ISUE FILM SERIES. Playing this week in the ISUE film series is The Seventh Seal directed by Ingmar Bergman and starring Gunnar Bjornstrand, Bengt Ekerot, Nils Poppe and Max von Sydow. The Seventh Seal is Bergman's stunning allegory of man's search for meaning in life. A knight, after returning home from the Crusades, plays a game of chess with Death while The Plague ravages medieval Europe. An exceptionally powerful film, it is a work of awesome scope and remarkable visual pleasures. The film will be shown in A126 at 2:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 23.

FRIEDMAN TO LECTURE. Nuclear Physicist Stanton T. Friedman will present two lectures on Monday, September 27, 1976 at ISUE. Mr. Friedman's "Flying Saucers Are Real" concept is the culmination of more than 17 years of study and investigation.

His talk covers current data from several scientific UFO studies, misconceptions about UFOs, travel to the stars, landings and reports of sightings, and the faulty arguments of "educated" non-believers. All this is said to be presented from the viewpoint of the pragmatic scientist able to speak in language everybody can understand and with considerable humor.

Mr. Friedman holds B.S. and M.S. degrees in physics from the University of Chicago. His unique professional background as a nuclear physicist includes 14 years of industrial experience with nuclear aircraft, fission and fusion rockets, and nuclear powerplants for space and terrestrial application.

Mr. Friedman states that the evidence is overwhelming that this planet is being visited by intelligently controlled vehicles from off the Earth.

Mr. Friedman's lecture is illustrated with 35mm slides of data and UFO sightings from all over the world. It is followed by an open question and answer session.

The lectures will be held in the Pyramid Lounge at 11:00 a.m. and in Room A126 at 2:00 p.m. The lectures are sponsored by the Student Union Board.
