RAKU WORKSHOP SCHEDULED, A workshop in Raku Pottery has been added as a special offering during ISUE's summer noncredit series. The comprehensive workshop will include the history, forming, glazing and firing of Raku Pottery. Raku, meaning enjoyment, is a Japanese method of firing that became popular in this country during the 1950's due to its spontaneity and speed. Once a piece has been bisquit

fired, it can be glazed, fired, and cooled within 40 minutes.

The Raku workshop will be held at the ISUE Art Center, Monday through Thursday, August 1-11, 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. and two Thursday evenings, August 4 and 11 from 7:00 to 10:00 p.m.

According to Melody Lewis, who will instruct the workshop, the class will include building a small wood-burning Raku kiln if there is enough student interest. Ms. Lewis is art instructor for the metropolitan school district of Mt. Vernon.

Enrollment will be limited to 20 persons ages 16 and older. Registration fee is \$40.00 which includes all materials needed.
