and 18.

Each session will be held from 4:30 to 8:30 p.m. in University Center Room 350.

George T. Haymaker, Jr., Treasurer, Alumninum Company of America, Pittsburgh, will be the

featured speaker for the November 4 seminar. His topic areas will be identifying markets and business opportunities in the late 1970's and trends affecting growth in United States industrial and consumer markets.

ISU-TH LISTENERS' THEATRE HERE. The Listeners' Theatre Company of Indiana State University-Terre Haute is currently touring Indiana with a special program "Founding Mothers." The presentation will be given as part of the ISUE Humanities Forum on November 11, 1976 at 11:00 a.m. in SC196.

Funded jointly by ISU and the Indiana Committee for the Humanities, the program presents an especially interesting vision of American history from 1492-1789 because it is based upon the experiences of American women. Taken from essays, letters, diaries, and poetry, the authentic sources reveal that American women have been active forces in the major events in the life of our nation.

STUDENTS ATTEND CONFERENCE. The first annual Public Relations Student Society of America (PRSSA) National Conference was held in Dayton, Ohio October 24-27. Indiana State University Evansville was represented by Student Union Board President, Rose Zigenfus; Student Union Board Public Relations Chairman, Mark Dwyer; and Communications Instructor, Brad Awe. The conference was hosted by the PRSSA Chapter of the Communications Arts Department at the University of Dayton.

The Society was formed nine years ago to inform and assist students interested in Public Relations. About 300 students from all over the United States were in attendance.

PITZER TO DIRECT COMMUNAL CONFERENCE. DONALD E. PITZER, Professor of History, will be director of the Third Annual Historic Communal Societies Conference at the restored Harmonist village of Economy at Ambridge, Pennsylvania, November 4-6. This conference is co-sponsored by the ISUE Center for Communal Studies of which DR. PITZER is also director. Others on the Board of Advisors of the Center are DANIEL MILLER, Chairman, Division of Social Science, CHARLES PETRANEK, Assistant Professor of Sociology, and JOSEPHINE ELLIOTT, Archivist. The Center serves as the administrative base for the National Historic Communal Societies Association which was formed in November 1975 with DR. PITZER as its first president.

History 400X (one semester hour) is being offered to those accompanying DR. PITZER to the conference. These students will be taken on guided tours of three historic communes; Harmony and Economy in Pennsylvania, which were the first and third villages built by the Harmonists who founded New Harmony, Indiana, and Zoar in Ohio which was a German communal colony from 1817 to 1898.

The all-day activity is scheduled from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m., and will take place in classrooms throughout the campus. Students from the Evansville high schools and schools in the surrounding area have been invited to participate. An estimated 150 students are expected.

Entrants will compete in the following categories: Broadcasting, Discussion, Boys' Extemp, Girls' Extemp, Dramatic, Humorous and Oratorical Interpretation; Impromptu, Original Oratory, and Poetry. Ribbons will be awarded to the top five speakers in each category. Trophies will be presented to the schools with the highest number of points. Judges for the Meet will include members of the ISUE faculty, and ISUE communications students.
