DENTAL CLINIC OPEN TO PUBLIC, A dental clinic, operated by Indiana State University Evansville Dental Hygiene faculty and students, is open to the general public. The clinic offers preventive dental services, such as prophylaxis (cleaning), X-rays, fluoride treatment, and patient education.

The dental clinic is open on Monday from 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon and 1:00 p.m.-5:00 p.m., and on Tuesday from 6:00 p.m.-9:00 p.m. The Tuesday evening session is primarily for adult patients. The services of the clinic are performed by students under supervision of a dentist and instructors. Persons can make an appointment by calling Ext. 202, 208, 206, or 278. A nominal fee is charged.
