CREATIVE SKILLS COURSES OFFERED THIS SUMMER.

Four courses in the ISUE summer non-credit series are devoted to helping individuals develop or improve upon creative skills. The courses are photography, needlepoint, garden gourmet, and basic drawing.

Photography is a basic course applying practical information in regard to camera types, picture taking, exposure determination, and processing of black and white negatives and prints. Participants are to supply their own camera and film. The course will be offered on five Tuesdays and five Thursdays beginning June 14 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the ISUE Technology Center. Course fee is \$35.00.

Students in the Needlepoint course will learn to read a chart, block a finished piece, and do ten different stitches. The course will run four weeks beginning June 14 from 10:00 a.m. to noon in the ISUE Conference Center. Course fee is \$15.00. For parent and child wishing to register together, the fee is \$25.00.

A late summer course, Garden Gourmet, will cover new and creative ways to prepare fresh garden vegetables. It will meet on four Wednesdays beginning August 3 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the ISUE Library. Cost will be \$20.00.

Basic Drawing courses will be offered for children ages 6-10 and ages 11-15 in the summer series beginning June 14 and June 16. Each four week course will meet from 10:00 a.m. to noon once a week. Course fee will be \$15.00 and \$10.00 for each additional child from the same family.

ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT SPONSORING SUMMER CAMPS, The ISUE Athletic Department is sponsoring basketball (men and women), volleyball and cheerleading camps this summer, in addition to an 8-game summer basketball league for grade school boys. All camps will take place at ISUE Arena.

ISUE Basketball Coach, *WAYNE BOULTINGHOUSE*, and Assistant Coach, *DON RAMSDEN*, will conduct the three-week basketball camp for boys, scheduled to begin June 13. The camp will run Monday through Thursday from 8:15 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. All participants in the camp should be 9 years of age or older. Any dependents of the ISUE administration, faculty or staff can attend the three-week camp for the reduced rate of \$15.00. The cost to the general public is \$40.00.

ISUE Women's Coach, *RUTH SCHWENK*, and *COACH BOULTINGHOUSE* will conduct a one week basketball camp for girls scheduled to begin Monday, June 20 from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. Cost of the week's camp is \$20.00.

A one week cheerleading camp will be administered by ISUE cheerleading sponsor *RUTH SCHWENK*. The cheerleading camp will start Monday, June 13 from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. through Friday, June 17. The fee is \$15.00.

The three week volleyball camp will begin on Monday, June 13 from 10:15 a.m. to noon. The camp will run Monday through Thursday and will be conducted by Ginger Lutterman, volleyball coach at Castle High School. The fee is \$30.00.

COACH BOULTINGHOUSE will also supervise an 8-game summer basketball league for grade school boys. The schedule will be announced once all the team rosters are completed. The league will run for four weeks and all the games played during the morning hours. League will commence the week of July 11. The fee for each player is \$15.00.
