The dinner is scheduled from 4:30 to 10:00 p.m., with special prices and selections available for groups of four and six. No other retail sales will be available at the Noble Roman's westside location during the event.

The dinner for a group of four includes a choice of one large deep-dish Sicilian pizza or one 16" hand-tossed round pizza or one 14" Monster pizza with choice of toppings. The dinner also includes four "Create-Your-Own" salad bars and two pitchers or liters of a favorite beverage. The price for a group of four is \$24.

A group of six is offered a selection of one medium and one large deep-dish Sicilian pizzas or one 12" and one 16" hand-tossed round pizzas or one 10" and one 14" Monster pizzas with choice of toppings. This menu also includes six "Create-Your-Own" salad bars and three pitchers or liters of a favorite beverage. The dinner for a group of six is priced at \$36.

HUMANITIES FORUM SCHEDULED FOR TODAY. Two productions by contemporary authors, John Guare's Day for Surprizes and Robert Anderson's I'm Herbert, will be presented at noon today in UC352. Both productions will be directed by Doug Hubbell.

Both scripts are unique comic statements that deal with the predicaments of human contact. In Guare's script, an embattled librarian reveals his experiences with "reaching out and touching someone". NOTED LECTURER TO SPEAK AT ISU TOMORROW. Joseph Campbell, noted lecturer and scholar, will speak at ISU-Terre Haute on Thursday, January 21. The professor emeritus of literature at Sarah Lawrence College is the author of several distinguished books on mythology. The lecture is scheduled to begin at 8:00 p.m. in the State Room of the Tirey Memorial Union Building.

ISU CREDIT UNION. As of January 1, the Credit Union went on-line with a new data processing center, Anacomp of Indianapolis. The new computer will provide more and better information concerning member accounts. Immediate day-by-day updating of accounts will be provided in addition to other improvements for servicing credit union members.

The Credit Union also offers the "All Saver Certificate" to members. There is a minimum deposit of \$500. All deposits are invested in insured share certificates. These certificates earn the highest yield allowed by law and the first \$2000 of interest will be exempt from federal income tax when members file jointly, or \$1000 if they file singly. Dividends are based on the credit union earnings at the end of each dividend period and cannot be guaranteed. The certificates are insured to \$100,000 by the NCUA.
