1. Project Fourteen

Evansville Project Commitment, jointly sponsored by fourteen community organizations, has been an outstanding success in terms of people and ideas with close to six hundred persons attending the Monday evening sessions.

Monday, March 29, will be the highlight evening of the entire series. George Welch, special assistant to the Board Chairman, Whirlpool Corporation, Benton Harbor, Michigan, will present "The Vicious Circle - Employment, Education, Housing". Mr. Welch is an extremely able Whirlpool executive who is most sensitive to the challenges facing industry in today's changing society. Mr. Welch has been doing considerable research on Evansville and his presentation will be most specific in several points.

2. Dr. Bigham to address the DARs

Dr. D. E. Bigham will address the Evansville Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, April 14, at 6:00 P. M. The subject will be "The Contemporary Meaning of the American Revolution"

Dr. Bigham is also completing his research on the topic, Evansville and World War I; a German Town in a War against Germany. He has also been serving as editorial assistant to John Wiley and Sons, Publishers.

3. Chemistry Trip Report

Dr. B. J. Fairless, Asst. Professor of Chemistry and Dr. Howard E. Dunn, Asst. Professor of Chemistry at ISUE took two students to Ball State University to participate in a research programs.

D. O. Foster, an I.S.U.E. Senior, gave a paper on the Analysis of a Reaction Mixture, Instrumental Techniques, and O. J. Logsdon, an I.S.U.E. Freshman, gave a paper on N.M.R. Structure Identification of N-(1,1,3,3-Tetramethylbutyl) formamide and the Detection of Cis and Trans Isomers.

A total of twentyfour papers were given by undergraduate students representing the following thirteen Colleges and Universities from Ohio, Michigan and Indiana: Cleveland State University, Indiana University, Purdue University at Indianapolis, Ball State University, Adrian College, University of Toledo, University of Michigan, Indiana State University Evansville, Indiana University, Wright State University, Hope College, Olivet College, St. Mary's College, and Bowling Green University.

Dr. Dunn reported that the ISUE students were only surpassed by the University of Michigan.
