Mid-America Singers Madrigal Feastes are sold out

The four performances have been sold out two weeks in advance for the University of Southern Indiana Mid-America Singers 26th annual Madrigal Feastes, a beautiful evening of fine food and lavish song set in Medieval England and featuring several new and beautiful pieces of music and new cast members.

The feastes will be presented at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Friday, Saturday, November 30 and December 1 and 2, and at 6 p.m. Sunday, December 3, in the University Center Dining Room. Last year's feastes sold out also, but not so early in the season. Next year, the Singers hope the new ball room in the expanded University Center will be available in time to give them more room for their audiences.

Daniel R. Craig, USI assistant professor of music who directs the Singers and their annual holiday celebration, said new music this year will include "Welcome Sweet Pleasure" by Thomas Weelkes; "Flow Not So Fast, Ye Fountains" by John Dowland; "My Bonnie Lass She Smelleth" by P.D.Q. Bach (a parody on an old English Madrigal by Thomas Morley entitled "My Bonnie Lass She Smileth").

Also, "Pastime with Good Company" by King Henry VIII; "Cantate Domino" by Giuseppe Pitoni; "The Gift" by Bob Chilcott, a member of the King Singers; "O Magnum Mysterium" by Thoma Luis De Victoria; and "Salvation Is Created" by P. Tschesnokoff.

"Zdrowas Krolewno Wyborna (Hail Supreme Mother)" and "Modlitwa O Pokoj (Prayer for Peace)" will be among three selections the Singers will feature from their trip to Poland earlier this year. They also will present several traditional pieces like "Boar's Head Carol," "The Flaming Pudding Carol," and "The Twelve Days of Christmas."

Three new jesters — Adam Wilson as the Head Jester, Lisa Fikes as the Silent Jester, and Chanda Davis as the Little Jester — will spread their cheer and antics across the dining room, while Jeremy Brack has taken on the role of the Lord Chamberlain. Michael and Varbi Huck Galvin of Evansville return to their roles as the Lord and Lady of the Manor.
