the country.

Pearl, the winningest active coach over the last five years across all three NCAA divisions, will have his work cut out for him with only one starter returning, second team All-GLVC Jeremy Pearson (Apex, N.C.).

Pearson is USI's leading returning scorer with 14.6 ppg and 6.0 rpg as a junior. The 6-6 senior guard/forward averaged 17.3 ppg and 6.6 rpg in the final eight games last year.

Joining Pearson in the frontcourt are three seniors, a junior, and a sophomore.

Looking to break into the starting lineup this season is 6-8 senior forward/center Wayne Houston (Temple Hills, Md.). Houston, who averaged 8.9 ppg and 4.6 rpg for the season, caught fire late in the year, averaging 17.5 ppg and 8.3 rpg in the final four games.

All of the Eagles' fans are rooting for 6-8 senior forward Brad Chapman to make it back to the team in 1997-98. Chapman, who has had three major knee injuries in three seasons, averaged 10.5 ppg and 5.3 rpg in the first six games of last season.

USI also will need contributions from 6-5, 250 pound senior center Vic Williams, who averaged 6.5 rpg in the final five games of last season; hustling 6-6 junior forward Joel Thomas, who sat out last season with a knee injury; and 6-8 sophomore center Andy Swan, who showed a lot of promise in his first season.

In the backcourt, Pearl will have to replace both starters, including first team All-GLVC performer Johnny Moore and USI's all-time assist leader, Marc Hostetter. Along with setting the assist mark, Hostetter played in more games than any other player in Eagles history.

Off last season's bench, the Eagles have a lot of youth in a junior, three sophomores, and one freshman. The most experienced player returning is the versatile 6-6 guard/forward Tim Tooley (Huntingburg, Ind.), who can play in a number of positions. He averaged 4.3 ppg and 3.3 rpg as a sophomore.

The sophomore guards, who saw a lot of action off the bench last season, are 6-2 point guard Kevin Herdes and 6-3 shooting guard Ryan Kelley. Herdes, who played in all 28 games, averaged 1.7 assists a game, while Kelley averaged 3.0 ppg in 27 games in 1996-97.

Redshirted last season, Larry Moore, a 6-0 sophomore guard who transferred to USI last season from Eastern Illinois University, and B.J. Watts, a 6-5 freshman guard, should be ready to go after spending last year learning the USI system.

To bolster the guard position the Eagles have five new players, three junior transfers and two freshmen.

Transferring to USI are juniors Ryan Owens, a 6-2 point guard and Rod Gatson, a 6-6 guard/forward. Owens, who played locally at Princeton High School, averaged 5.2 ppg and 4.7 assists last year for the University of Tennessee-Martin. Owens was voted a member of the Ohio Valley Conference All-Freshman team his first season as a collegiate.

Gatson played for Rich Central High School in Chicago and for Cochise College. Out of collegiate basketball since 1992, he averaged 16.3 ppg and 7.0 rpg as a sophomore for Cochise

Starting their collegiate careers at USI this fall are Matt Carter (Cannelton, Ind.) a 6-2 guard from Perry Central High School; and Mark Pitcher, a 6-0 guard from Franklin High School. Junior guard John Bucher transfers to the Eagles program from Brescia College.

Carter was second in the state in scoring and voted second team All-State at PCHS.

USI MEN'S COACHING STAFF

USI Head Coach Bruce Pearl

In five seasons Bruce Pearl catapulted the USI men's basketball program into the NCAA Division II's elite. Pearl's teams have a record of 127-24 (.841), making him the winningest active college basketball coach in America.



In 1995-96 and 1996-97, he led the Eagles to their first back-to-back Great Lakes Valley Conference championship seasons since 1980 and 1981. The Eagles finished 25-4 overall, 18-2 GLVC in 1995-96 and 23-5 overall, 16-4 GLVC, in 1996-97. USI has set two school records during his tenure, five consecutive NCAA Division II Tournaments appearances and five consecutive 20-win seasons.

Pearl, whose Eagles have won the GLVC title three of the last four seasons, also

became USI's all-time leader in wins last year. In each of the five seasons, Pearl's Eagles have finished as either the GLVC champions or only one game out of first.

Over the five years, Pearl, who at age 37 has proven to be one of the brightest young coaches in the nation, has coached two players named national Player of the Year; four players named All-American; two players named GLVC Player of the Year; three players named GLVC Newcomer of the Year; five players named first team All-GLVC; and ten players named Academic All-GLVC.

