NONCREDIT ACTIVITY COURSES THIS SUMMER AT ISUE. ISUE will offer a variety of noncredit courses this summer designed to get the entire family into better physical condition. Fitness, aquatics, and gymnastics courses will be offered beginning June 8.

For those interested in fitness, "Fitness for Life", "Nutrition for Good Health and Weight Control",

"Weight Training for Men and Boys", and "Women's Weight Training" will be offered. "Early Bird Running for Beginners" will help participants develop a running program for fitness by jogging along ISUE's rolling hills in the early mornings. Aerobic dancing courses will be offered for both the beginner and those who are more advanced. Sessions are planned for ISUE, Our Saviour Lutheran Church, and the McCutchanville United Methodist Church.

Another program, entitled "Family Fitness", is offered for the entire family and allows participants to take fitness courses for one hour and swim for an hour before and/or after the fitness courses. Special rates are available for family members who register together for these courses.

A variety of aquatics courses will be offered including "Parent-Tot Swimming", "Swimming for Adults", "Swimming for Boys and Girls", and "Competitive Swimming". All of the aquatics courses are held in the HPER pool and are under the direction of Paul Krack, recreational sports coordinator.

Gymnastics courses will include a gymnastics clinic for boys and girls and "All-Around Gymnastics". These courses are for boys and girls ages 7 - 18, and participants in "All-Around Gymnastics" will be screened and grouped according to ability level.

Other courses to be offered this summer include "Volleyball", "Pre-Season Athletic Conditioning", "Karate - Beginning and Advanced", "Beginning Tennis", and "Movement Exploration". "Movement Exploration" is designed for children over four years of age and helps participants enhance co-ordination and learn basic motor skills.

PEOPLE IN THE NEWS. Dr. Darrel Bigham, associate professor of history, has signed a contract to edit a 200-page Evansville: A Pictorial History, which will be published in the spring of 1982 by the Donning Company of Virginia Beach, Virginia. The company has published over 30 titles in its Portraits of American Cities series to date. The book will appear in both hard and soft cover versions.

The Indiana Historical Society and the Indiana Historical Bureau, in a joint effort to stimulate interest in regional history, develop county historical societies, and coordinate their efforts on the local level, have recently appointed Dr. Bigham to a two-year term as Vanderburgh County Historian. He is one of 92 persons state-wide who will work with these two organizations over the next few years to effect the goals outlined above.

ISUE students Eric Hillenbrand and Deborah Main presented research papers at the American Chemical Society Regional Meeting held in Dayton, Ohio, on May 20 - 22, 1981. The papers were about theoretical chemistry calculations that they have been performing during the last 18 months. Co-authors were Andrew Jorgensen, assistant professor of chemistry, and Eric Geslason, University of Illinois at Chicago Circle. Both of these students graduated with degrees in chemistry and will be pursuing graduate studies in the fall.

Dr. Daniel Scavone, professor of history, has been selected as a participant in the 1981 Summer Seminar entitled "Society and Literature in the Roman World". The seminar, sponsored by the National Endowment for the Humanities, will meet at Columbia University from June 8 through July 31, 1981.
