#### 1994 USI Baseball Outlook

Looking for another record-breaking year in 1994

The University of Southern Indiana Screaming Eagles baseball team, looking for another record-breaking season in 1994, is under new Head Coach Mike Goedde.

Over the last three seasons, the Eagles made it to the NCAA North Central Regional twice (hosting once), won a Great Lakes Valley Conference Championship, won the GLVC regular season championship twice, and broke the school record for wins.

The Eagles posted a 41-12 overall record in 1993, ranking nationally as high as seventh. USI won the GLVC regular season with a 12-2 record and swept the GLVC tournament undefeated.

USI also posted impressive national statistics. It ranked fifth in win-loss percentage; seventh in scoring; eighth in hitting; eighth in fielding; 15th in triples; 21st in double plays; 22nd in stolen bases; and 24th in pitching. The team had five players rank nationally in eight different categories.

In 1994, the Eagles return seven of the nine starting position players (including the designated hitter) and four starting pitchers. The first base position, which Brian Maurer played for four seasons, is open.

Goedde has a veteran team to compete in USI's toughest schedule. To go with an always-tough GLVC schedule, the Eagles added Division I Murray State University, which joins Division I Southeast Missouri State University, on the schedule last year.

#### The Pitching Staff

The Eagles return ten veteran pitchers in 1994. They claimed 36 of the 41 victories in 1993 and had a 3.70 ERA, giving up 149 earned runs in 362 innings.

Leading the way for the Eagles will be four starting pitchers. On the right side of the hill will be seniors **Damon Brown** and **Greg Orr**. Brown, who was plagued by injuries last sea-

son, is fourth all-time at USI in wins (15), and will be looking to rebound to his 1992 form when he was 8-1. Orr, who is third all-time in victories at USI (16), led the team in GLVC regular season when he was 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA in three starts.

On the left side of the hill, the Eagles are led by two juniors, **Mike Fetscher** and **Todd Niemeier**.

Fetscher, who was third team All-American in 1993, broke the USI record for strikeouts in a season (77). He also led the team making 18 appearances (12 starts), with a 2.23 ERA, and five saves.

Niemeier, who was first team All-North Central Region, was the team leader with six complete games and second on the team making 14 appearances (12 starts) and 59 strikeouts. The opponents hit a low .217 versus Niemeier in 295 at-bats.

Both pitchers tied the USI mark for wins in a season with identical records of 8-2 in 1993.

Going for starting spots in 1994 will be right-handed sophomores **Terry Miller** and **Craig Shoobridge**. Miller, who broke the USI losing streak on the spring trip with a strong performance versus West Georgia College, was 4-0 with a 3.18 ERA in 28.3 innings pitched in 1993. Shoobridge, who helped USI by winning four of five starts down the stretch last year, was 5-2 in 1993 with a 4.82 ERA in 46.7 innings.

Out of the bullpen, the Eagles will be counting upon sophomore right-hander **Ryan Stewart**. Stewart had two saves and a 1-0 record in eight games last year for the Eagles.

#### The Infielders

The Eagles return three starters to an infield that completed 46 double plays and had a fielding percentage of .956.


Senior **Steve Gries** is back at third base. After missing most of 1992 with a broken thumb, Gries returned to reclaim his starting position and become a defensive cornerstone in 1993. In 49 games, Gries had a .954 fielding percentage in 153 chances, committing only seven errors. At the plate, Gries started slowly, but came around and hit a solid .308 in his final 23 games.

At short stop, junior **Barry Strauser** made the transition from second to short in 1993 and helped make the USI middle strong defensively. At the plate, Strauser fell off the pace he had set as a freshman, but regained form in the final 17 games by hitting over .400 down the stretch.

Returning at second base is the surprise of 1993 in sophomore **Korey Lamb**. Lamb was strong at the plate, hitting .336, and turned the bunt into a real offensive weapon for the Eagles. Lamb also was steady up the middle for the squad with a .958 fielding percentage in 166 chances.

First baseman Brian Maurer graduated and the Eagles are looking to fill a position left by the best fielder and one of the best hitters in USI history. The Eagles will have a couple of options in trying to fill his spot.

Junior infielder/designated hitter **Jason Krack**, who was named first team All-North Central Region and to the NCAA All-North Central Regional squad, played well at first when Maurer went down with an injury late in 1993. Krack, who spent most of 1993 as the designated hitter, was second on the

team in hitting with a .398 batting average and 42 RBIs. He led the team with 16 doubles.

A second option is to bring sophomore first baseman **Shayne Stock** off the bench. Stock, who saw action in only ten games (one start) as a freshman, hit .500 with four RBIs.

