APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE FOR OHIO RIVER WRITERS CONFERENCE. The 1980

Ohio River Writer's Conference has been organized to provide instruction and advice for advanced writers in fiction, poetry, non-fiction and playwriting.

The conference will run from 12:00 noon on August 7 through Sunday evening, August 10. Individual conference sessions (beginning Thursday afternoon), group sessions, and readings by the instructors are scheduled. A banquet, featuring Robert Buffington, editor of the University of

Georgia Press, is planned for Thursday night.

Other writers featured will be Barry Hannah, American novelist and short story writer; Ai, a poet whose second volume, Killing Floor, was the 1978 Lamont Poetry Selection of the Academy of American Poets; Elizabeth Wray, managing editor of "Black Box" magazine; and H. L. Van Brunt, poet, editor and writer.

The conference will be held at the ISUE Conference Center. Applications and manuscripts must be received by June 1, 1980. Applicants do not need to be published writers; however, they are expected to have some experience and polish. Applicants will be notified of their acceptance no later than June 30. Full-time students and senior citizens will get a discount on the workshop fees.

ISUE HONORS DAY. Students of ISUE were recognized for their academic and service achievements in the annual Honors Day program held Thursday, April 24. Students received awards, scholarships and special commendation certificates.

The All Campus Student Achievement Award, the most prestigious award, given to the outstanding male and female students, was presented to David Stumpf, a junior majoring in marketing, and Carol Rowden, a senior majoring in communications.

The ISUE Paddlewheel Alliance received the top student organization award for service to the University and the community. Its objective is to provide "clear and precise information on nuclear power as well as safe energy alternatives." The group has held public rallies and debates, and made available written literature and slide programs.

Top scholastic awards went to Sigma Sigma Sigma social sorority for an overall grad point average of 3.04 and to Sigma Zeta professional science and math honorary for an overall grade point average of 3.7.

In addition, over a hundred scholarships and awards were presented. Recognition was also given to students named to the 1979-80 edition of Who's Who in American Universities and Colleges, the 1979-80 AMIGOs student orientation leaders and the Honor's List.
