# Jon Mark Hall, Director of Athletics -



Jon Mark Hall was appointed to the position of director of Athletics in January 2002, after seven years as the assistant director.

Under his direction, USI was the 2003-04 GLVC All-Sports and Commissioner's Cup winner and host of the 2004 and 2009 NCAA Division II Cross Country National Championships.

In addition to his duties as director of Athletics, Hall also is the chair of the NCAA Division II men's and women's tennis committee. He has

served on the Great Lakes Valley Conference Executive Committee and the NCAA II Great Lakes Regional women's basketball committee.

Hall joined the USI Athletic Department in 1995 as an assistant athletic director and men's tennis coach.

As the men's tennis coach, Hall was named the GLVC Coach of the Year five times, directed the Screaming Eagles to four GLVC regular-season titles and GLVC Tournament crowns, and had a 123-47 record (.724).

During his final season as head coach, Hall led the Eagles to their third straight appearance in the NCAA II Tournament and their first victory

in the post-season. In 2000 and 2001, Hall put the Eagles on the national map with their first two invitations to the NCAA II Tournament in the 27-year history of the program.

Hall came to USI after his appointment at the University of South Carolina-Spartanburg as an assistant athletic director, where he was the NCAA compliance coordinator, oversaw the academic support service program for student athletes, and coordinated the Athletes Can Educate (ACE) program. He also assisted in fundraising and promotional activities.

The native of Murray, Kentucky, is a 1990 *cum laude* graduate of Murray State University, with a bachelor's degree in business administration. While at MSU, Hall was on the tennis team for two seasons, earning Academic All-Ohio Valley Conference honors in 1987. Hall received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio State University in 1992.

In 1998-99, he completed the Sports Management Institute Executive Program at the University of South Carolina and the University of Notre Dame.

Hall and his wife, Patti, reside in Evansville and have four sons, Nathan, Garland, Ty, and Owen, and daughter Mary Claire.

# • WELCOME to USI

### Location

The University of Southern Indiana was founded in Evansville in 1965. USI is a comfortable drive from the major metropolitan centers of Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.

### **The Campus**

The Health Professions Center, Science Center, Wright Administration Building, Education Center, and Orr Center are located on the north side of campus. Rice Library, University Center, Liberal Arts Center, Technology Center, and Business and Engineering Center form the quadrangle in the center of campus. The Physical Activities Center and the Recreation, Fitness, and Wellness Center are located east of University Boulevard, a major thoroughfare through campus. Apartment buildings and residence halls are home to 2,800 students who live on campus.



### **Academic Life**

The University enrolls 10,516 students and offers undergraduate majors in 70 areas of study. An ever-increasing number of post-graduate programs also are available to students who wish to continue their education, including a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree. Opportunities are available for service learning, study abroad, and internships.

### **Campus Life**

Outside the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 90 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the students to enjoy and contribute to campus life.



### **Residence Life**

Students living on campus have their choice of two types of housing. Students can live in standard apartments or in residence halls which have amenities such as Internet connections, wireless Internet, and cable television. Computer labs, laundromats, a convenience store, outdoor and indoor recreation areas, and student lounges contribute to an efficient living environment that has proven to be overwhelmingly popular with students. Meal plans also are available at the University Center, which is located in the center of campus.


### **Financial Assistance**



# **Physical Activities Center**

The Physical Activities Center (PAC) has been the home of the Screaming Eagles for the past 30 years. Opened in 1980, the PAC accommodates physical education classes, intramural activities, and is the arena for the USI basketball and volleyball teams.

The center court of the PAC has been the setting for many games of regional and national interest during the past 17 years. USI has hosted the 1993, 1994, and 1996 men's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; the 2009 men's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 women's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 and 2001 women's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; and the 2000 and 2004 GLVC Volleyball Tournaments.

A true home court, the USI volleyball team has a 73-24 home record since 2000, a .753 winning percentage.

With padded chairback seats, back-supported bleacher seats, and a top-of-the line scoreboard and video board, the Physical Activities Center is one of the top Division II athletic venues in the region.

