Three workshops designed to help the beginning art collector define, evaluate, protect, and display art will be held in March at the New Harmony Gallery of Contemporary Art, sponsored by the University of Southern Indiana Office of Continuing Education.

Connie Weinzapfel, director of the New Harmony Gallery, will open the Saturday afternoon series on March 12 with a slide-assisted session on "Contemporary Art for the Beginning Collector." The class will become familiar with styles and types of contemporary art and learn purchasing techniques.

Michael Aakhus, USI associate professor of art, will be instructor for "Identifying Prints" on March 19. The class will learn to type prints and to distinguish between originals and reproductions. Participants are invited to bring their own prints to class for identification.

In the final workshop on "Conservation and Decorative Framing" on March 26, Curtis Uebelhor, assistant director of the New Harmony Gallery, will demonstrate how matting and framing can protect and enhance artwork. Participants will receive a discount certificate for Gallery framing.
