ISU FEDERAL CREDIT UNION. The annual meeting of the ISU Federal Credit Union was held January 21 with approximately 150 in attendance. Highlights of the past year were given by the officers. Financial growth was reported, showing assets of \$8,456,004 -- more than 10 percent growth over 1980. Dividends paid during 1981 totaled \$281,182. There were 342 new members in 1981 and 1060 loans made. Board members and Credit Committee members were elected for 1982.
