IHETS NEWS FORUM JULY 2. The Indiana Higher Education Telecommunication System (IHETS) will present a news forum on Thursday, July 2, from 9:00 - 10:15 a.m. entitled "Hazardous Wastes: The Indiana Response". The news forum will originate from IUPUI and be received at ISUE in SC194.

The news forum will focus on the waste disposal siting bill approved this spring by the Indiana General Assembly. The legislation establishes the procedures by which the location of waste disposal sites in Indiana will be determined.

Appearing on the panel will be David Lamm of the Indiana State Board of Health and two lobbyists who were actively involved with the bill in the state legislature, Lisa Kobe of the Indiana State Chamber of Commerce and Tom Zeller of the Izaak Walton League of Indiana. Zeller is a former faculty member at ISUE.

CPR CERTIFICATION OFFERED. NBC-TV, in cooperation with the American Red Cross, is offering a Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) education series via television and local training and testing centers. On Sunday, July 19 and again on Sunday, July 26, viewers may learn CPR techniques on Channel 14 at 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. The educational series is entitled "Race for Life". A testing center will be open in the ISUE HPER Building on July 22 and 29 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The American Red Cross will have instructors on hand to review skills, administer the tests, and provide certification. Certification will take from two to four hours, depending on the initial level of skill of the participant.

Donna Myers, Director of Health Services, is coordinating the CPR testing center here and is asking certified CPR instructors and other volunteers to assist her on the dates the testing center is open. Interested persons may obtain a study guide from her for approximately \$3.00. According to Donna, certification should not be difficult for those who watch the television series, read the study guide, and practice at home.



TELEPHONE TIP FOR THE WEEK


The Dimension feature "Answer Hold" permits a party to answer a waiting call without terminating the existing call. Follow these steps:



1. When a call waiting tone is heard (two beeps only), ask the first party to hold.
2. Depress the switchhook.
3. When the dial tone is received, dial code 52 and the waiting call will be connected.
4. Complete the conversation and hang up.
5. The phone will ring and the first party will be reconnected to the line.

To send a call waiting tone to a busy telephone, just follow these steps:

1. Listen for dial tone, and dial code 53.
2. After hearing another dial tone, dial the desired extension number.
3. A special ring will be heard. Wait for an answer.
