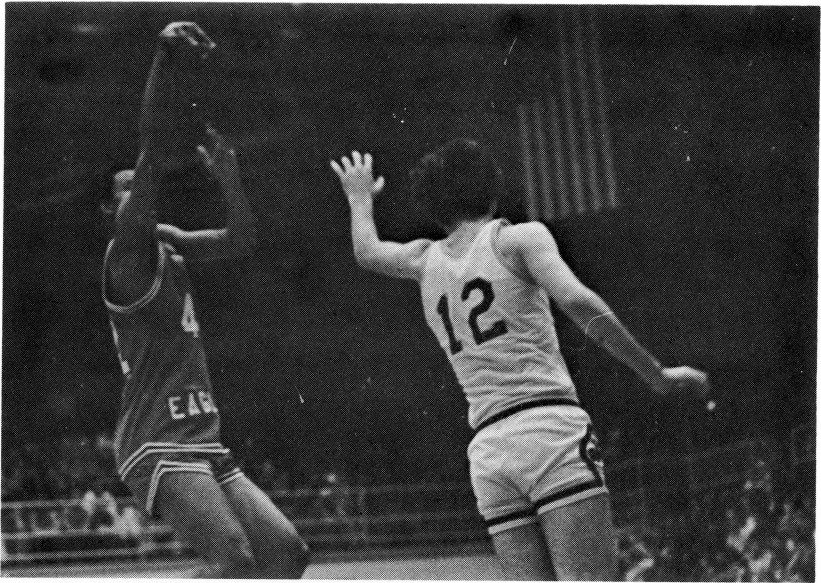

## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

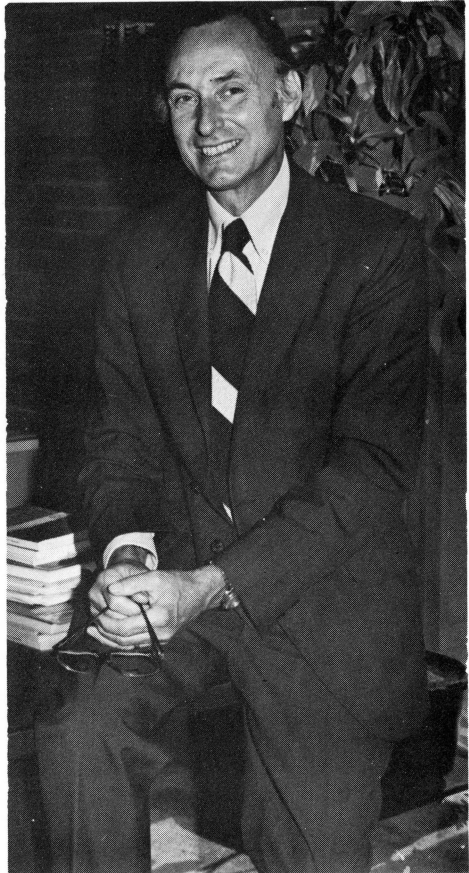
Indiana State University Evansville enters the 1978-79 season with anticipation and enthusiasm.

Two major developments are taking place in our intercollegiate athletic program — the formation of the Great Lakes Valley Athletic Conference and construction of the new Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building on our campus.

The formation of the Great Lakes Valley Conference, with a charter membership of six institutions — Ashland College, Bellarmine College, Indiana Central College, Kentucky Wesleyan College, St. Joseph's College and ISUE — is the culmination of a two-year endeavor to form an outstanding Division II conference. We are pleased to be a charter member with these other institutions which possess excellent academic programs and strong athletic traditions. The conference presents opportunities in all our intercollegiate activities.

Our long-awaited Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building is now under construction on the campus. By this time next year, we hope to see the facility being fully utilized by our students, faculty and staff for lifetime physical activity, physical education courses, intramural sports, convocations and intercollegiate contests. With the addition of spectator seating for 3,000 persons, the building will become the home court for the ISUE Screaming Eagles, and will facilitate the expansion of both our men's and women's intercollegiate sports programs.

These developments are vital achievements for the University and for the community. We sincerely appreciate the support given ISUE by the community and by its campus family in reaching these important milestones in its progress.

## **"THE CHALLENGE"**

Last season marked the finest year in the history of ISUE basketball. The Eagles racked up 19-9 credentials and received their first ever bid to the NCAA Division II Tournament.

