University of Southern Indiana 2000 Women's Soccer Outlook

The class of 2000 wants to top off four years of hard work with the University of Southern Indiana's first Great Lakes Valley Conference Championship in women's soccer.

The Screaming Eagles, who are 24-13-2 in four years of league play, have fallen short the last three years, reaching the finals in 1998 and the semifinals in 1997 and 1999.

The 2000 Eagles will try to surpass the winning traditions laid down by the class of 1999. Last year's senior class was the first group of women players to complete four years at USI.

USI's first women's soccer graduation class had a four-year record of 48-25-2 overall, four appearances in the Great Lakes Valley Conference Tournament, and played in the 1998 NCAA Division II Tournament quarterfinals.

Holding the Eagles to a steady course is **Head Coach Bill Wilkins**, who is at the helm for a second season at USI.

In his first season, Wilkins' Eagles battled through a tough schedule to finish 10-7-1 overall, 8-2-1 in the GLVC. The 1999 schedule included four games with three schools that appeared in the NCAA Division II 16-team national tournament.

The GLVC, which is fast becoming one of the toughest conferences in Division II, has had a team reach the quarterfinals in four of the last five seasons.

On the field, the Eagles will be led by first team All-Central Region and All-GLVC forward **Stephanie Minor** (Evansville, Indiana) and back **Krista Weinzapfel** (Evansville, Indiana).

Minor led USI in scoring with nine goals, including three game winners, and nine assists for 27 points, ranking fifth in the conference. Her nine assists also ranked third in the GLVC.

Minor enters her senior season on the verge of owning the USI record book. She needs one goal, eight assists, and nine points to take over the USI career records for those categories.

Weinzpafel led USI to a 0.65 goals against average as a team in 1,661 minutes of action, including nine shutouts. The 0.65 ranked 11th nationally in 1999.

Junior Kristen Light (Florissant, Missouri) and sophomore Megan Fitzler (St. Louis, Missouri) return to join Minor at forward.

Light was one of USI's super subs off the bench in 1999, scoring four points on a goal and two assists in 1999. Fitzler will move from the midfield to a forward position in 2000 after tallying nine points on four goals and one assist as a freshman.

New to the team's offensive unit in 2000 is freshman forward **Aisha Earle-Smith** (Spring, Texas). Earle-Smith, a first team All-Houston Area at Klein High School in Klein,

Texas, was an All-State 200m sprinter in Ohio before moving to Texas and should add even more speed to the USI attack.

The midfield could be an area of concern for the Eagles with the departure of 1998 All-American and two-time All-Region player Megan Russell. Russell was a four-year captain for the Eagles.

The Eagles will look to two seniors Megan Ehlers (Loveland, Ohio) and Amy Henkhaus (Edwardsville, Illinois) to provide the leadership in the middle.

Ehlers, who has started 57 of 58 games for the Eagles, had six points on two goals and two assists as a junior. Henkhaus, a 1998 first team All-American as a back, missed most of 1999 with a knee injury and has returned to form after an intense rehab during the off-season.

Another familiar face playing in the midfield will be junior **Kayla Scheller** (Evansville, Indiana), who started 17 of USI's 18 games in 1999. Scheller was fifth on the team in scoring with eight points coming on three goals and two assists.

Wilkins also will be able to depend upon junior Jenny Wessel (St. Louis, Missouri) and sophomore Jill Hejlek (St. Louis, Missouri). Hejlek played in 17 games as a freshman off the bench, while Wessel was only able to play in one match last year due to injury.

New in the midfield is freshman **Darlene Dippel** (Evansville, Indiana), who played for
Mater Dei High School in Evansville last
fall, is expected to contribute.

Although USI's all-time leading goalkeeper Angie Gries has graduated, the defensive backfield may be the strength of the team this season. The Eagles, in addition to Weinzapfel, will return senior sweeper **Andrea Barchet** (Evansville, Indiana) and sophomore **Pleasant Lant** (Chandler, Indiana).

Barchet, who came on to start 18 games as a junior, has become one of the team's strongest leaders, while Lant started 16 of 18 matches after walking onto the team as a freshman.

Giving USI depth in the defense is freshman **Robin Petty** (Montgomery, Indiana), who played for Washington High School in 1999.

The squad also returns senior goalkeeper **Heather Heseman** (Evansville, Indiana), who did not allow a goal in five games last year. In three seasons of splitting time with Gries, Heseman has a 0.84 GAA in 28 games.

