RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM. Graduates of Indiana State University Evansville's radiologic technology program have compiled the highest composite certification exam score in Indiana. Nationwide, only eleven programs scored higher than ISUE's score of 94%.

The examination, required of all radiologic technology graduates wishing to be certified to practice, is administered by the Educational Testing Service for the

American Registry of Radiologic Technologists. Students from approximately 1,000 programs were tested; 21 of those programs are located in Indiana. Seven ISUE graduates took the certification examination given in November, 1976.

AAUW FELLOWSHIPS. The American Association of University Women through the Education Foundation is seeking applicants for both American and International Fellowships.

The International Fellowships are awarded to women of outstanding ability at the graduate level of study who are citizens of other countries other than the U.S., and who may be expected to give effective leadership upon return to their home countries.

The American Fellowships are awarded to U.S. women at the dissertation level or post-doctorate level of study who have achieved distinction or show promise of distinction in their fields of scholarly work.

FALL NONCREDIT COURSE OFFERINGS. Thirty-eight noncredit courses, including twelve new courses and four weekend programs, are being offered this fall through the Office of Continuing Education.

New noncredit courses include Photography: Advanced Darkroom Techniques; Beginning Guitar; Reading Efficiency; How the Human Body Works; Personal Law; Discussions in Literature: Women from Eve to Erica; Yoga for Men; Continuing Yoga; Furniture Refinishing; and Quilting. General Licensing Preparation and Novice Licensing Preparation, a new part of the Amateur Radio course, will prepare amateur radio enthusiasts for the FCC examination.

Four weekend programs offer a new approach to learning the noncredit way. Included in the weekend programs are Beginning Canoeing; a bus trip to Nashville, Tennessee to tour Antebellum homes; a workshop in Assertiveness Training; and a trip by plane to New Orleans to view the acclaimed King Tut Exhibit.

Continuing Education courses repeated this fall are Ceramics Workshop; Officiating Men's and Women's Basketball; Age Group Gymnastics (five sections offered); Investment Strategies: Stocks, Bonds, and Options; Appreciating Music: The Art of Listening; A New Direction for Women; Gymnastics for Women; Amateur Radio License Preparation; An

Introduction to Transactional Analysis; Understanding Death and Dying; Beginning Yoga; French for Travelers; Children's Art Workshop; and Career and Life Planning.
