1996-97 Outlook

The University of Southern Indiana Lady Screaming Eagles want return to the "Big Dance" in 1996-97 and fill their dance card.

Two years ago, the Lady Eagles won their first Great Lakes Valley Conference title and earned a first trip to the "Big Dance" -- NCAA Division II Tournament.

Last year, USI, who tied a school record for wins with a 22-7 overall and 16-4 GLVC, finished a strong second in the GLVC and earned a second berth in the NCAA II Tournament. USI advanced to the second round by defeating Oakland University, 84-83, before bowing out.

USI Head Coach **Chancellor Dugan**, who took over the team in 1991-92, has taken the Lady Eagles from a 3-25 team in the 1990-91 season to two consecutive 20-plus win years. Over her five years, Dugan has the highest winning percentage and second highest win total in USI women's basketball history with an 84-57 (.596) record.

If the Eagles can surpass 18 wins again this year, Dugan will become USI's all-time winningest coach. The Lady Eagles' first head coach, Ruth Waller holds the record for wins with a 102-94 (.502) record.

To help Dugan reach this plateau, she has 6-0 senior forward/center **LeAnn Freeland** (Sims, Ill.), a two-time All-American. Freeland, who also was a GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American in 1995-96, led the team with 21.6 ppg and 9.5 rpg.

Last year, Freeland became USI's all-time career scorer (1,595 points), field goal shooter (628 fgm), and free throw shooter (523 ftn). She is in position to become USI's all-time leading rebounder, needing just 68.

Also last year, Freeland became the first USI player to ever score 600-plus points in two consecutive seasons. This year she could become the first women's player to score 1,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds.

Joining Freeland on the back line is 6-0 junior forward **Eileen Weber** (Washington, Ind.), USI's ninth all-timer scorer and 11th all-time rebounder. Weber, who was second team All-GLVC last season, was second on the team in scoring with 16.7 ppg and 7.5 rpg.

Returning for a second season of competition are 6-2 sophomore center **Angi Lintker** (Venedy, Ill.), 5-9 sophomore forward **Lora Copelin** (English, Ind.), and 6-1 sophomore forward/center **Cathy Tepool** (Wadesville, Ind.).

Lintker averaged 6.0 ppg and 3.6 rpg in 29 games as a freshman. Tepool, who averaged 3.5 ppg and 5.7 rpg as a freshman in 1994-95, rejoins the team after sitting out last season.

The only new player in the frontcourt is 6-2 freshman center **Summer Hart** (Boonville, Ind.). Hart was an All-State performer last year at Boonville High School.

In the frontcourt, the Lady Eagles will be led by 5-10 sophomore guard **Adrienne Seitz** (Otwell, Ind.), who averaged 5.0 ppg and 3.3 rpg in 29 games as a freshman. Seitz started the last 18 games of 1995-96.

Also returning in the frontcourt is 5-4 junior guard **Randa Gatling** (Evansville, Ind.) and 5-6 sophomore guard **Christen Miller** (Mitchell, Ind.). Off the bench, Gatling averaged 2.2 ppg and 1.1 rpg, while Miller averaged 1.0 ppg.

To give the team added depth at the guard position, the Eagles have added five guards.

From the junior college ranks, the Eagles have 5-8 junior guard **Angela Cacello** (South Wilmington, Ill.), who played for Kankakee Junior College, and 5-6 junior guard **Ericka Nance** (Chicago, Ill.), who

played for John A. Logan. USI picks up freshman duo 5-11 guard **Mindy Gingerich** (Kokomo, Ind.), and 5-7 guard **Jennifer Donner** (Wadesville, Ind.).

The fifth new guard is a Division I transfer from Indiana State University, 5-7 junior **Darci Redenbaugh**. She averaged 11.7 ppg, second on the team, and 2.8 rpg at ISU last season.

The obstacle facing the team is filling the spots left by four graduating seniors--three starters and one reserve. Last year's point guard Daria Weitekamp set a single-season record for assists for the second straight season, and Deb Pope set most of the USI and GLVC season and career records for three-point field goal shooting.

