WOMEN'S HISTORY WEEK SPEAKER.

"You've Come a Long Way, But..." is the title of the presentation to be given by Glenda Morrison, Friday, February 27, at ISUE, in recognition of Women's History Week. The presentation, sponsored jointly by the ISUE History Club and the Humanities Forum, will provide a look at women's role in politics since the passage of the Nineteenth Amendment in 1920.

Dr. Morrison's undergraduate and graduate degrees are in history, with a specialization in minorities and women. Her dissertation, written while at the University of Kansas, was a study of women's participation in the 1928 presidential campaign.

Her activities include a study of the local League of Women Voters, which will be published in the Proceedings of the Indiana Academy of Social Sciences this spring. She is also a board member of the YWCA, a member of the League of Women Voters, and chairperson of the Citizens' Advisory Committee for the Department of Metropolitan Development.