University of Southern Indiana's Department of Athletics is in the national spotlight for its athletic accomplishments in the NCAA Division II and in the Evansville-area spotlight as partners in the community.

USI student athletes are among the many volunteers contributing to the success of the Komen Race for the Cure, while the coaching staff is present to help staff the telephones for the MDA Telethon.

The volleyball team also conducts numerous camps and clinics and participates in several volunteer reading programs.

In addition to the national charities, the Department of Athletics sponsors Eagle Math, a nationally recognized program to encourage young students to improve their math skills. The program is designed around the Eagle Math booklets printed in the first quarter, second quarter, third quarter, and fourth quarter sequence to carry out the sports theme.

As student athletes practice to get better, math students are encouraged to practice math to excel in the classroom.





# ABOUT the GREAT LAKES VALLEY CONFERENCE

Established in 1978 with a commitment to the purposes, fundamental policies and basic principles of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, the Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) has grown to embody the vision established by the founders of the organization and has melded athletic and academic excellence for 32 years.

The GLVC, which over the past decade has grown to 16 members, has fully embraced NCAA Division II and is now one of the largest conferences in the division. Although formed and developed as one of the nation's premier basketball conferences, the GLVC has nurtured 17 championship sports and can now claim itself as one of the nation's top NCAA Division II conferences.

The formation of the GLVC can be traced as far back as 1972 when the athletic directors of three member schools - Kentucky Wesleyan, Bellarmine and Indiana State University at Evansville (now the University of Southern Indiana) - began preliminary discussions about forming a basketball conference. Four years later, the University of Indianapolis and Saint Joseph's College expressed interest. On July 7, 1978, those schools - along with Ashland University - united to become the GLVC.

Since its inception, 14 different institutions have joined the league. Those members include: Lewis University (1980), Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne (1984), Northern Kentucky University (1985), Kentucky State University (1989), Quincy University (1994), Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (1994), University of Wisconsin-Parkside (1994), University of Missouri-St. Louis (1995), Drury (2005), Missouri S&T (2005), Rockhurst (2005), University of Illinois-Springfield (2008), Maryville University (2008) and William Jewell College (2009).

Ashland and Kentucky State left the conference after the 1994 season, IPFW left the league following the 2000-01 academic year and SIU Edwardsville exited the league following the 2007-08 academic year. These departures opened the door for the six-team expansion over the past decade, allowing the league to grow to its current membership of 16 institutions.

The conference head quarters are located in downtown Indianapolis, one of the many Midwest major media markets in which the league maintains a presence. The GLVC has schools in Milwaukee/Northern Illinois (UW-Parkside), Chicago (Lewis), Indianapolis (Indianapolis), Cincinnati (Northern Kentucky), Louisville (Bellarmine), Evansville (Southern Indiana), Springfield, Ill. (UIS), Springfield, Mo. (Drury), Owensboro (Kentucky Wesleyan), Kansas City (Rockhurst, William Jewell) and St. Louis (Maryville, UM-St. Louis).

The conference sponsors 17 championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, indoor and outdoor track and field, and tennis for men and basketball, cross country, softball, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, golf, and volleyball for women. In addition, the GLVC has also recently announced a timeline for sponsoring football in the conference with a goal of beginning play in 2012.

GLVC institutions have won 11 national championships in basketball. Kentucky Wesleyan leads all Division II institutions with eight men's basketball titles, while Southern Indiana won the men's crown in 1995. Northern Kentucky's women won the school's first-ever basketball national championship in 2000 and followed that with a national title in 2008. In addition, SIU Edwardsville became the first GLVC member to win a national championship in softball in 2007 and Southern Indiana staked claim to the school and GLVC's first national championship in baseball in 2010.

The league also takes pride in recognizing the many academic and athletic accomplishments achieved by its student-athletes, coaches and administrators. In 2001, the league announced the creation of the GLVC Hall of Fame, with the first class being inducted in 2002. The GLVC annually presents the Richard F. Scharf Paragon Award to the top male and female student-athlete in the league, and the Dr. Charles Bertram Alumni Award of Distinction to alumni who both succeeded while a GLVC student-athlete and excelled in accomplishments after graduation.

