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WARNING ISSUED ON COMPUTER DISK STORAGE. Steve Read of the Computer Center wants all computer users to know that special attention must be paid to storage of disks. He said some operators have left disks too close to telephones, and have had them partially or totally erased when the telephone rang.

Read said the small plastic file boxes that most use to store the disks **DO NOT** protect the disks from a ringing phone. A metal filing cabinet probably is the best protection. Read said he would hesitate to state a distance that would keep disks safe from phones, because it might vary, and urged computer users to call him at extension 1959 for assistance.