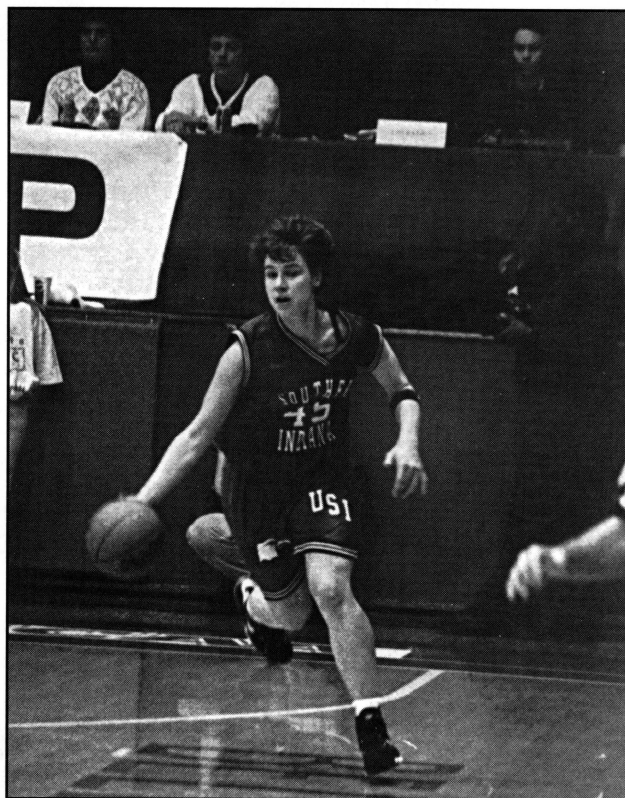
On the defensive end, Dugan will have to fill a hole left by Curita Bonner. Bonner, who was one of USI's best defensive players last year, was third on the team in rebounding a year ago.

This edition of the Lady Eagles will face one of the toughest schedules in Division II women's basketball.

USI's non-conference schedule begins at Northern Michigan University and Michigan Technological University on the road. NMU advanced to the Elite Eight in 1995-96 out of the Great Lakes Region and both were NCAA Division II tournament teams in 1994-95.

In addition, USI will host the Holiday Inn Classic for the third year which will feature the GLVC versus the Gulf South Conference. USI and Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, will play the University of Central Arkansas and Delta State University of the Gulf South.

After the grueling non-conference schedule, the Lady Eagles will play a tough 20-game GLVC schedule. The league will feature 1995-96 NCAA II tournament teams Bellarmine College and Indiana University/Purdue University Ft. Wayne and perennial powers Saint Joseph's College and Northern Kentucky University.

USI Head Coach Chance Dugan

In a step-by-step process over five seasons, University of Southern Indiana Head Coach Chancellor Dugan has kept her promise from five years ago by directing the Lady Screaming Eagles into the national spotlight.

Dugan ranks number one at USI in winning percentage (.597, 84-57) and second in total wins (84). A key is the mental discipline imparted to her players which makes them strong down the stretch. In the last two years, Dugan's teams have been 17-6 (.739) in February and March.

In 1995-96, Dugan led USI to a second consecutive berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament with a 22-7 overall record and a second place finish in the GLVC at 16-4. Dugan and the squad, who fought all season long for respect, climbed in the regional rankings late in the year and went 7-1 in the final eight games to reach the national tournament.

In 1994-95, Dugan, who is also an assistant athletic director, led the Lady Eagles to a series of firsts. Dugan's squad had the best record in school history (22-5); made their first appearance in the NCAA Division II Tournament; claimed their first GLVC title; ranked in the NCAA top-20; and had a 16-game winning streak, 15 of the games coming from the 1994-95 season. During the regular season, the team was nationally ranked as high as third.

With the winning streak, Dugan has succeeded in a 180-degree turn around since she took over the helm in 1991-92.

Under Dugan's direction in 1993-94, the Lady Eagles set a school record for wins in a season (17) and a school record for wins in the GLVC (12). In 1993-94 Dugan led the team to a third place finish in the GLVC, the highest ever by a USI women's team.

In her second season Dugan led the women's program into the upper division of the GLVC. In 1992-93 she coached the Eagles to a school-record nine wins in the GLVC and fell one game short of tying the school record for wins in a season, with 15 victories.

The first season, Dugan led the women's basketball team to an 8-20 record, which was more wins than the previous two years combined.

The hard-working, enthusiastic Dugan, a native of Louisville, Ky., graduated from Eastern Kentucky University in 1982 with a Bachelor's in Physical Education and received a Master's in Physical Edu-

cation in 1989 from Morehead. While an undergraduate at ECU, Dugan was a three-year starter and finished her junior and senior years as the team's leading rebounder and second-leading scorer.

After graduating from ECU, she took the head coaching job at George West High School in George West, Texas, where she guided the team to a 56-30 record in three years.

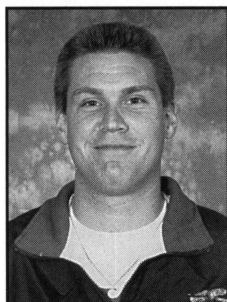

In addition to his duties on the court, Stein teaches activity classes in the Physical Education Department and manages the recently renovated PAC weight room.

