2010 BASEBALL SEASON OUTLOOK

The University of Southern Indiana has been a fixture on top of the GLVC West Division the last two years and is hoping to make it a school record three-straight division titles in 2010, while extending its season even farther in the NCAA Division II Tournament.

The Screaming Eagles are coming off a 2009 season that saw them win a second-straight conference regular season crown for the first time in 15 seasons, winning the GLVC West Division with a 20-7 mark. USI also posted a 39-19 overall record, reaching at least 30 wins for the third consecutive year, the first time since the 1992, 1993, and 1994 campaigns.

The Eagles also appeared in the NCAA II Midwest Regional for the second time in three seasons, advancing to the semifinals before bowing out.

USI Head Coach **Tracy Archuleta** begins his fourth season with the Eagles and has won 118 of 180 games (.656 winning percentage) in his first three seasons at the helm. He will have a squad that has 15 returning players and 17 newcomers in 2010.

The Pitching Staff

The key to any successful season always comes down to pitching and Archuleta has one of the best one-two punches in the GLVC with preseason All-Americans **Trevor Leach**, a junior right-hander, and **Tyler Choate**, a senior right-handed pitcher and infielder.

Leach, who was named preseason by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, set the USI single-season records for wins and winning percentage by going 11-0 in 2009. The 2010 first team All-GLVC and All-Midwest Region pitcher, who won eight games out of the bullpen and three as a starter, also had a 2.87 ERA with 66 strike outs in 94 innings of work as a sophomore. The 2.87 ERA is tops among the returning USI hurlers.

Choate, who also will see action as a pitcher and infielder again this season, was named preseason All-American by the NCBWA as a utility player and a "Player to Watch" by the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. The Daktronics second team All-Region and All-GLVC utility player in 2009 was USI's number one starter last spring, finishing the season with a 7-3 overall record with a 3.22 ERA and 76 strike outs in 16 appearances and 15 starts.

At the plate, Choate sparked USI in the top third of the lineup. He had a team-best 10 home runs and ranked second with a .357 batting average. The senior also had 52 runs scored, 15 doubles, four triples, and 37 RBIs.

Looking to return to form in 2010 is senior right-hander **Casey Geiger**, who missed nearly all of last season with the Eagles. Geiger was one of USI's top hurlers out of the bullpen in 2008 with a 2.75 ERA and a 7-3 record in 30 appearances.

Also returning in the bullpen is sophomore right-hander **Shad Macke**. Macke saw limited action in 12 games for the Eagles during his first season, pitching in 16.1 innings.

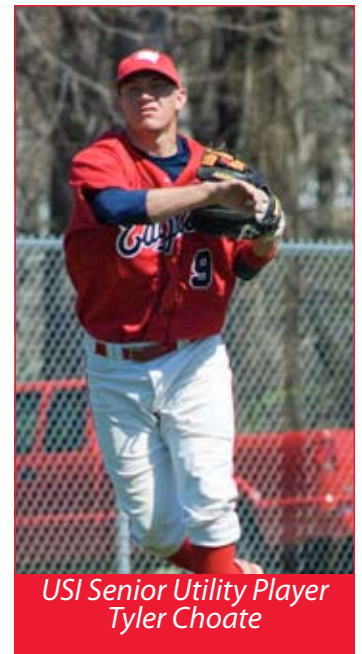
Archuleta has added eight transfers to the Eagles pitching stable in 2010. The transfers include one senior in **Wandy Rosario**; four junior right-handers in **Taylor Dennis**, **Mark Walther**, **Jared Canterbury**, and **Dan Marcacci**; a junior left-hander **Scott Handley**; and a sophomore right-hander **Josh Schultze**.

Infielders

The Eagles' infield has been solid the last three seasons and returns three of four starters from last season.

The leading returning hitter on the infield is sophomore second baseman **Brad Vance**. Vance, a surprise fixture at the second bag for the Eagles, started 57 of 58 games and had a .295 batting average with two home runs, 35 RBIs, and 29 runs scored.

Beginning their third season on the USI infield are first baseman **Caleb Ehmke** and shortstop/third baseman **Wes Fink**. Fink batted .286 in 2009 with three home runs, 34

RBI, and 41 runs scored, while Ehmke overcame a slow start to bat .262 with six home runs and 30 RBIs in the lead-off spot.

USI also could get significant production from the return of senior middle-infielder **Kevin O'Hair**, who missed all of last season to a back injury. O'Hair played a major role at shortstop during USI's 2007 run to the NCAA Division II Championship series and started at second base during the 2008 GLVC West Division Championship season.

The Eagles have a strong bench in with the return of sophomore infielder Ben Griggs, who had a pair of starts in the NCAA Division II Midwest Regional last spring.

New to the infield are Rosario, who is likely penciled into the shortstop position when not pitching; junior **Adam Enright**; junior **Craig Heinz**; and freshman **Reece Rounder**.