The GLVC strives to adhere to the NCAA Division II Strategic Platform and has introduced several initiatives in recent years including the GLVC Sportsmanship Award which acknowledges the institution that exemplifies sportsmanship in the view of its peers.

The league continually maintains an effort to combine academic and athletic excellence and the hard work put forth by the student-athletes has been evident on the playing fields and in the classrooms.

# **Eagles looking for NCAA II Tourney bid in 2010**

The University of Southern Indiana volleyball team enters the 2010 campaign with the expectation of competing for a Great Lakes Valley Conference title and a berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament.

Sixth-year Head Coach Leah Mercer '02, who needs just 13 wins to become the second coach in the program's history to reach 100, returns nine players from a squad that qualified for the GLVC Tournament semifinals for the second straight season and the seventh time in the last 10 years.

Mercer's group is led by three seniors, including two-time All-GLVC outside hitter **Brittani Oliver** and defensive specialist **Janae Curnutt**.

Oliver, who needs just 86 kills to become the 10th player in school history to reach 1,000, averaged a team-high 2.93 kills per set in 2009, ranking her 11th in the GLVC. Oliver, who was named to the Ferris State Bulldog Classic All-Tournament team after averaging 4.07 kills per set during the 2009

season-opening tournament, had 13 kills and hit .290 against eventual NCAA II Midwest Region champion Indianapolis in the GLVC Tournament.

Curnutt saw her dig numbers fall a touch in 2009 after moving from libero to become more of an attacking back row threat. Needing just 151 digs to become the eighth Screaming Eagle in school history to eclipse 1,000 in her career, Curnutt enters the 2010 season having averaged nearly three digs per set during her first three collegiate seasons.

Middle blocker **Katie Knott** rounds out USI's senior class. Knott averaged 1.64 kills and 0.82 blocks while attacking at a .350 clip in six matches.

Junior middle blocker Danielle LaGrange may be the Eagles biggest offensive weapon entering 2010 after a sensational sophomore campaign. LaGrange, who racked up a career-high 27 kills against Indianapolis in the GLVC Tournament, was second on the team and 12th in the GLVC with 2.83

kills per set. She also was 10th in the league with a team-best .304 attacking percentage.

LaGrange is on a list of three juniors that includes defensive specialists **Krista Coccaro** and **Stephanie Berg**. Coccaro averaged 3.16 digs per set as USI's starting libero during her sophomore season, while Berg averaged 1.57 digs per set in 18 matches a year ago.

The Eagles' sophomore class includes outside hitter **Abbi Williams**, setter **Ashley King**, and right side hitter **Emily Meyer**.

Williams started 14 matches during her first year at USI, averaging 1.62 kills per set, while King averaged 9.67 assists and 1.17 digs in six matches and 12 sets during her first season. Meyer played in seven matches and 12 sets in her first year, averaging 1.00 kills per set.

USI has four freshmen on its 2010 roster, including middle blocker **Emily Diedrich**,

outside hitter **Kristy Gerardot**, setter/right side hitter **Jorae Bradbury**, and defensive specialist **Kayla Heldman**.

Diedrich was a three-time All-Conference performer at Castle High School (Newburgh, Indiana) and was selected to the Indiana South All-Star team in 2009. The All-Metro performer was a member of four sectional championship squads at CHS and also competed in track and basketball, finishing sixth in the shot put at the IHSAA State Track and Field Championships as a senior.

Gerardot was a three-time All-Conference and two-time All-Area player at Bishop Luers High School (Ft. Wayne, Indiana). The multi-sport star helped BLHS to sectional titles in volleyball, basketball, and softball and also played a big role in the N3 Volleyball Club's seventh-place finish at the Junior Olympic Nationals in 2009.

Bradbury earned All-State honors as a senior in 2009 and was a four-time All-Conference performer as well as a two-time All-Area honoree at Concordia Lutheran High School (Ft. Wayne, Indiana). Bradbury, who finished her career with 1,579 assists, 762 kills, 893 digs, 197 blocks, and 252 aces, was named to the Indiana North All-Star team in 2009.

