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**CHILDREN'S SUMMER UNIVERSITY EXPERIENCE FAIR.** The culmination of the Children's Summer University Experience program will be a fair on Saturday, July 25, from 2:00 - 5:00 p.m. in the ISUE Forum.

This exposition will feature videotapes and samples of students' work and explanations of activities by both instructors and students. The program for gifted, creative, and talented elementary students included courses in the areas of art, biology, business, communications, German, photography, physics, psychology, science and math, and Spanish. The videotape of the newscasts prepared by the students in the newscasting class and aired on WEHT-TV will also be shown.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PURCHASING DEPARTMENT. With the recent rate increase granted by the Public Service Commission, the telephone company has been allowed to charge for certain services which previously have been free. We are now being charged 25¢ for each time one of us asks the telephone company for this service. There were six separate charges on the July bill. 



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TELEPHONE TIP FOR THE WEEK

The Dimension System has a feature referred to as "queing". This feature assists the caller when making an off-campus call. When the caller has dialed "9" to reach an off-campus line and the lines are busy, the Dimension System can automatically signal the caller when a line is available. The signal is three short rings. To activate this feature, just follow these steps:

- 1) Dial "9" to reach an off-campus line.
- 2) After hearing three short tones (signalling that all lines are busy), hang up.
- 3) After receiving the three short rings, dial the desired number.
