



EDUCATION PROGRAMS AT ISUE RE-ACCREDITED.

At its October meeting in Nashville, Tennessee, the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) voted to renew accreditation of ISUE's baccalaureate degree programs to prepare elementary and secondary teachers. The re-accreditation also includes a K-12 program in art education.

This action of NCATE extends accreditation of these programs until September 1, 1985.

The Council, in extending the accreditation, cited several strengths in the ISUE program including the quality of instruction, availability of faculty to students, and conditions of faculty service.

It was noted that the counseling and advising services for students are "highly effective" and "based upon positive relationships between faculty and students."

"The small size and intimate nature of the program promotes continuous communication. Faculty are available and demonstrate interests in the needs and concerns of students," the report continued.

The report also lauded the "excellent" conditions of faculty service and said, "The institution regularly provides for sabbatical leaves, supports faculty research and maintains a quality instructional program."

DR. ROBERT REID, Vice President for Academic Affairs at ISUE, commented on the renewal of accreditation, saying, "The preparation of teachers is an important component of the educational mission of ISUE. NCATE is the national organization most concerned with the professional integrity of teacher training. Approval for the maximum seven-year period speaks to the excellence of the University programs in this field, and our faculty and students are to be congratulated for this significant accomplishment."