Heldman earned first-team Academic All-State honors in 2009 after helping Center Grove High School (Greenwood, Indiana) to the 2009 regional title. A multi-sport performer, Heldman helped lead CGHS to four Johnson County championships and three sectional titles during her prep career.

The 2010 campaign begins in Pensacola, Florida, where the Eagles will compete in the West Florida Comfort Inn-vitational. USI will be tested early, especially in its second weekend of the season when it faces national powers Truman State and Washburn.

In addition to its first two tournaments, the Eagles' non-conference schedule includes a road trip to North Alabama as well as home matches with Kentucky State and Oakland City. The GLVC/GLIAC Crossover also will give the Eagles' three non-conference matches in October.

USI's home schedule includes 10 games, eight against GLVC foes, and begins with Kentucky State September 14. The Eagles host Northern Kentucky, Bellarmine, Kentucky Wesleyan, Maryville, Wisconsin-Parkside, Lewis, Quincy, and Illinois-Springfield.

Road trips to Rockhurst, Drury, Saint Joseph's, Indianapolis, Missouri S&T, and Missouri-St. Louis round out the Eagles' conference slate.

# **Head Coach Leah Mercer**



Head Coach **Leah Mercer '02** enters her sixth season as the head coach of the USI volleyball program after leading the Screaming Eagles to the GLVC Tournament semifinals for the second straight season and the seventh time in 10 years.

Mercer, who ranks second all-time with 87 career victories at the helm of the USI volleyball program, led her squad to an 18-14

overall mark, 9-5 in the GLVC, and a sixth-place finish in the GLVC regular season.

Two years ago, Mercer brought the Eagles back to the GLVC Championship for the first time in four years and the sixth time since 2000. Her squad was 18-15 overall, 9-8 in the GLVC, and finished third in the GLVC West Division. The Eagles won six of their final eight matches, including upset wins over nationally ranked Northern Kentucky University and the University of Missouri-St. Louis.

Throughout Mercer's career with the Eagles', USI has been among the GLVC's best teams at the net. Her squad led the GLVC and was eighth in the nation with 2.43 blocks per set in 2008.

The Eagles' 454 block assists in 2008 eclipsed the program's alltime record, which was set the previous year when USI amassed 450 block assists.

In 2007, Mercer's squad finished 15-14 overall and was fourth in the GLVC West Division with a 9-10 conference mark. The 2007 Eagles set season records for digs (2,147) and block assists.

Mercer led the Eagles to a sixth-place finish in the GLVC regularseason standings with a 17-11 overall mark, 9-7 GLVC, in 2006. In the Great Lakes Region, the Eagles knocked off eventual region champion Ashland early in the season.

In 2005, Mercer led her squad to a 19-13 overall record and an 11-5 mark in the GLVC. Her squad also posted wins over fifthranked North Alabama and 11th-ranked Northern Michigan.

A native of Evansville and a 2002 graduate of USI, Mercer served Loyola University (Chicago) as the top assistant coach in 2004. She helped guide the Ramblers to a 22-9 overall record and a 10-4 mark in the Horizon League. Loyola won the Horizon League Tournament championship and qualified for the NCAA Division I Tournament before falling to the University of Wisconsin in the first round.

Prior to her one-year stint at Loyola, Mercer spent a year as a graduate assistant coach at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. She helped lead the Bobcats to a 28-5 overall record, the Mid-American Conference regular-season and tournament titles, and the program's first-ever berth in the NCAA I Tournament.

Mercer, who started her coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Purdue University in 2002, was a two-time All-GLVC performer and helped lead the Eagles to a three-year record of 61-27, including a 49-14 mark as a junior and senior. She averaged 3.1 kills per game during her three seasons of collegiate volleyball. Mercer also averaged 5.9 points and 3.6 rebounds in two seasons with USI's women's basketball program.

Mercer, who has a bachelor's degree in physical education (teaching K-12) and a master's degree in recreation and sports science (coaching education), is the Screaming Eagles' 11th head coach in the history of the program.
