

#### USI BASEBALL OUTLOOK

The University of Southern Indiana and the Great Lakes Valley Conference are borrowing an idea from the past for the future. For the first time since 1988, the GLVC will feature divisional play in the conference round robin.

The conference champion will be determined by a best-two-ofthree series between the two divisional champions.

The South Division will feature USI, Bellarmine College, Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Northern Kentucky University, and the University of Missouri-St. Louis.

The North Division will have Indiana University/Purdue University at Ft. Wayne, University of Indianapolis, Lewis University, Quincy University, St. Joseph's College, and University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

In divisional play, USI will play a three-game series with each team of the South Division and will play a doubleheader with each team of the North Division. The South Division will include SIUE and UMSL, both of whom have been in the NCAA Division II Championship Series in the 1990s. In the North, the Eagles will be playing St. Joseph's, who was the NCAA II Finalist in 1996, and Lewis, which finished third nationally in 1994.

Along with league changes, the Eagles face some roster changes. Gone for the 1997 season are longtime starters Craig Shoobridge, USI's all-time leader in shutouts, and Korey Lamb, a four-year starter at second base.

The Eagles, under the direction of fourth year Head Coach **Mike Goedde**, return 18 players from last year's team (11 position players and seven pitchers), and will be joined by nine newcomers (five pitchers and four position players). Goedde is 92-64 (.590) in three seasons at the helm.

#### Pitching

On the mound, the Eagles may be deeper than they have been in many years.

Throwing from the left side, junior **Doug Allison** (Rockville, Ind.) was 4-1 in 11 games and eight starts. He had the top ERA, 3.76, among pitchers with five or more starts.

Senior left-hander **Kadish Evans** (Auburn, Ind.) will try to regain the form he displayed as a sophomore. In 1996, Evans' record slipped to 2-4, but one of the victories was a no-hitter against West Georgia College.

On the right side, the Eagles will be looking for strong performances from a pair of sophomores, **Rudy Boals** (Howe, Ind.) and **Steve Reed** (Clarksville, Ind.).

Boals, who battled an injury in the middle of last season, was 2-3 with a 5.21 ERA in 11 games and six starts. Reed was 3-2 with a 5.40 ERA in nine games and eight starts, tying for second on the team in complete games.

The Eagles return three sophomores, who showed promise in appearances out of the bullpen. Left-hander **Ryan Martin** (Evansville, Ind.) led USI with a 3.60 ERA and was 1-1 in six appearances. Right-hander **Peter Johnson** (Cambridge City, Ind.) was second on the team in ERA with a 3.63 in ten appearances and 3-0 with a save. On the left side, sophomore **Jay Sparks** (Evansville, Ind.) showed promise both out of the pen and as a starter. Sparks, while 1-4, had a 4.68 ERA in ten games and six starts.

Four new hurlers give the team depth. The four freshmen are **Tim Florence** (Mitchell, Ind.), **Dennis Good** (Rushville, Ind.), **Brad Miller** (New Haven, Ind.), and **Matthew Renn** (Floyds Knobs, Ind.).

#### The Infield

With four of five starters returning, the Eagle infield is ready to play. Leading the way is four-year starter **Kevin Irons** (Ft. Wayne, Ind.). Irons hit .304 with seven doubles and one home run in 44 games, and led the Eagles in RBIs with 30.

At shortstop, USI returns sophomore **Jeremy Cook** (Evansville, Ind.), who successfully replaced long-time starter Barry Strauser in 1996. Cook was second on the infield in hitting with a .340 batting average, 22 runs scored, and 14 RBIs.

Just down the baseline is sophomore **Jeremy Jones** (Evansville, Ind.) at the hot corner. Jones, who could see some action at second base this year, played 34 games, 27 starts, at third base with 18 runs scored and 15 RBIs as a freshman.

With second base vacated by the graduation of Korey Lamb, USI has an option in sophomore Drew Bailey (Evansville, Ind.), who played in 19 games, with seven starts, in 1996.

Behind the plate, the squad returns second team All-GLVC performer **Andy Hoffman** (Evansville, Ind.). Hoffman hit .309, led the team with four home runs, and was second on the squad with 29 RBIs.

Backing Hoffman behind the plate is junior **Rich Eyler** (Loogootee, Ind.). Eyler, who saw action in 35 games both as the catcher and designated hitter, hit .324 with 24 RBIs and seven doubles.

Also behind the plate is sophomore **Corey Steele** (Chandler, Ind.), who saw action defensively in three games in 1996.

#### The Outfield

The center piece of the USI outfield is first team All-GLVC performer **Jason Engelbrecht** (Evansville, Ind.).

Engelbrecht, who was named All-GLVC for his defense as much as his offense, was second on the team in hitting with a .355 batting average and 29 runs scored. He led the team with 14 stolen bases.