Wayne Boultinghouse greeted four starters back to the campus this season and he faces, "the challenge", to continue our winning habits.

The ISUE Athletic Department received changes during the off-season, but there has been a definite upgrade in the program.

The Eagles will be competing in the newly formed Great Lakes Valley Conference. Charter institutions' presidents finalized plans in July for the Division II conference.

Boultinghouse also welcomed a new assistant to the staff. Former U. of Evansville star and last year an assistant at Eastern Illinois, Kae Moore joins the Eagle staff replacing Don Ramsden (Ramsden took the head coaching position at Gibson Southern (IN) High School).

Moore, possessing a rich coaching background, and will be assigned defensive duties and recruiting.

During the off-season Wayne Boultinghouse went shopping for recruits and landed four players to scholarship. Two junior college transfers and two of the area's finest stars will be attending the westside campus.

Southeastern Illinois teammates John Alexander (6-7, F-C, 15.0) and Lynnwood Cowan (6-7, F-C, 13.0) join the Eagle squad after helping their own junior college to a 25-7 ledger.

All-Southern Indiana guard and forward, Mark Block and John Brown, signed also with ISUE. Block a 6-2 sharpshooter from Jasper last season averaged 23.1 ppg. Brown, a 6-4 All-State forward from Washington averaged 19.8 ppg and 8.4 rebounds for a 27-2 squad.

The Eagles' success last season also opened the door for increased interest from prospective players.

Heading that list was Clovis McDowell (6-4, G), a transfer from Northwood Institute. Leonard Nelson (6-5, F) joined the Eagle squad from Lincoln High School in East St. Louis and looked impressive in fall pickup games with a smooth shooting touch.

Two more additional guards will be trying for spots. Marvin Welch (5-7) from Elizabethtown, KY and John Key (6-1) from Crawford County.

From preliminary indications it looks as though Boultinghouse may have assembled a finer crop of athletes.

Four of five starters returned plus three additional lettermen for Boultinghouse to blend his newcomers in with.

Cortez Collins (6-7, F, 12.9) will be the nucleus that Boultinghouse will build his team around. Last year's team MVP, Cortez is a definite All-American candidate for the tri-captain's senior season.

Joining him will be fellow senior and tri-captain Emanuel Rowser (6-6, F, 10.8). Rowser was awarded eligibility for this season in September by the NCAA, but will have to sit out the first four games.

The Eagles backcourt tandem remains in tact. Junior Dan Labhart (6-2, G, 10.5) and Sophomore Ken Mask (6-4, G, 9.0) both return. They were one-two in assists last season (95-75), but will be pushed hard with additional talent now available.

Three additional lettermen headed by Rick Kissel also return. An opening at the center position, plus hard work all summer will give Eagle fans a chance to see Rick (6-7, C, 3.1) very early this season.

George Macon (6-4, G) and Brad Bolling (6-0, G) give the Eagles added experienced depth at the guard position.

The coach has set his sights on a championship in the Great Lakes Valley Conference plus a second consecutive tournament bid and an improved record.

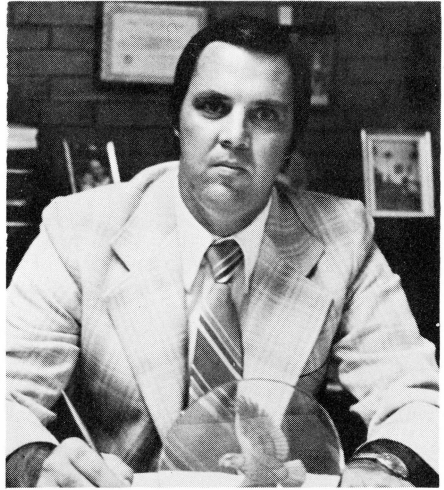
Competition in the new conference is going to be highly competitive. Four clubs (Bellarmine, Indiana Central, Kentucky Wesleyan, and St. Joseph) return at least three starters. So the conference race is going to be tough to project.

Success last season increased several aspects of the Eagle program. It has increased ticket sales, Varsity Club membership, media exposure, student participation, and overall interest from everyone.

I am looking forward to a fine season and I feel like I am part of one of the leading NCAA Division II basketball programs in the Midwest. ISUE has definitely established itself as a potential power and I feel confident they will prove themselves again this season.

