Lincoln Amphitheatre

The outdoor musical cast at Lincoln Amphitheatre is presenting the 11th annual production of *Young Abe Lincoln*, rotating nightly with Rodgers and Hammerstein's *Oklahoma!* on the amphitheatre stage at Lincoln City, Indiana. The two outdoor musicals will be presented until the season finale of *Young Abe* on Saturday, August 16.

Performances are at 8 p.m. daily, Tuesday through Sunday; matinee performances are scheduled at 1:30 p.m. Thursdays, July 31 and August 7. (The amphitheatre is closed Mondays.) Season tickets are \$25 each for unlimited attendance. Regular admission is \$12 for adults, \$7 for children (under 13), \$10 for senior citizens (60-plus), and \$10 each for groups of 20 or more. Sunday family night tickets are \$7 each. Reservations are recommended for all performances; call 800/264-4223.

Community history workshop planned

The American Association for State and Local History (AASLH) will join Historic Southern Indiana, the Association of Indiana Museums, Indiana Historical Society, and Historic New Harmony in sponsoring a "Making History With Your Community" workshop October 22-25 in New Harmony. It is the only national workshop in the country to focus on small and emerging history agencies.

Workshop sessions are tailored to new professionals and those working in small to mid-size organizations. It will feature hands-on sessions focused on essential information about starting and operating an historical agency and developing long-term relationships within the community. The sessions will deal with developing an effective mission statement, reaching new audiences and building community-based constituencies, standards of ethics, working with a board of trustees, developing a community-based collection, and writing strong collection policies.

National faculty will include **Mr. Charles F. Bryan**, director of the Virginia Historical Society, and **Ms. Katie Boardman**, associate director of programs at the Farmers Museum and New York State Historical Society. They will be joined by **Ms. Polly Jontz**, president emerita of Connor Prairie at Indianapolis, and **Ms. Mary Schnepfer**, curator of collections at the Evansville Museum of Arts and Science. **Ms. Connie Weinzapfel**, director of Historic New Harmony, will deliver the opening address.

All sessions will be in New Harmony with the exception of a dinner gathering October 23 at the Reitz Home Museum in downtown Evansville. The \$200 workshop fee covers all meals and workshop materials. For information, contact AASLH at 615/255-2971 or e-mail: aaslh@nashville.net

The New Harmony Theatre

Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream* will continue through Sunday at Murphy Auditorium as The New Harmony Theatre's second production for the 1997 Season. The *Stardust* musical revue will be presented August 1-17, and A.R. Gurney's comedy, *The Golden Age*, will close the season, running August 22-31.

Each production opens on a Friday night; performances are at 7:30 p.m. Thursdays, 8 p.m. Fridays, 2 and 8 p.m. Saturdays, and 2 p.m. Sundays at Murphy Auditorium. Summer features include Thursday family nights (children 8 to 18, \$5, with an adult); Saturday matinee talk backs; and Sunday matinee "Magic Time," (the final two slated August 3 and 24) when cast and crew explain "how did they do that." Poster Display

Students who participated in the 11-day field biology course in Belize in late May and early June are displaying posters illustrating just a few of the many sites and ecosystems they visited and studied. The students explored the enormous biodiversity found in a variety of marine and terrestrial ecosystems including: coral reefs, mangrove swamps, oceans, rainforests, rocky shores, savannas, and caves. They also spent time touring the Mayan ruins of Tikal, Guatemala. The students were accompanied by Dr. Scott A. Gordon and Dr. Deke T. Gundersen, assistant professors of biology.

Volunteer luncheon:

The first annual Volunteer USI Recognition Luncheon will be held at noon Friday, July 25, in Carter Hall, with honors to be bestowed on the Volunteer of the Year, the Volunteer Task Force which spent two years organizing the USI program, and 338 volunteers who have given 20 hours or more to the University in this first year of formal volunteer operations.

Volunteer USI records show 850 people have contributed 53,621 hours to University events this past year — 561 from the community, 158 alumni, 71 USI employees, and 30 students. This group includes

338 who donated 20 hours or more, 134 with 100 to 249 hours, 30 with 250 to 499 hours, nine with 500 to 749 hours, six with more than 750 hours, and four occupational therapy professionals who have given more than 1,000 each to assist USI occupational therapy students. Calculated at the minimum wage rate, the volunteers contributed more than \$260,000 to the University since the program got under way July 1, 1996.