In 1994-95, Pearl, the NABC National Coach of the Year, led the Screaming Eagles to the University's first NCAA Division II National Championship. Pearl's Eagles also captured their second straight Great Lakes Regional championship, finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally, and had a 29-4 overall record.

In 1993-94 Pearl directed the Eagles to what was then their best season in school history (28-4) and finished the regular season ranked ninth. The Eagles earned a GLVC championship (16-2), a Great Lakes Regional championship, and played as a finalist in the NCAA II championship game. Pearl became only the second coach in GLVC history to be named conference Coach of the Year in two straight seasons, and reached 50 wins faster than any coach in USI history.

In his initial season, Pearl led the Screaming Eagles to a 22-7 record, a second-place finish in the Great Lakes Valley Conference with a 14-4 record, a berth in the NCAA Division II tournament, a final regular season rank of 11th, and received his first GLVC Coach of the Year award. The success of the

team in 1992-93 was the biggest turnaround in GLVC history after inheriting a squad which finished 10-18 overall, 4-14 GLVC, in 1991-92.

Prior to coming to USI, Pearl was an assistant coach at the University of Iowa, where he was responsible for implementing full-court pressure defensive tactics. He also was responsible for the performance of Iowa's inside players, particularly the offensive and defensive post players. Coach Pearl taught many current pro basketball players, including Brad Lohaus (Charlotte Hornets), Acie Earl (Milwaukee Bucks), B.J. Armstrong (Golden State Warriors), Kevin Gamble (Sacramento Kings), and Matt Bullard (Houston Rockets).

During Pearl's six-year stay at Iowa, the Hawkeyes received five tournament berths, one final eight appearance (1987), one final 16 appearance (1988), and placed eight players in the National Basketball Association. While at Iowa, Pearl helped head coach Dr. Tom Davis to a 129-63 record. For his efforts, Pearl was recognized in 1988 as one of the top Division I assistants in the country by Basketball Weekly.

Upon leaving Iowa, Pearl ended 14 years as an assistant and right-hand man to Dr. Davis. Prior to joining Davis at Iowa, Pearl was Davis' assistant coach (1982-83) and an associate head coach (1983-86) at Stanford University. As an undergraduate, Pearl was Davis' administrative assistant at Boston College (1978-82).



USI MEN'S COACHING STAFF



Assistant Coach Rick Herdes

Rick Herdes begins his sixth season at USI as Coach Bruce Pearl's top assistant coach. Herdes is considered to be one of the best recruiters in Division II basketball. This year's recruits are no exception. He also directs scouting and the highly successful Southern Indiana summer basketball camps.

In five seasons with Coach Pearl and USI, Herdes has helped direct the Eagles to a 127-24 overall record (.841), the 1995 NCAA II

National Championship, the 1994 NCAA II National Finalist finish, three Great Lakes Valley Conference Championships, five straight NCAA II Tournament appearances, and five straight 20-win seasons.

Herdes came to USI from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, where he was an assistant from 1986 to 1992. While at SIUE, Herdes helped Head Coach Larry Graham lead the Cougars to a 127-56 record and three NCAA tournament appearances. He was responsible for coordinating on- and off-campus recruiting. He also was academic advisor to the basketball team and director of summer camps and fund-raising events.

In 1991 and 1992 at SIUE, he was the head coach for the Illinois Prairie State Games, Southern Open Men's Division. His 1992 team received the silver medal.

Prior to working at SIUE, Herdes was an assistant basketball coach and physical education instructor at Lawrenceville (Ill.) High School, where he worked for current Indiana University assistant coach Ron Felling. LHS was the Illinois Class A State Champion in 1982 and 1983 and had a 68-game winning streak.

Herdes graduated from Graceland College in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in education. He is completing a master's in secondary education at USI.

As a player, Herdes led Lincoln Trail College to a ninth-place finish in the national tournament and helped lead Graceland to its first-ever appearance in the NAIA Tournament.

Herdes has a daughter, Taylor, 5, and a son, Connor, 2.

Coach Pearl On Herdes:

"I am very fortunate to have Rick Herdes as my top assistant. He came to USI with a recommendation from Bob Knight and a wealth of experience in Division II. He is loyal, hard working, and the kind of person I want at my side."

"Rick is responsible for a great deal of success we have enjoyed at USI. His contacts in this region make him a highly effective recruiter and he is one of the best camp directors with whom I have ever worked. He is preparing himself to be a tremendous head coach."





Hostetter, who is completing an undergraduate degree in biology at USI, is a native of Lyons, Ind., and a graduate of White River Valley High School.