## **Eagles' Coach**

### **Wayne Boultinghouse**



When someone sits down to review the athletic program at Indiana State University Evansville, you will then realize the outstanding job that athletic director and head coach Wayne Boultinghouse has done in upgrading the basketball program for the Eagles.

In 1974 when he inherited the coaching position on the Westside campus, he took over a basketball program that had never produced a winning season.

Boultinghouse's success cumulated last season when the Screaming Eagles enjoyed the finest season in the school's history. They finished with 19-9 credentials and were awarded an NCAA Division II post-season tournament berth. In post-season play they finished second in the Great Lakes Regionals Tournament.

And from preliminary indications, Boultinghouse may have assembled a finer crop of athletes for play this season. He returns four starters, plus three more lettermen, and several promising recruits and walkons.

Boultinghouse has a rich background in basketball to back up his coaching.

A native of Rockport, Indiana, he was a standout baseball and basketball player at Rockport High School.

Boultinghouse then played under the legendary Arad McCutchan at the University of Evansville. There he lettered in both baseball and basketball.

The NCAA Division II tournament is not new to Boultinghouse. He played on an NCAA championship in 1964 and was an assistant coach on U of E 1971's championship squad.

Boultinghouse has helped make the ISUE sports program a success through the help of his athletic staff (including new assistant Kae Moore) and the effectiveness of the ISUE Varsity Club.

Wayne and his wife Billie have a daughter, Alden, and expect their second child in February.

A welcome addition to the ISUE athletic staff is Kae Moore. Coach Boultinghouse feels, "Kae Moore will bring another coaching dimension to ISUE." After practice sessions began it became evident. Kae hopes to improve at least one part of Eagle's program, defense. Moore gets very excited when talk of basketball turns to defense. He feels, "There must be the team concept of five people blending together to play as one. If one person gets beat, five people get beat. Players must be able to pick up and support weaknesses of other players."

Kae joins ISUE after serving as Assistant Coach at Eastern Illinois last season. (EIU eliminated ISUE last season and went on to finish 22-10 and 3rd in the nation). Prior to that he held the Head Coaching position at Greensburg H.S. (1974-76, 22-21 rec.) Moore has also held positions at the U of E (Asst. Coach and Admissions Counselor) and Jeffersonville (IN) H.S. (Asst. Coach). A graduate of New Harmony (IN) H.S., he was also a three-year starter (1967-70) for the U of E.

Kae and his wife, Susie, reside in Evansville with son Scott and will have welcomed a new addition to the family by basketball season.

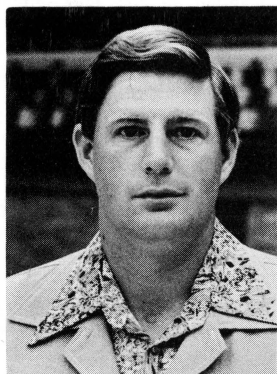
Besides directing the Women's Basketball Program, Ruth keeps busy in the fall and spring with Women's Tennis and Softball teams.

She also handles distribution of grant-in-aids to qualified student-athletes.

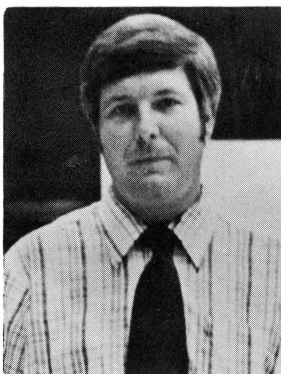
The ISUE women's sports program is governed by the rules and by-laws of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW).

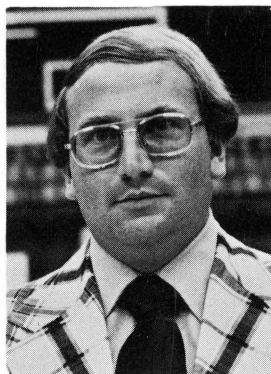
The entertainment aspect is a very important part of any athletic program, that goes unnoticed by the average fan.