When Engelbrecht missed several games with an injury, the Eagles discovered a new outfielder in Jason Folz (Evansville, Ind.), who will be in his second season with the Eagles. Folz led the team in hitting with a .356 batting average in 33 games.

Challenging for the final starting spot is sophomore **Todd Chase** (Evansville, Ind.), who hit .375 in 10 games.

#### **Utility Players**

USI has five players who will vie for open positions in both the infield and the outfield.

Returning to backup first base is sophomore **David Scheu** (Mt. Vernon, Ind.), who also could see action in the outfield after five appearances as a freshman in 1996. A redshirt in 1996, freshman infielder **Nate Betancourt** (Clarksville, Ind.) could challenge for the

second base position.

New to the team this year are freshmen **Keith Kirkland** (Boonville, Ind.) and **Mike Peerman** (Chandler, Ind.). Peerman, who will be activated this year after a redshirt season, could challenge Jones at third or see action in the outfield.

Freshman **Aaron Armes** (Glendale, Ind.) joins the team as an out-fielder after playing for Washington High School last season.



## THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA BASEBALL FIELD

The USI baseball field became the permanent home of the Screaming Eagles 23 years ago and has seen outstanding players and great games. Today, it stands as one of the premiere playing surfaces in southern Indiana and the NCAA Division II and continues to be developed.

Located on the USI campus, it has concession stands, media accommodations, seating for approximately 200 fans, and restrooms. In close proximity to the field is the Bent Twig Outdoor Education Center, a picnic/nature area down the left- and rightfield lines.

In the outfield, the dimensions measure 355 feet down the lines, 375 feet to the power alleys, and 385 feet to dead center-field. The entire area is maintained by a computerized-underground sprinkler system installed in 1992. Behind the fence is a beautiful tree line which provides an excellent hitting background.

As the program has developed, so has the playing field. In 1987, two all-weather batting cages and a 15-feet warning track along the outfield fence were added. The summer of 1989 brought surfacing of the infield with a special blend of brick dust to create an all-weather field. Resurfaced in the fall of 1994, the brick dust is protected by a tarp that covers the entire infield. The tarp also enables the Eagles to play and practice when most teams in the midwest are rained out.

The nine-inning scoreboard was added in 1993. It has high visibility and displays inning-by-inning scoring and current runs, hits, and errors.

The field continued to develope in 1996. Major league foul polls were installed before the 1996 season, along with astro turf in front of both dugouts and in both batting cages. During the fall, concrete was poured in preparation for the construction of stands during the summer of 1997.

Each summer, the field is home to the Funkhouser American Legion team which hosted the 1994 American Legion Tournament, and the Evansville Black Sox, which will begin play on the field this summer. The diamond became a practice facility for movie stars during the making of the movie, *A League of Their Own*, in August 1992.

#### **Head Coach Mike Goedde**

In 1997, Mike Goedde will be entering his fourth season as head baseball coach at the University of Southern Indiana. He successfully led the Eagles to their eighth consecutive winning season at 27-22 last year.

During his second season as coach in 1995, Goedde led the Eagles to a 29-23 record and a 10-8 GLVC record, just missing the GLVC Tournament.

In his first season, Goedde led the Eagles to a 36-19 record and berths in the Great Lakes Valley Conference and NCAA Division II Central Region tournaments.


Prior to coming to USI, Goedde was an assistant coach at the University of Evansville (UE) under Head Coach Jim Brownlee from 1986-1988 and 1990-1993.

While Goedde was at UE, the baseball team was the Midwestern Collegiate Conference champion in 1988 and 1990. In 1988, the pitching staff had the second best ERA in the country with a 2.99. This staff featured major league All-Star Andy Benes, who plays professionally for the St. Louis Cardinals.

In professional baseball, Goedde was signed as a pitcher in the fourth round of the 1983 draft by the Cincinnati Reds and spent three seasons in their farm system (1983-1985). In 1989, Goedde was a pitching instructor with the Cincinnati Reds organization in the Pioneer League at Billings, Mont.

The Evansville native graduated from UE with a degree in sports administration, and from Mater Dei High School.

In addition to his duties as baseball coach, Goedde also is assistant intramurals director at USI.



#### **Assistant Coach Chris Barney**



Assistant Coach Chris Barney will begin his fourth season at USI as the hitting instructor and will work with the infielders and outfielders.

Barney joined Goedde's staff in 1993-94 after spending the 1992-93 year at Tusculum College in Greenville, Tenn. Prior to working at Tusculum, Barney spent three-and-a-half years (1989-92)with Tennessee Wesleyan College as an assistant coach. At both schools, he was responsible for daily practices, field maintenance, and fund-raising projects.

Barney, a 1992 graduate of Tennessee Wesleyan with a degree in business administration, coached the Quincy Gems in their inaugural season and won a Central Illnois Collegiate League Tournament Championship in the summer of 1996.


Housing is available in McDonald Apartments and
