Community Nights scheduled at Lincoln Amphitheatre; residents of selected counties to get discount on admission

Residents of five Indiana counties will have the opportunity for discounted tickets at Lincoln Amphitheatre on certain nights in the theatre season. For Community Nights, a resident can show a driver's license to qualify for the \$5 discount off the admission price for an adult/senior (60+) ticket, according to this schedule:

- **Wednesday, June 27, Spencer County residents**
- **Thursday, June 28, Dubois County residents**
- **Friday, June 29, Warrick County residents**
- **Saturday, June 30, Posey County residents**
- **Wednesday, July 18, Perry County residents**

For the Community Nights, *Young Abe Lincoln* will be showing on stage, beginning at 7:30 p.m. *Young Abe Lincoln* is the signature play of Lincoln Amphitheatre. Written by Billy Edd Wheeler, it preserves the biographical details of Lincoln's pioneer years spent growing up in Southern Indiana, in the Little Pigeon Creek area just north of the Ohio River. Audiences are reminded of the true capability of the common man and woman who strive in a land where individual freedoms are held sacred.

Lincoln Amphitheatre, the only completely covered amphitheatre in the United States, is located in the woods of Lincoln State Park in Spencer County. There is never a rainout.