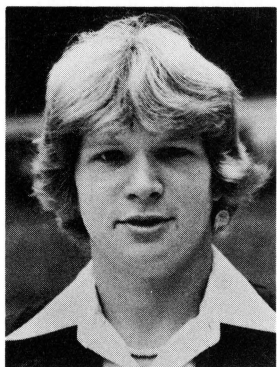

Emanuel is an added plus to the ISUE basketball team. In September he was awarded another year of eligibility by the NCAA much to the surprise of the Eagle coaching staff.

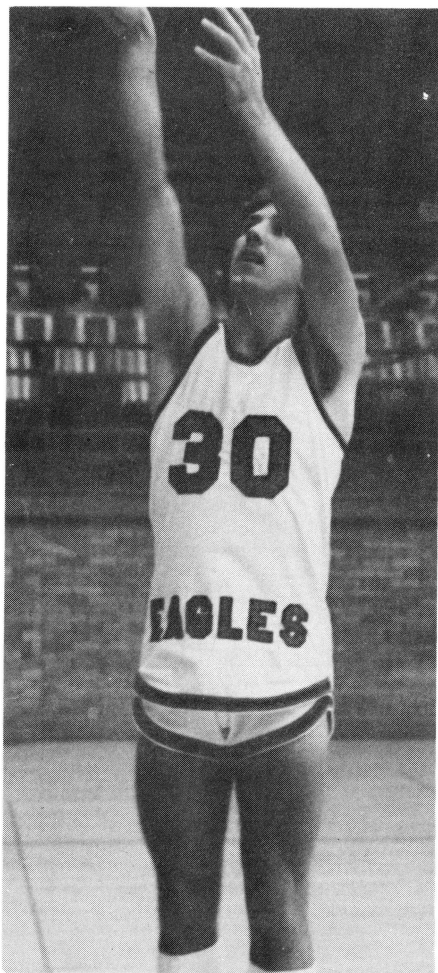

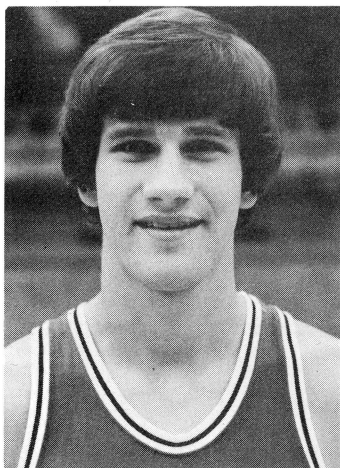
Boultinghouse describes him as, "A crafty ballhandler and good shooter. Also he is very effective at handling the ball in our fast break offense."

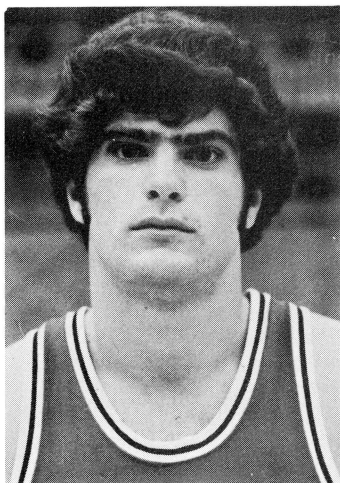
Alexander joins ISUE from Southeastern Illinois Junior College where he started as a forward-center the past two seasons.

