HUMANITIES FORUM PRESENTS JOHN BLAIR, THURSDAY, JANUARY 22. John Blair, editor of the Ohio Valley Environment magazine, will present two lectures for the Humanities Forum at ISUE on Thursday, January 22.

The 1978 Pulitzer Prize Winner for News Photography will present a slide show entitled "An Environmental Tour of the Lower Ohio Valley" at 9:30 a.m. and a second presentation "Is Photojournalism an Art Form?" at 1:30 p.m.

Blair, whose work has been published in Time, Newsweek, Popular Photography and National Star, is best known for the action photo taken during the Anthony Kiritsis/Richard Hall kidnapping in Indianapolis in February 1977.

In addition to his photographic activities, he has served on the board of directors of Valley Environment Publishing Co., Evansville Association for Retarded Citizens, Synfuel Inquiry Corp., and Valley Watch, Inc. Blair holds an M.A. from Ball State University in journalism and a B.S. in business economics and public policy from I.U.

PRINCIPLES AND PROVISIONS ON SEXUAL HARASSMENT. President Richard Landini announced the University's position in accord with the principles and provisions on Sexual Harassment (Discrimination Because of Sex Under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as Amended), promulgated by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, and in compliance with the requirement that the University disseminate a detailed statement on the subject of sexual harassment. The Guidelines on Sexual Harassment attached to this issue of University Notes became effective at both campuses of the institution (Terre Haute and Evansville) with their publication in the weekly ISU University Bulletin on January 12, 1981.

The Guidelines on Sexual Harassment will be included in the University's revised Affirmative Action Plan, which will be recommended by the President for approval by the Board of Trustees. These Guidelines are called to the notice of all faculty and staff within the University.
