Five new faculty members have been appointed in the University of Southern Indiana School of Liberal Arts, including Dr. Margaret Skoglund, associate professor of art and chair of the Art and Music Department.

Dr. Skoglund was assistant professor of art history at the University of Central Florida, Orlando, where she had taught since 1977. She was director/lecturer for UCF summer honors programs for study in Italy and director/lecturer for about 15 years for annual Mexican tours. She received a B.S. in English from Southeast Missouri State University, and M.S. and Ph.D. in art history from the University of Missouri.

Also appointed are Stephen R. Adkins, assistant professor of theatre/technical director; Dr. Robert A. Carroll, associate professor of communications; Dr. Juliana Starr, visiting assistant professor in French; and Terri L. Watson, instructor in sociology.

Adkins, who spent the summer of 1994 at The New Harmony Theatre (which is managed by USI), also has done work at Memphis State University, Marshall University, Peabody Hotel in Memphis, Alice Lloyd College, and most recently, Boarshead Theatre in Lansing, Michigan. He received a B.F.A. in technical theatre from Marshall and M.F.A. in scenic design from Memphis State. He formerly lived in Silver Springs, Florida.

Dr. Carroll has taught journalism and public relations at Northeast Louisiana University since 1970 and for nearly 20 years, served as the director of the school's Division of Public Affairs. Prior to 1970 he worked on newspapers in Louisiana and Arkansas and since 1979, has been a public relations consultant. He received a B.A. in journalism from Northeast Louisiana, M.A. from East Texas State University, and Ph.D. in communications from the University of Southern Mississippi.

Dr. Starr has a B.A. in English from Wartburg College, Waverly, Iowa; M.A. in French literature from Marquette University, Ph.D. in French literature from Indiana University. She did research in 1987 and 1989 at the Universite d'Aix-en Provence I and Universite de Lille III. She formerly was an associate instructor at IU, general education teacher at Meyer Hall juvenile detention facility in Des Moines, and a teaching assistant at Marquette. She also taught at Lycee Camille St. Saens, 1993-94, in Rouen, France.

Ms. Watson, of Henderson, Kentucky, received a B.S. from USI in 1987 and is working on a Ph.D. at the University at Albany, New York. She was an adjunct instructor at Albany and also taught in various programs since 1990 at Siena College, New York State Museum, and Vanderheyden Hall in Wynantskill, New York.
