ALUMNI ASSOCIATION HONORS FOUR. Awards were presented to four persons at the annual meeting, reception and dinner-dance Saturday, April 27, of the Alumni Association of ISUE.

Dr. Frank F. McDonald Sr. received the Special Recognition Award. As mayor of Evansville in 1965, he was quietly successful in persuading officials at ISU in Terre Haute to create the branch campus in Evansville which on July 1 will become the autonomous University of Southern Indiana.

The Distinguished Alumni Award went to Walter R. Brunton, a Posey County banker who is very active in his community. He also was the Alumni Association representative on the Board of Incorporators, the group which studied the need for and recommended approval of the autonomous USI by the General Assembly and Governor Robert D. Orr.

Dr. Wanda B. Hibbitts received the Faculty Recognition Award. An associate professor of business, she was honored for outstanding service in the academic environment and for demonstrating exemplary devotion to the success of ISUE students, particularly with regard to their meeting requirements to become Certified Public Accountants.

Allen R. Mounts, who served the association during the 1983-84 administration, received the Past President's Award.

The association also elected new officers at Saturday's meeting. Dr. Daniel J. Fink will succeed David E. Gray as president. Other new officers are Tamarah D. Pate, vice president; Ronald R. Bonger, treasurer; and Carolyn M. Klassy, secretary.

NAMES IN THE NEWS. Dr. George Abshier, ISUE professor of business, has been elected president of the Indiana Extension/Research Support Committee. Composed of 30 persons from throughout the state, the group gives counsel and advice to the dean of agriculture at Purdue University on extension programs and budgets, and works with the Indiana General Assembly and Congress on budgetary support for agricultural research, teaching, and extension programs in Indiana. On April 26, Dr. Charles T. Barber, ISUE professor of political science, served as a panelist at the annual meeting of the Indiana Political Science Association in Muncie, discussing "The 1984 Election." The papers that Dr. Barber discussed were written by professors at Ball State University, Pace University in Bronxville, New York, and Indiana University Southeast.

Dr. Barber also was the guest speaker Monday, April 29, at the Fellowship Dinner meeting of Trinity Lutheran Church, where he discussed "The United Nations at Thirty-Nine."

Dr. J. Eliseo Da Rosa, ISUE professor of economics, organized and chaired a panel on "Paraguay: Prospects for Democracy After Stroessner" for the International Conference of the Latin American Studies Association held in Albuquerque, New Mexico, April 18-21, 1985. Participants in the panel were academicians, journalists, and politicians from Paraguay now living in exile in Argentina, Brazil, and Uruguay. Dr. Da Rosa presented a paper titled "The Economic Legacy of the Stroessner Regime." Also, as a member of the Task Force on Human Rights and Academic Freedom, he wrote a resolution condemning violations of freedom of the press by the Paraguayan government. The resolution was approved unanimously by the LASA Conference.

The Inter-American Bar Association has re-elected Professor Da Rosa as cochairman of the Committee on Natural Resources and the Environment for its next conference, to be held September 28-October 4 in Mexico City. The committee will prepare a Model Environmental Code that association members can use as a basis for legislative proposals in their respective countries.

MID-AMERICA SINGERS TO PERFORM. The Mid-America Singers will present their annual spring concert at 7 p.m. Friday, May 3, in Forum One. The public is invited.

HANDBELL CONCERT THIS WEEKEND. The fifth annual Evansville Handbell Festival Concert will be held at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, May 4, at the ISUE Physical Activities Center. The 200 handbell ringers, directed by Douglas Wagner, will premiere "Overture for a Celebration," written for this festival. The concert is being sponsored by the ISUE Division of Humanities as an official event of the 1985 Ohio River Arts Festival. Admission is \$2 for adults, and \$1 for senior citizens and children under 12 years of age.

ISUE STUDENTS IN MUSEUM PROGRAM. English students from ISUE and UE will join writers from the community in participating in an open reading at 2 p.m. Sunday, May 5, at the Evansville Museum of Arts and Science. The program is free and open to the public.
