Message from Dr. David Rice President, University of Southern Indiana

THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA . . . GROWING TO MEET THE CHANGING NEEDS OF THOSE IT SERVES

The University of Southern Indiana became Indiana's sixth state university on July 1, 1985, after twenty years as a regional campus of a state university. It is a comprehensive university excelling in undergraduate instruction in more than sixty academic majors. It confers master's degrees in industrial management and secondary education, and through the Evansville Graduate Studies Center, offers other graduate programs, in areas such as business administration and public administration, in cooperation with other universities. The University of Southern Indiana also offers continuing education courses, business and professional seminars, and community service programs through its Office of Continuing Education and General Studies.

This fall, entering its 23rd year of service, the University's enrollment reached 4,624 students. It expects to serve an additional 5,000 people in noncredit programs during this academic year. The University's enrollment has grown steadily in the last ten years and reflects greater numbers of students from the southern Indiana region.

When the University first opened its doors on September 15, 1965, there were 412 students who attended classes in temporary quarters in the Centennial School Building. The present campus, located in the 1400-acre Mid-America University Center, was developed according to a master plan and includes five major structures. The Science Center and Administration Building

was opened in 1969, followed by the Library in 1971, the University Center in 1974, the Technology Center in 1975, and the Physical Activities Center in 1980. The Physical Activities Center, known as the PAC, houses the PAC Arena, the home court for USI athletic events. A new \$7.8 million classroom building has been approved by the Indiana General Assembly and state agencies, and construction is expected to begin in spring 1988.

The University of Southern Indiana is governed by a nine-member Board of Trustees appointed by the Governor of Indiana. Members of the Board are Mr. Robert J. Fair, chairman, of Princeton; Mr. Joseph E. O'Daniel, vice chairman, of Evansville; Mrs. Carole D. Rust, secretary, of Mt. Vernon; Mr. Robert M. Boyer, of Terre Haute; Mr. William E. Brooks, Jr. of Vincennes; Dr. Percy Clark, Jr. of Indianapolis; Mr. J. Patrick Leahy of Evansville; Dr. John J. Pruis of Muncie; and Dr. George B. Weathersby of Indianapolis.

The University is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and by other accrediting agencies for programs in allied health, education, and engineering technology.

A LEARNING EXPERIENCE FOR ALL

On July 1, 1985, the University of Southern Indiana became Indiana's sixth state university. It provides academic offerings in baccalaureate and associate degree programs, and through the Evansville Graduate Studies Center, is meeting the public need for master's degree programs. USI also offers credit and non-credit continuing education classes, professional seminars, and special short-course sessions through the Office of Continuing Education and General Studies.

The University of Southern Indiana is accredited by the North Central Association and by other accrediting agencies for programs in education, engineering technology, and allied health.

It was originally established as a regional campus of Indiana State University, and opened its doors to 412 students at the Centennial School in September 1965. Today, entering its 22nd year of service, the school's enrollment has grown to 4,333 students and its academic degree programs now number more than 60. In 1968, Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc., raised funds to purchase 1,400 acres of land for the Mid-America University Center, with the first structure, the Science and Administration Building, opening its doors in the fall of that year. The Library opened in 1971, followed by the University Center in 1974, and the Technology Center in 1975. Officials proudly cut the ribbon on the Health, Physical Education, and Recreation Building in October, 1980. Constructed at a cost of more than four million dollars, the building accommodates a variety of instructional activities and services, and provides an on-campus arena for USI athletic events.

Mark Bial
Head Coach

Mark Bial is beginning his third season as head coach at USI. The 1986-87 Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) Coach of the Year has been at USI five full seasons. Bial has brought a broad, rich and successful background to the position.

Bial was an assistant coach at Schlarman High School in Danville, Ill., his alma mater. He was also an assistant coach at the University of Illinois where he received his bachelor's degree in 1976, and head coach at Northland College in Ashland, Wis. prior to coming to USI.

Bial led USI to a school record 24 wins, a co-conference championship and a NCAA tournament bid this past season.

Bial is noted for ability both as a scout and as a recruiter as well as a coach. His most notable scouting report was the one enabling the University of Illinois to defeat then number one ranked Michigan State in 1979. Some of Bial's outstanding recruits are Stephen Jackson (USI's all-time leading scorer 2,216), Julian Hall III (USI's all-time field goal percentage leader .614) and Antonio Reyes (GLVC all-academic team member '86-87) to name a few.

Besides leading the team to a school record 24 victories, Bial's team also set school records for best season record (24-6) .800, highest scoring average for a season (86.6) and most field goals made in one season (1021). All these records fell in Bial's best season to date.

Along with his bachelor's degree from Illinois, Bial received his master's degree from Indiana State University.

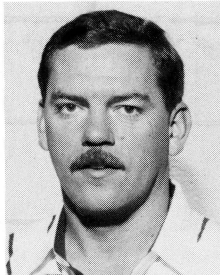
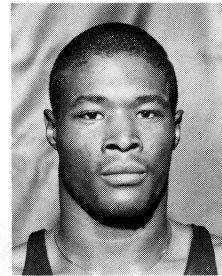
Mark and his wife Janet reside in Evansville and are the parents of two year old daughter Brittany Louise.