CATCHERS

Behind the plate is a major strength for the Eagles in 2010, led by junior **Dylan Mooney**. Mooney played in 54 of 58 games for the Eagles in 2009, making 49 starts. He also batted .291 with five home runs and 40 RBIs a year ago. Three of his home runs came in the GLVC Tournament against Quincy University.

Mooney is joined behind the plate by senior **Kyle Rowley** and freshman **Zach Wilkinson**.

OUTFIELD

All three starting slots in the USI outfield are up for grabs due to graduation.

Three candidates include one returner in sophomore **Chase Holzmeyer** and junior newcomers **Justin Blinn** and **Michael Huling**. The Eagles also could pull Ehmke out to the outfield for added depth.

Tracy Archuleta Head Baseball Coach

Tracy Archuleta is off to the fastest pace of any USI baseball coach in the history of the program. Archuleta has won 118 games in two seasons at the helm and taken the squad back into the regional and national spotlight.

Archuleta's first Eagles team made their first appearance in the final four of the NCAA Division II Baseball Championship and won their first ever NCAA Division II North Central Regional championship. USI also set a school record by posting 43 victories, 25 wins better than the year before.

The Eagles and Archuleta finished their first season together ranked fourth nationally; had a 43-23 overall record; and 24-15 in the GLVC. USI placed second in the GLVC regular season and fourth in the conference tournament.

For his efforts, Archuleta was named the ABCA North Central Region Coach of the Year in 2007.

In the second season, Archuleta and the Eagles won their first GLVC West Division and the first conference regular season title in 15 years. USI finished the year with 36 victories during the regular schedule, tying for fifth all-time in the history of the program.

The Eagles also were ranked as high as sixth nationally in 2008.

The third season was as nearly as exciting as the first with the Eagles coming two wins away from advancing to second NCAA II Baseball Championship appearance. USI won the GLVC West for a second straight year before finishing third in the GLVC Tournament and the NCAA Division II Midwest Regional. The Eagles were 39-19 overall, marking the fourth best win total in the history of the program.

USI, which also was 20-7 in the GLVC in 2009, set a single-season school record by blasting 48 home runs.

In Archuleta's three seasons, USI has appeared in three GLVC Tournaments, two NCAA II Regionals, and one NCAA II championship series. Archuleta's Eagles also have featured three All-Americans, one Academic All-American, 10 All-Regional performers, and 13 All-GLVC players.

Archuleta came to USI after five seasons at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside that featured a pair of NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and a pair of 40-win seasons. UW-Parkside also advanced to the NCAA II North Central Regional title game in 2005 and was 148-124 (.544) during Archuleta's tenure.

After setting the foundation during his first two years, Archuleta directed the Rangers into the national spotlight with a 41-18 season in 2004, finishing on top of the GLVC standings and earning the school's first-ever NCAA II Tournament bid. Between 2002 and 2004, UW-Parkside went from 13 wins to 41 wins.

Archuleta's Rangers continued their march in 2005, this time with a 45-18 record, picking up the school's first GLVC baseball championship along the way. Again, the club made the NCAA II Tournament, reaching the regional championship game. The 2005 team broke the school record for wins in a season, set by the 2004 squad. In each of those two seasons, the Rangers finished among the top 25 teams in the nation.

In his tenure at UW-Parkside, Archuleta coached the Rangers first All-American, Regional Player of the Year, GLVC Player of the Year, and he had two players sign professional contracts and 11 players earn All-Region honors. He was tabbed GLVC Coach of the Year in 2004.

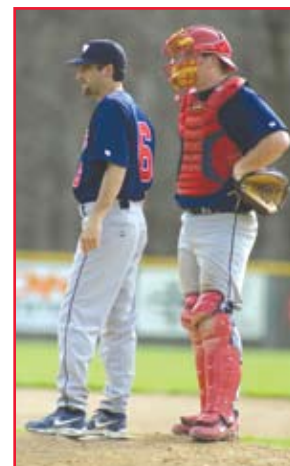
Archuleta served as an assistant coach for five seasons at Wayne State College (Nebraska) and Central Missouri State University at the NCAA II level before taking the top spot at UW-Parkside.

At Wayne State, he was the infield coach, hitting coach, and recruiting coordinator on the team that captured its first NSIC championship and NCAA II regional birth in the 2001 season.

Archuleta helped guide the team's batting average to 25th in the country (2000) and, in 2001, the squad was third in the country in fielding percentage (.969). In 2001, Wayne State finished 26th in the country with a record of 35-10.

During his tenure at CMSU, the Mules won the regular season conference championship with a record of 20-1 and were ranked as high as fifth in the nation. The team picked up an NCAA tournament bid and finished 16th in the country with a 43-10 mark. Archuleta was CMSU's outfield coach and recruiting coordinator. He also assisted the hitters.

The native of Iliff, Colorado, earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Metropolitan State College of Denver and has a master's degree in education from Wayne State College. He has three children, Mikaela, 15, Alex, 9, and Samuel, 6.

Chris Marx is in his second season with Head Coach Tracy Archuleta and the USI baseball program. He will work with the outfielders and hitters, while assisting in recruiting.

