The family of Albert A. Woll has endowed a scholarship at the University of Southern Indiana in memory of the civic leader who served on public education boards for almost three decades.

The first annual Albert A. Woll Memorial Scholarship will be presented Thursday, April 27, at USI's 1989 Honors Day Ceremony. The scholarship was initiated with memorial contributions accumulated after Woll's death in August 1987, and is now endowed as a \$500 renewable scholarship to be awarded to a junior or senior student in pre-medical study who can demonstrate financial need and scholastic merit.

Woll, as head of Woll Enterprises, Inc., was an independent oil producer and farm manager and was a long-time friend of education in the Evansville area. He was a member of the Evansville-Vanderburgh School Board from 1959 to 1971, serving as president for two terms. He was appointed in 1976 to the Indiana State University Board of Trustees and became a champion in the drive to establish a separate state university in Evansville. When that occurred in 1985, Mr. Woll resigned from the ISU Board and former Governor Robert D. Orr made him an honorary member of the USI Board.