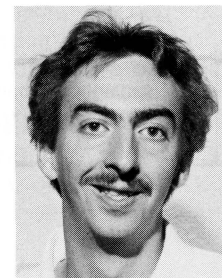

Guinn plans to attend graduate school following graduation from USI and hopes to get his master's in business administration. He would like to be a college basketball coach.

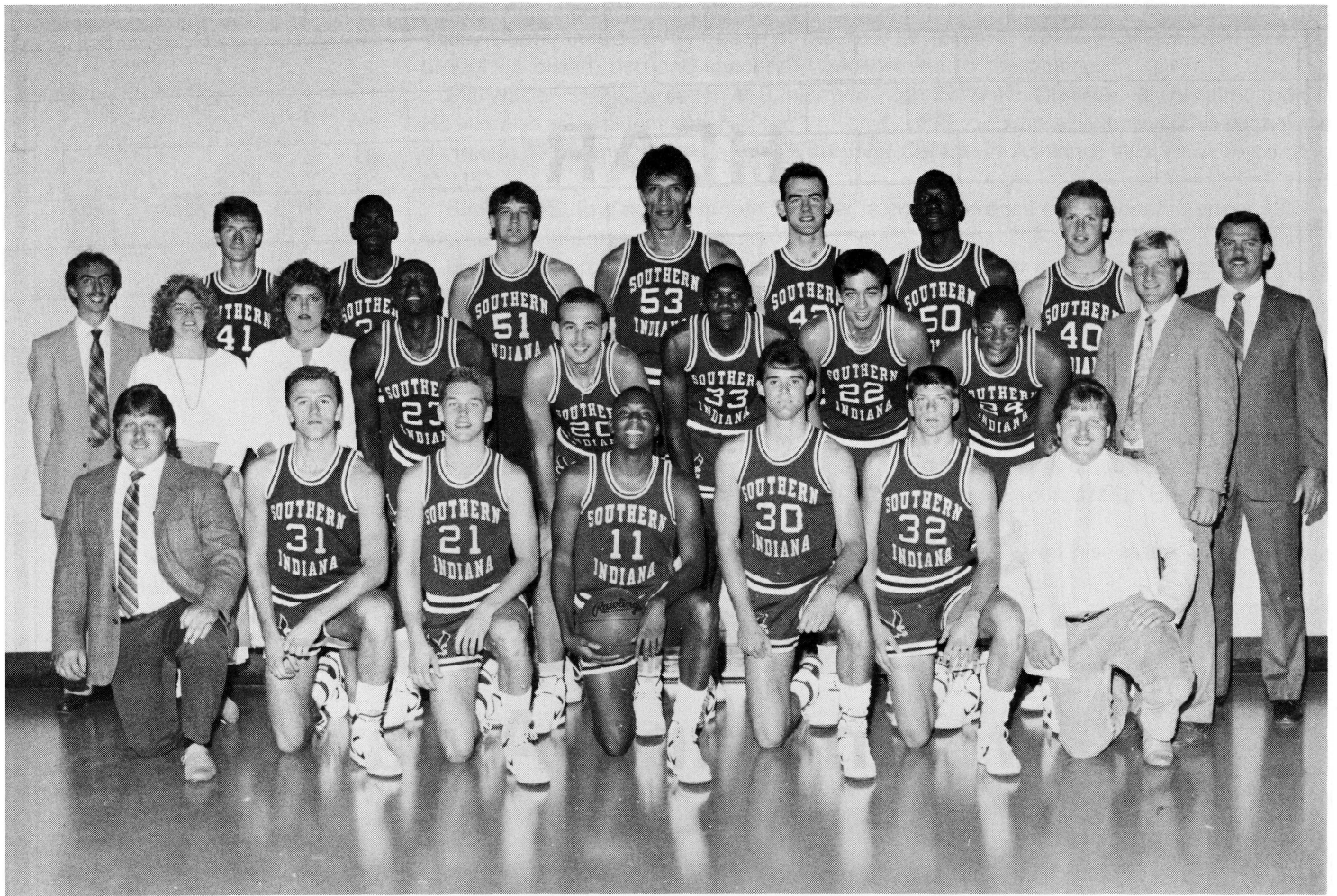
Guinn's duties include supervising study table for the athletes and helping organize daily practices. He hopes this experience will help him in his pursuit of a coaching job.

Barrett and his wife Donna have two sons, Shane, a freshman at the University of Evansville and Ryan, an eighth grader at Christ the King Grade School.

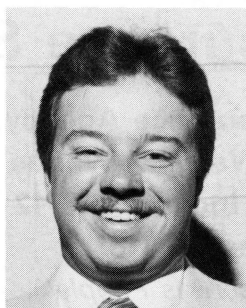

Dr. Arp, a native of Traer, Iowa, received his undergraduate degree from the University of Northern Iowa and his graduate degrees from Adams State College and Utah State University. Upon graduation from Northern Iowa, Dr. Arp taught business education and coached high school football and basketball in Iowa, Colorado and Nevada.

