**MAY IS NATIONAL HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE MONTH.** During the month of May, the University Notes will bring you tips from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the National Institutes of Health, the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, and the National High Blood Pressure Education Program, on how to spot high blood pressure, how to avoid it, and how to control it.

## HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE? A VARIETY OF PROFESSIONALS CAN HELP.

If you have high blood pressure, you should control it to have a longer, healthier life. Uncontrolled high blood pressure can lead to heart or kidney disease and stroke. One way to get your blood pressure "numbers" down and to keep them down is to follow the advice of health professionals.

Your doctor is the only one who can diagnose your high blood pressure, but other health professionals also can help. Along with medication, you may be asked to lose weight, or cut back on salt or smoking. Doing these things will help your medication work better and shorten the time for you to reach your blood pressure goal. There are a number of health professionals trained to assist you, including nurses, pharmacists, nutritionists, and health educators.