Prior to joining the USI staff, Marx began his coaching career as the head coach of the Indiana Yankees, a U17 select travel team and as an assistant coach for the Dubois County Bombers of the Central Illinois Collegiate League. The

Bombers won the CICL league and tournament championships in 2007.

The Evansville, Indiana, native and graduate of Mater Dei High School also has been an instructor at the University of Notre Dame Baseball Camp and at the Tim Marx's Baseball School.

As a collegiate player, Marx played for Olney Central Community College and Ouachita Baptist University. He helped Ouachita Baptist to 50 wins and a number one national ranking in 2007.

Marx graduated from USI in 2008 with a degree in health services.



Jeremy Kuester
Assistant Baseball Coach

Jeremy Kuester enters his first season as an assistant coach for USI and Head Coach Tracy Archuleta. He will assist with pitching and hitting.

Kuester continues to make the transition from player to coach after two seasons at the University of Evansville and two years at Kentucky Wesleyan College. He started the transition by working baseball camps at Evansville, the University of Kentucky, and Austin Peay State University.

The native of Rockport, Indiana, finished his collegiate career with the Aces and the Panthers with a 9-10 mark, while producing a 5.23 ERA and 116 strikeouts in 189.2 innings of work. He also batted .255 with 51 RBIs and five home runs and was a member of the Aces NCAA Division I Super-Regional squad in 2006.

Kuester, who graduated from KWC in 2009 with a bachelor's degree in sports studies, comes to USI from a family rich in baseball tradition. His father, Brian Kuester '81, who has been the head baseball coach at Rockport High School for 15 year, played for the Eagles (1977-80) and helped coach the team in the under former USI Head Coach Larry Shown. Ivan Kuester, his grandfather, also was an assistant coach for USI under Shown.

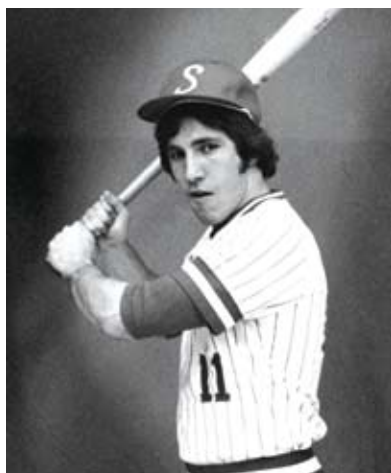

About the University of Southern Indiana



Location

The University of Southern Indiana was founded in Evansville in 1965. USI is a comfortable drive from the major metropolitan centers of Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Louisville, Nashville, and St. Louis.

The Campus

The Health Professions Center, Science Center, Wright Administration Building, Education Center, and Orr Center are located on the north side of campus. Rice Library, University Center, Liberal Arts Center, Technology Center, and Business and Engineering Center (now under construction) form the quadrangle in the center of campus. The Physical Activities Center and the Recreation, Fitness, and Wellness Center are located east of University Boulevard, a major thoroughfare through campus. Apartment buildings and residence halls are home to 2,800 students who live on campus.

Academic Life

The University enrolls 10,516 students and offers undergraduate majors in 70 areas of study. An ever-increasing number of post-graduate programs also are available to students who wish to continue their education, including a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree. Opportunities are available for service learning, study abroad, and internships.

Campus Life

Outside the classroom, students have opportunities to participate in more than 90 organizations offering co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Special interest clubs, student government, sororities and fraternities, music and drama groups, and other organizations enable the students to enjoy and contribute to campus life.

Residence Life

Students living on campus have their choice of two types of housing. Students can live in standard apartments or in suite-style housing in residence halls which have amenities such as Internet connections, wireless Internet, and cable television. Computer labs, laundromats, a convenience store, outdoor and indoor recreation areas, and student lounges contribute to an efficient living environment that has proven to be overwhelmingly popular to students. Meal plans also are available at the University Center, which is located in the center of campus.

Financial Assistance

USI provides families with an affordable way to higher education. While some families find that they can handle the cost of a USI education without financial assistance, others qualify for need-based financial packages, including grants, loans, and on-campus jobs.



Evansville, Indiana

Situated on the banks of the Ohio River, Evansville is a mid-sized city that welcomes USI students and offers them plenty of things to do. Roberts Stadium and the Victory Theatre attract students to concerts by entertainers like Nelly, Aerosmith, Kenny Chesney, Kid Rock, and Josh Groban. Traveling Broadway shows and feature performances come to The Centre. For a relaxing walk or invigorating run, the downtown riverfront features a greenway with a wonderful view of the changing river traffic and the Evansville skyline. Movie theatres (including an IMAX) and Swonder Ice Arena draw students together for fun, activity, and fellowship. Evansville's coffee shops, restaurants, and shopping areas also are places where students like to spend time. Less than three miles from campus, shopping centers and restaurants are plentiful on both sides of the Lloyd Expressway. The Eastland Mall area on Green River Road and the commercial centers off Burkhardt Road offer more restaurants and terrific shopping. USI's suburban location in the rolling hills of western Vanderburgh County is just minutes away from all that Evansville has to offer.