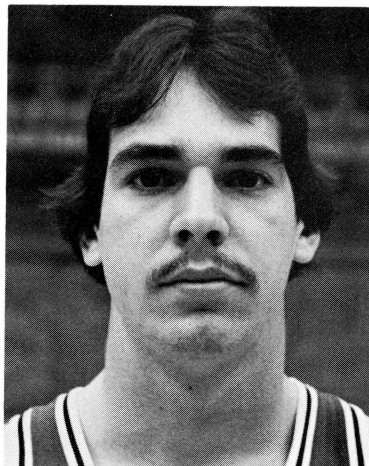

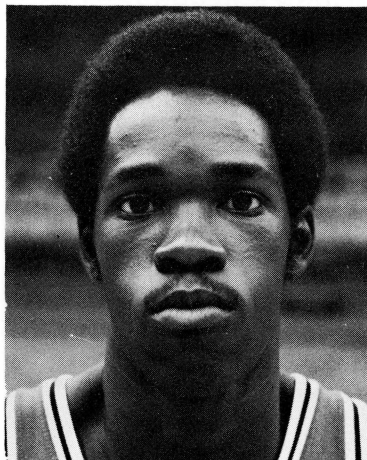

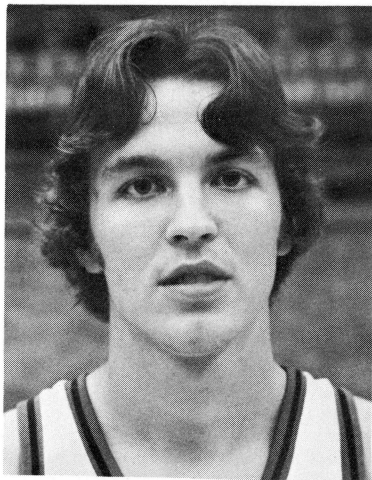
Cowan was a late signee for the Eagles enrolling in classes a couple of days late. He decided to quit his job in the coalfields and return to basketball.

Cowan, a teammate of Alexander, averaged 13 points and 9 rebounds for a squad that had five players averaging in double figures.

Boultinghouse referring to Cowan, "Much of our rebounding effectiveness will be due to the productivity of Lynnwood. He has good hands, excellent timing, and jumping ability plus extremely long arms. Should be an effective inside player for us."

# GREAT LAKES VALLEY CONFERENCE

## "A REALITY"

"We have been in pursuit of a NCAA Division II Conference affiliation for two years," said Athletic Director Wayne Boultinghouse after plans had been formalized for the formation of the Great Lakes Valley Conference.

In early July, Boultinghouse huddled with Fred Martinelli - Ashland, Jim Spalding - Bellarmine, Bill Bright - Indiana Central, Bob Jones - Kentucky Wesleyan, and Dick Scharf - St. Joseph and drew up the final constitution and by-laws that was later approved by presidents of the respective universities.

The basketball oriented conference will begin competition for championships this season with everyone competing on a home-and-home basis, but Ashland, during the roundball season.

Conference officials plan to appeal to the NCAA in January of 1979 for an automatic qualifying berth to the NCAA II post season tournament. If the NCAA approves the conference they will have a two-year probationary conference before becoming eligible.

Boultinghouse added, "It is very heartening for athletes in the conference that competition starts immediately this season." Besides basketball, championships will also be conducted in golf, baseball, and tennis. Next year championships will begin in cross-country and track. Although ISUE is active in neither, plans are being made to add cross-country in 1981.

What does the conference mean to ISUE? Boultinghouse answered, "This really gives more meaning to the athletic program. Now, more is at stake. The benefits derived are greater, plus it expands immensely the exposure of our athletic program."

Presently the main objective of the conference is to fill the position of commissioner and public relations director. Also it was in agreement that the commissioner will appoint officials for conference games as well as home games.

The league plans to expand to eight teams after the probationary period.

Indiana Central got the jump on conference foes when they capped the golf championship for the league this fall.

Indiana State University Evansville athletic director and head basketball coach Wayne Boultinghouse ended, "It's a great joy to get the conference going."

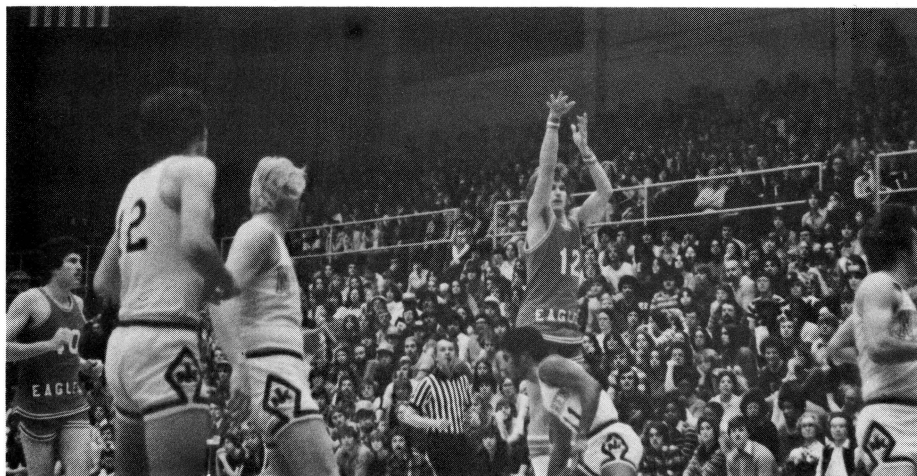