The one position the Eagles do not have to worry about this season is a catcher. Returning is first team All-American **Kevin Brown**, a junior. In 1993, the North Central Region Player of the Year led the Eagles in seven different offensive categories, and was ranked nationally, fourth in slugging percentage, 10th in hitting, and 14th in RBIs. He also broke USI records for batting average, hitting streak, RBIs, home runs, and total bases.

Behind Brown at the plate is junior **Darryl Adler**. Adler is a capable back-up to Brown, hitting .298 in 25 games and playing in five different positions for the Eagles in 1993.

#### The Outfield

Over the past three seasons the outfield positions have remained the most consistent.

Leading the way for the Eagles is senior centerfielder and lead-off man **Matt Vince**. Vince, who was named 1993 Preseason All-American, was second team All-GLVC last season and was the catalyst for the Eagles' offense. He hit .363 with 34 stolen bases and an on-base percentage of .515.

To Vince's left is senior leftfielder **Stu Sheets**. Sheets, who followed Vince in the batting order last season, had his best season ever as an Eagle, hitting .363 with 24 stolen bases out of 27 attempts. He also had an on-base percentage of .515.

Junior **Ryan Seidl** will be a candidate for rightfield. Seidl platooned in rightfield and was a right-handed bat off the bench, hitting .273 in 1993.

#### Newcomers

To continue to be one of the top teams in the region, the Eagles need some help from the seven incoming players (three pitchers, one pitcher/outfielder, and three infielder/outfielders).

On the mound, the Eagles expect some help from freshman

left-handed pitchers **Steve Baker** from Huntertown, Ind., and **Mike Workman** from Princeton, Ind., along with right-hander **Jeff Alvey** from Wadesville, Ind. Pitcher/outfielder **Kadish Evans** from Auburn, Ind., is expected to assist at the plate and on the mound.

Infielder/outfielders joining the team are three freshmen from Evansville, Ind. – **Jason Engelbrecht, Andy Hoffman,** and **Aaron Schapker**. Hoffman also could see some action behind the plate this season.



#### THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA BASEBALL FIELD

In 20 years of baseball, the University of Southern Indiana baseball field has seen great players and great games.

The USI baseball field became the permanent home of the Screaming Eagles in 1974 and stands as one of the finest fields in southern Indiana.

The facility, located on the USI campus, has a concession stand, media accommodations in the press box, seating for approximately 200 fans, restrooms, and a picnic area, The Bent Twig Outdoor Education Center, down the left- and rightfield lines.


The field, with one of the finest playing surfaces in the NCAA Division II, measures 355 ft. down the lines, 375 ft. to the power alleys, and 385 ft. to dead center field. Behind the fence is a beautiful tree-line which provides an excellent hitting background.

A computerized-underground sprinkler system helps maintain the manicured natural playing surface. The dirt area is a special blend of brick-dust, complemented by a tarp which covers the entire infield. The tarp enables the Eagles to play and practice when most teams in the midwest are still indoors. Down the leftfield line are two hitting cages for use year-round.

The nine-inning scoreboard was added in 1993. The score-board has high visibility with inning-by-inning scoring and current runs, hits, and errors displayed.

During the summer, the field is home to the Funkhouser American Legion team and will host the 1994 American Legion Tournament. The diamond became a practice facility for stars such as Madonna, during the making of the movie "A League of Their Own."

#### USI BASEBALL HEAD COACH MIKE GOEDDE

 $\mathbf{M}$  ike Goedde is in his inaugural season as head baseball coach at the University of Southern Indiana.

Prior to coming to USI, Goedde was an assistant coach at the University of Evansville under head coach Jim Brownlee from 1986-1988 and 1990-1993. His responsibilities at UE were coaching the pitching staff, coordinating the recruiting, directing the summer camp activities, administering a strength program, and supervising field maintenance.

While at UE, the baseball team was the Midwestern Collegiate Conference champion in 1988 and 1990. In 1988, the pitching staff had the second best ERA in the country with a 2.99. This staff featured major league All-Star Andy Benes, now, of the San Diego Padres.

In professional baseball, Goedde was signed as a pitcher in the fourth round of the 1983 draft by the Cincinnati Reds and spent three seasons in their farm system (1983-1985). In 1989, Goedde was a pitching instructor with the Reds organization in the Pioneer League at Billings, Mont.

The Evansville native graduated from UE, with a degree in sports administration, and from Mater Dei High School.

In addition to his duties as baseball coach, Goedde also is assistant intramural director at USI.