Goalkeeper **Aude de La Salle** is a late addition to the Eagles. De la Salle comes to USI from Gajoubert, France. She will challenge Heseman for the starting job.

The 2000 schedule will have as many challenges in it as the team faced in 1999. USI will take on perennial powers Northern Kentucky University, who was an NCAA II semifinal team in 1999, Saint Joseph's College, Lewis University, Quincy University, and Southern Illinois University Edwardsville in the GLVC.

In the non-conference schedule, USI will travel to the University of Missouri-Rolla, while hosting Truman State University and McKendree College.

The Eagles also will take to the air to play in Hawaii, playing four games in four days. USI will play Evergreen State College, Pacific Lutheran University, Southern Oregon University, and Hawaii Pacific University.

Bill Wilkins Women's Soccer Head Coach

Bill Wilkins begins his second season as Head Coach of the Southern Indiana women's soccer program.

Last season, Wilkins led the Lady Eagles to a 10-7-1 overall record, including an 8-2-1 mark in the Great Lakes Valley Conference. However, USI narrowly missed its second consecutive trip to the NCAA II Tournament after falling in the semifinal round of the GLVC Tournament.

A coach with national exposure at the Division I level, Wilkins came to USI from Auburn University where he had been the head coach since the 1994 season. Wilkins, who took over Auburn's program in its second season of existence, led the Tigers to their first wins in the NCAA Division I and the Southeastern Conference and their first-ever regional ranking. In his five seasons, he compiled an overall record of 47-44-8.

Prior to taking the head position at Auburn, Wilkins helped the University of Virginia women's soccer program to five consecutive NCAA I Tournament appearances as an assistant coach. During the 1991 NCAA Tournament, he assumed interim head coaching duties prior to the tournament and led the Cavaliers to a berth in the Final Four and a final national ranking of number three.

The Valley Cottage, New York, native went to Virginia following a three-year stint as the head women's soccer coach at Columbia University in New York from 1985-87 and a single season at the United States Military Academy in 1984.

Wilkins started his coaching career at the grass roots level after graduating from St.

Lawrence University in Canton, New York in 1977. His first job was as girls' varsity head coach at Albertus Magnus High School in Bardonia, New York, before entering collegiate ranks as an assistant coach at the State University of New York at Cortland.

During his only season at SUNY Cortland, Wilkins helped lead the women's program to the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals and was ranked third nationally.

In addition to his coaching duties, Wilkins was on the NSCAA national ranking committee chair for the past two seasons. He also was the Field of Play coordinator for the 1996 Olympic Games in Birmingham, Alabama.

Wilkins has been a NSCAA member since 1982 and has a NSCAA Advanced National Diploma and a USSF National "B" License.

Wilkins and his wife Leigh-Anne have a son, Garrett.

Jessica Pigman Assistant Coach

Jessica Pigman is returning for her second season as an assistant coach after making the transition from player to assistant coach in 1999. She assists with daily practices, game operations, and administrative office duties.

In three seasons, Pigman finished her career at USI as the third all-time leader in assists (16), fourth all-time in total points (44), and fifth all-time in goals (12). A co-captain each of her three seasons, Pigman helped lead the Screaming Eagles to a quarterfinal finish in the NCAA Division II Tournament and to a team record of 38-18-2.

As a senior, Pigman was named first team All-Central Region and second team All-Great Lakes Valley Conference. She also was named the 1999 GLVC Scholar Athlete of the Year (women's soccer) and to the Academic All-GLVC team in each of her three seasons.

A native of Evansville, Indiana, Pigman graduated in 1999 from USI with a bachelor's degree in physical education. She also is employed as a personal trainer at Resultz Personal Fitness and director of the Kinder Kicks program for boys and girls, ages 4-6, at Off the Wall Sports, an indoor soccer facility in Evansville.

Kristi Butler Student Assistant Coach

Kristi Butler will be a part of the coaching staff this season after finishing her fourth and final season as a player in 1999.

Having played in 71 games, starting 23, Butler brings plenty of experience to the squad.

A communications student, Butler came to USI in 1996, starting 15 games as a freshman in the school's inaugural season.

During her career at USI, Butler scored 21 points off of seven goals and seven assists. She is a graduate of Castle High School in Newburgh, Indiana.
