Joycelyn Elders speaking on campus

Former U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Joycelyn Elders will address issues in healthcare for minority populations at 7:45 p.m. March 25 in Carter Hall.

Presented by the University Core Curriculum's Speakers Series in conjunction with USI's celebration of Women's History Month, Elders' program is free and open to the public.

The first African American surgeon general of the U.S. Public Health Service, Elders' progressive stand on the issues frequently stirred controversy in the 1990s. Her open discussion of sexuality at World AIDS Day 1994 led to her forced resignation 15 months after confirmation.

Now a distinguished professor of public health at University of Arkansas, she is the author of *Joycelyn Elders, M.D.: From Sharecropper's Daughter to Surgeon General of the United States of America* (William Morrow, 1996).

A graduate of University of Arkansas Medical School, she also holds a master's in biochemistry and an undergraduate degree from Philander-Smith College in Little Rock, Ark.

Before Elder's appointment as surgeon general, she served in the U.S. Army, as a professor of pediatrics at UAMS, as director of the Arkansas Department of Health, and as president of the Association of State and Territorial Health Officers.

Disability speaker 'on a roll'

The founder and host of *On a Roll Radio: Talk Radio on Life with Disability* will speak on campus Tuesday, March 2, in conjunction with Disability Awareness Month.

Greg Smith's free public presentation will begin at 6:30 p.m. in Mitchell Auditorium in the Health Professions Center. He also will deliver a Lunch and Learn program from noon to 1 p.m. March 2 in Room 201 of the University Center.

Born in rural Mississippi in 1964, Smith was diagnosed with muscular dystrophy at age 3. After spinal surgery 10 years later, he began using a wheelchair for mobility.

A love of football brought Smith to radio, and in high school he served as the play-by-play announcer. He then worked in college radio for four years and earned a B.A. in broadcasting from Arizona State University's Walter Cronkite School of Journalism.

Following graduation, he worked as a member of the marketing team for KTAR/K-Lite radio stations in Phoenix before resigning in 1992 to launch *On a Roll* on KFNN 1510-AM.

On A Roll now airs on 40 radio stations across the country, and Smith is a recognized speaker on topics including self-definition, motivation, and disability issues.

The USI/Epi-Hab Center for Disability Studies is sponsoring Smith's presentations on campus.

Lecture exploring life in Amana

The Center for Communal Studies Lecture Series will feature author Peter Hoehnle, historical consultant and docent at the Amana Heritage Society in Iowa, March 18.

Hoehnle's illustrated lecture with slides, "Work, Prayer, and Communal Life at Amana, 1828-1933," will be presented at 2 p.m. in Mitchell Auditorium in the Health Professions Center. The free program is open to the public.

Hoehnle is the author of *The Amana People: The History of a Religious Community* (Penfield Books, 2003). He has worked at the Amana Heritage Society since 1988.

One of the longest-lasting communal societies in the world, the Amanas were established in Iowa's River Valley by a group of German-speaking European settlers seeking religious freedom.

Hoehnle earned a doctorate in agricultural history and rural studies last year at Iowa State University, where he also won the 2003 Research Excellence Award, earned a master's in American history, and served as a lecturer and teaching assistant.

Campus snapshot: David L. Rice Library

Although the David L. Rice Library's support of instruction and research at USI caters to students and faculty, the library also offers a variety of materials and services employees are free to enjoy.

"They always have been welcome to check out materials," said Ruth Miller, library director. "They always have been welcome to come in and use the facilities, and they always have been most welcome to ask for assistance."

Just because the focus is academic doesn't mean recreational materials are not available. The library is home to a browsing area featuring a selection of popular fiction and nonfiction. Music and spoken-word recordings, videos, and DVDs also are available.

In addition to journals, the library offers magazines, and several newspapers arrive on a daily basis, including *The Evansville Courier & Press*, *The Indianapolis Star*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *The New York Times*, *The Chicago Tribune*, and *The Washington Post*.

The library's collection of award-winning children's literature, which supports the Teacher Education program, also is open for perusal. Employees with children - or those who simply appreciate excellent children's books - are welcome to check out selections.

"Children's books are a great deal of fun," Miller said. "You do want to look at the best of the best."

To find out what's available at the library, simply visit the online catalog. Follow the "Rice Library" link on the USI index page to a variety of helpful information, including the Web catalog and databases as well as details about and drawings of the new \$27.5 million library facility set for groundbreaking this summer.

Employees without computers are welcome to use the library's, which have Internet access. Wireless cards also may be checked out for use on laptops while on the library premises.

Faculty and staff in need of computer software for work-related projects at home may find it at the Circulation Desk. Titles available include Front Page 2002, Office Mac V 10, Office 2000, Office XP, Windows XP Visio Professional, Project 2000, Visual J++ 6.0, Publisher 2002, Office Mac 2001, and Front Page 2000.

The Library also offers special borrowing privileges to the immediate family members of USI faculty, staff, and alumni with active membership. Free courtesy cards are available to residents of the community (ages 18 and older) as well.
