University community loses educator and friend



Dr. Charles Bertram, professor of education and mathematics, compliance coordinator and faculty athletics representative, died Tuesday, June 29, following a massive stroke on Friday, June 25. He joined the USI faculty in 1969. A math educator in southern Indiana for more than 30 years, Dr. Bertram received USI's first Sydney and Sadelle Berger Faculty Community Service Award in 1997 for his efforts to create Eagle Math Mania, a math education program in which

the athletes motivate second and third graders in the Evansville-Vanderburgh School Corporation to complete Eagle Math workbooks.

"Dr. Bertram dedicated himself to helping students learn mathematics and how to teach mathematics to others. Through contact with Charlie, USI's students became better people and USI became a better place for students to learn. His presence and good humor will be sorely missed," said Dr. Jerome Cain, dean of the Pott School of Science and Engineering Technology.

Dr. Bertram was chair of the USI Division of Education for 14 years, teacher certification director for nine years, and for many years was an Indiana examiner for the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education and the Indiana Teacher Education Standards Board. He was a long-time member and president of the Indiana Library and Historical Board, being appointed in 1984 by former Governor Robert D. Orr, and a long-time member and former officer of the Indiana Textbook Adoptions Advisory Committee of the State Board of Education.

Dr. Thomas Pickering, dean of the Bower-Suhrheinrich School of Education and Human Services, said, "Dr. Bertram always had time for students, and he had keen insight into their needs and abilities. In his classes students developed confidence in their understanding of math and their ability to teach. He was a teacher at heart and a respected math educator throughout the region and state. He played a key role in the development of teacher education at USI."

Dr. Bertram also was USI faculty athletics representative to the NCAA since the mid-1970s and was involved with the Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) since its inception. In January 1997, he became president of the GLVC, which included serving as liaison to the Council of Presidents and representing the conference at NCAA meetings and workshops. He was GLVC treasurer for many years and served on many GLVC committees. He also was an IHSAA basketball referee for more than 20 years and a youth coach at his church.

Dr. Bertram received an A.B. degree from the University of Evansville, M.S. from Southern Illinois University-Carbondale, and Ph.D. from Indiana University. A Gibson County native, he taught at Haubstadt, Elberfeld, and Evansville North high schools and at SIU prior to joining the USI faculty in 1969. Dr. Bertram is survived by his wife Mary Alice and two adult sons, John and David. Memorial contributions may be made to the Charles Bertram Memorial Scholarship through the USI Foundation.