In 1972, Dr. Arp joined the Division of Business faculty where he currently teaches classes in Business Administration, Administrative Systems and Computer Information Systems. Before being appointed Director of Athletics, Dr. Arp had served for several years on the USI Athletic Board. He continues in that capacity.

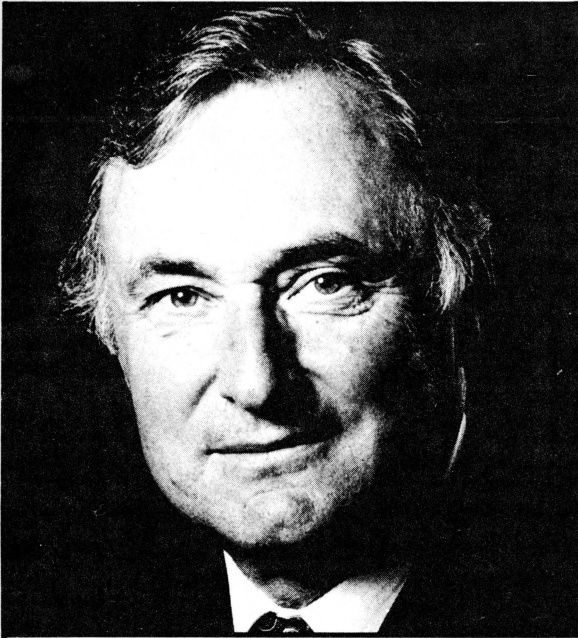

Message from Dr. David Rice President, University of Southern Indiana

THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA . . . GROWING TO MEET THE CHANGING NEEDS OF THOSE IT SERVES

The University of Southern Indiana became Indiana's sixth state university on July 1, 1985, after twenty years as a regional campus of a state university. It is a comprehensive university excelling in undergraduate instruction in more than sixty academic majors. It confers master's degrees in industrial management and secondary education, and through the Evansville Graduate Studies Center, offers other graduate programs, in areas such as business administration and public administration, in cooperation with other universities. The University of Southern Indiana also offers continuing education courses, business and professional seminars, and community service programs through its Office of Continuing Education and General Studies.

This fall, entering its 23rd year of service, the University's enrollment reached 4,624 students. It expects to serve an additional 5,000 people in noncredit programs during this academic year. The University's enrollment has grown steadily in the last ten years and reflects greater numbers of students from the southern Indiana region.

When the University first opened its doors on September 15, 1965, there were 412 students who attended classes in temporary quarters in the Centennial School Building. The present campus, located in the 1400-acre Mid-America University Center, was developed according to a master plan and includes five major structures. The Science Center and Administration Building

was opened in 1969, followed by the Library in 1971, the University Center in 1974, the Technology Center in 1975, and the Physical Activities Center in 1980. The Physical Activities Center, known as the PAC, houses the PAC Arena, the home court for USI athletic events. A new \$7.8 million classroom building has been approved by the Indiana General Assembly and state agencies, and construction is expected to begin in spring 1988.

The University of Southern Indiana is governed by a nine-member Board of Trustees appointed by the Governor of Indiana. Members of the Board are Mr. Robert J. Fair, chairman, of Princeton; Mr. Joseph E. O'Daniel, vice chairman, of Evansville; Mrs. Carole D. Rust, secretary, of Mt. Vernon; Mr. Robert M. Boyer, of Terre Haute; Mr. William E. Brooks, Jr. of Vincennes; Dr. Percy Clark, Jr. of Indianapolis; Mr. J. Patrick Leahy of Evansville; Dr. John J. Pruis of Muncie; and Dr. George B. Weathersby of Indianapolis.

The University is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and by other accrediting agencies for programs in allied health, education, and engineering technology.

A LEARNING EXPERIENCE FOR ALL

On July 1, 1985, the University of Southern Indiana became Indiana's sixth state university. It provides academic offerings in baccalaureate and associate degree programs, and through the Evansville Graduate Studies Center, is meeting the public need for master's degree programs. USI also offers credit and non-credit continuing education classes, professional seminars, and special short-course sessions through the Office of Continuing Education and General Studies.

The University of Southern Indiana is accredited by the North Central Association and by other accrediting agencies for programs in education, engineering technology, and allied health.

It was originally established as a regional campus of Indiana State University, and opened its doors to 412 students at the Centennial School in September 1965. Today, entering its 22nd year of service, the school's enrollment has grown to 4,333 students and its academic degree programs now number more than 60. In 1968, Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc., raised funds to purchase 1,400 acres of land for the Mid-America University Center, with the first structure, the Science and Administration Building, opening its doors in the fall of that year. The Library opened in 1971, followed by the University Center in 1974, and the Technology Center in 1975. Officials proudly cut the ribbon on the Health, Physical Education, and Recreation Building in October, 1980. Constructed at a cost of more than four million dollars, the building accommodates a variety of instructional activities and services, and provides an on-campus arena for USI athletic events.

The University of Southern Indiana is governed by a nine-member Board of Trustees. Members of the Board are Mr. Robert M. Boyer, Terre Haute; Mr. William E.
