Privacy issue forum to be held at USI

The University of Southern Indiana Communications Department, The Evansville Courier, and the Scripps Howard Foundation offer a presentation and discussion titled "Is Privacy Dead?" at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 29, in USI's Carter Hall located in the University Center. The event is free and open to the public.

The evening will begin with a forty-minute Scripps Howard presentation taped earlier this year concerning current issues and arguments surrounding the media and privacy. Much of the tape's presentation focuses on the President Clinton and Monica Lewinsky relationship and the grand jury investigation which made it public information. Following the tape, moderator Dr. Dal Herring, chair of the USI Communications Department, and the audience will address questions to a four member panel including Mr. Paul McAuliffe, editor of the Evansville Courier; Mr. Rolland Eckels, retired executive of Mead Johnson and Company; Dr. J. Wayne Rinks, USI assistant professor of communications; and Mr. Ron Roat, USI assistant professor of journalism.