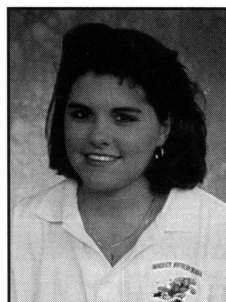

Assistant Coach Shannon Litton



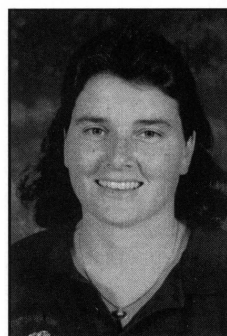

1996-97: A top candidate for the 1996-97 NCAA II Player of the Year honors...needs only 68 rebounds to become USI's all-time rebounding leader. **1995-96:** Became the first women's basketball player at USI to become a two-time All-American by WBCA/Kodak, *College Sports* and *Division II Bulletin*...also the first USI women's player to be named first team All-GLVC two years in a row...earned GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American honors for the first time and was named to the Academic All-GLVC team for the second straight season...led USI in scoring with 21.6 ppg (625 points) and in rebounding with 9.5 rpg (274 rebounds)...became USI's all-time leading scorer in just three seasons and became the first player to score over 600 points in two consecutive seasons...had a season-high 36 points against Indiana/Purdue Ft. Wayne and a career-high 19 rebounds against the University of Indianapolis. **1994-95:** Named the *College Sports* **NCAA II Player of the Year** and WBCA/Kodak All-American as a sophomore...also named GLVC Player of the Year, first team All-GLVC, Academic All-GLVC and the Most Valuable Player of the Northeast Missouri Thanksgiving Tournament, the Ferris State Bulldog Classic, and the USI Holiday Tournament...set a USI and GLVC record for points in a game with a career-high 50 on the road versus Indiana/Purdue University at Ft. Wayne...also set a USI and GLVC record for blocks in a season (69 overall and 49 in conference games) and a game (10 versus the University of Indianapolis)...set a USI single-season record for points (658)...had a season-high 15 rebounds at home versus IPFW. **1993-94:** Named Most Improved Player (season) after playing in all 27 games, starting 14, as a freshman...was second on the team and tenth in the GLVC in rebounding, averaging 7.5 rpg...third on the team in scoring with 11.6 ppg...averaged 17.8 ppg and 10.3 rpg in the final ten games of 1993-94...had a season-high 27 points versus Ashland and 19 rebounds against SIU-Edwardsville, both at the PAC. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Earned 13 letters in basketball, softball, volleyball, and track at Wayne City High School (Ill.)...was named to the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association first team All-State, *The Evansville Courier* Player of the Year, the Southern Illinois Coaches Association All-South team, and had her jersey retired as a senior...is the all-time leading scorer, boys and girls, in WCHS history with 2,123 points (25 ppg), and averaged 10.3 rpg in 85 games...was named the Lady Indians Most Valuable Player all four years at WCHS and All-Mid South Conference as a freshman and sophomore (the conference was disbanded for basketball after her sophomore season)...also named MVP in softball (sophomore), in volleyball (co-MVP as a senior), and in track (freshman, sophomore, and junior)...had a career batting average in softball of .517. **PERSONAL:** Born June 23, 1975...hobbies include softball, sand volleyball, and reading...ranked fourth in a class of 50 at WCHS.

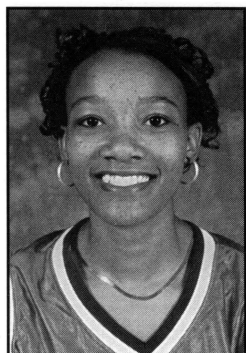

COSIDA/GTE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA WOMEN'S TEAM

In 1996, LeAnn Freeland became the first USI women's basketball player to be named to the CoSIDA/GTE Academic All-America Team.

The Academic All-America team selected by members of the College Sports Information Directors of America, honors the nation's best student-athletes at the university and college level.

Just as balancing of basketball and academics is demanding, the standards for nomination and selection to the team are rigorous. To be nominated, a basketball player must be a varsity starter or key reserve and must maintain a minimum 3.200 cumulative grade-point average (on a 4.000 scale).

The program to honor this combination of academics and athletics began in the 1950s. Academic and athletic biographical data of nominees is prepared in ballot form and mailed to the CoSIDA membership, which votes in each of eight districts. From the eight

district teams comes a national ballot, distributed to more than 1,400 members who vote for the final Academic All-America team.

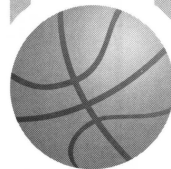

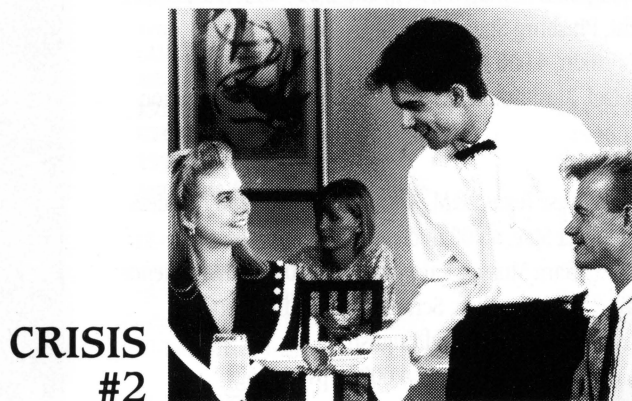

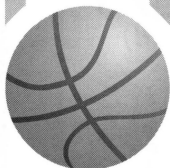
