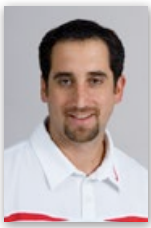

EVANSVILLE, Indiana **...A CITY with urban attractions and hometown friendliness**

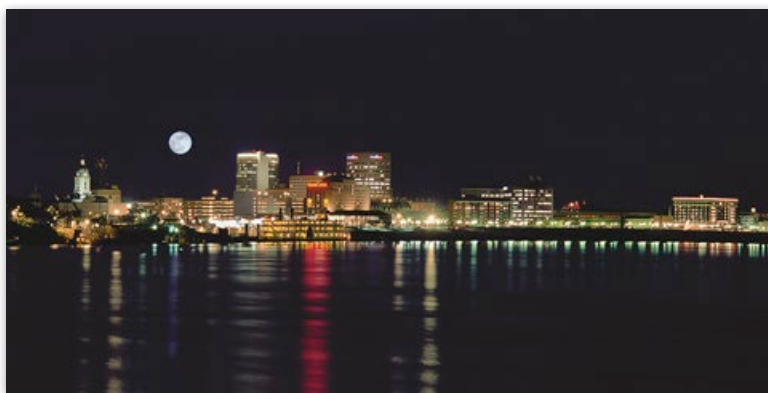

Physical Activities Center

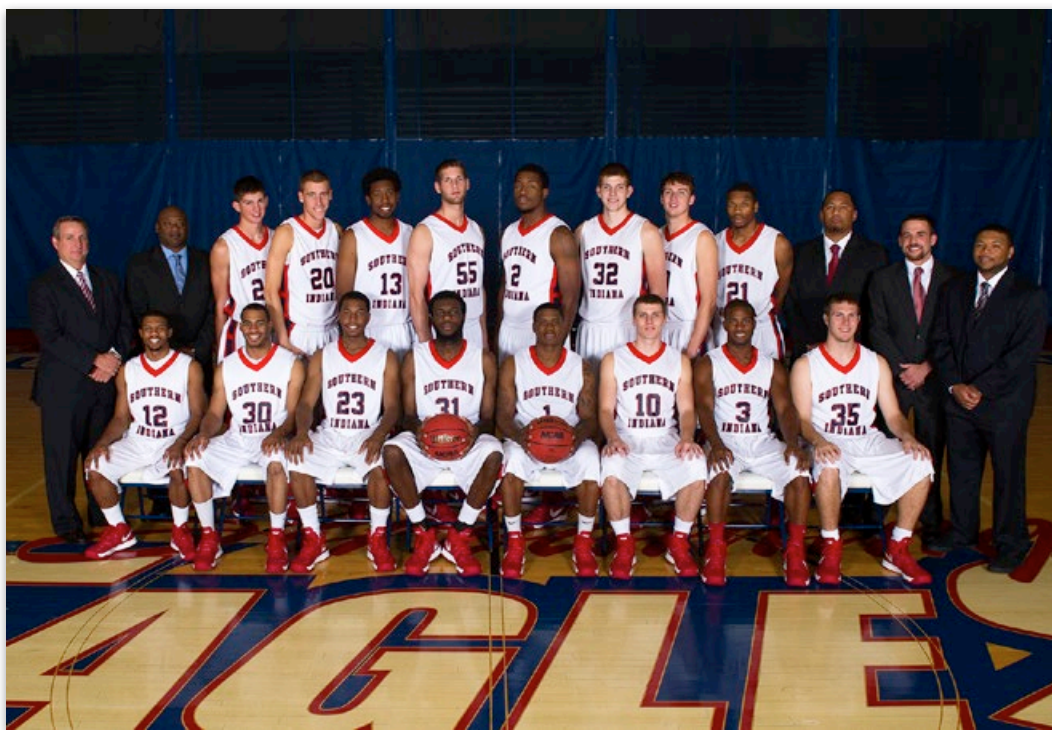
The Physical Activities Center (PAC) has been the home of the Screaming Eagles for the past 32 years. Opened in 1980, the PAC accommodates physical education classes, intramural activities, and is the arena for the USI basketball and volleyball teams.

Games of regional and national interest have been played on the center court of the PAC during the past 19 years. USI has hosted the 1993, 1994, and 1996 men's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; the 2009 men's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 women's GLVC Tournament; the 1998 and 2001 women's NCAA II Great Lakes Regionals; and the 2000 and 2004 GLVC Volleyball Tournaments.

A true home court, the USI women's basketball team has a 214-79 home record since 1993-94, a .730 winning percentage.

With padded chairback seats, back-supported bleacher seats, and a top-of-the line scoreboard and video board, the Physical Activities Center is one of the top Division II athletic venues in the region.

The University of Southern Indiana men's basketball team enters the season as the 2012 defending Great Lakes Valley Conference champion and wants to end the year as the 2013 national champions.

To reach this lofty goal, USI fourth-year Head Coach **Rodney Watson** has to mesh nine returning players and seven newcomers. The Eagles have been flying high since the arrival of Watson and his staff three seasons ago, winning 72 of their 88 games (an .818 winning percentage). USI also has advanced to the NCAA Division II Tournament the last two years.

The key to last year's 24 victories was defense, with the Eagles holding their opponents to a school-record 59.5 points per game. USI has become miserly the last three seasons, allowing only 63.5 points per contest under Watson's direction.

Leading the Eagles' defensive wall is senior guard **Kenyon Smith**, who was named to the inaugural GLVC All-Defensive team. Smith led USI with 1.7 steals and 6.6 rebounds per game, while pulling down a team-high 121 defensive rebounds.

With a strong defense returning, USI's offense

is looking for new spark in 2012-13. The Eagles lost 39.2 percent of their offense with the graduation of Brandon Hogg and Isaac McClure. Hogg averaged a team-high 16.5 points per game, while McClure posted 14.4 points per contest.

The foundation of the 2012-13 offense can be found in the return of junior guard **Lawrence Thomas**, USI's top returning scorer with 9.5 points per game. Thomas, who averaged a team-best 3.8 assists per outing last year, came out of his offensive shell during the GLVC Tournament, averaging 11 points against three top-25 teams.

Smith follows Thomas among the returners with 7.0 points per game, while junior forward **Taylor Wischmeier** rounds out the returning starters with 6.1 points and 4.3 rebounds per contest.

Off the bench, the Eagles return four solid performers. Sophomore guard/forward **Austin Davis** posted 4.9 points and grabbed 2.7 rebounds per game, while senior guards **Melvyn Little** and **Travis Jones** dropped in 4.7 points and 3.6 points per appearance, respectively. Junior guard **Ben Jones** rounds out the returning scorers with 3.1 points per contest.

In addition to the seven players off of last year's roster, USI activates a pair of redshirts

in freshman guard **Evan Brinkmeyer** and freshman forward **Zach Watson**.

Brinkmeyer, who attends USI on a Presidential Scholarship, was a first-team *Evansville Courier & Press* All-Metro performer after averaging 21.8 points per contest as a senior at Reitz High School in 2010-11. He scored 501 points during his final season at RHS, good enough for second in the Panther record book behind former RHS and USI standout Cris Brunson. Brinkmeyer also finished fifth on the RHS all-time scoring list with 1,099 points.

Watson joined his father at USI after lettering in three sports (basketball, cross country, and track) at Carterville High School in Illinois. A dual-sport student-athlete at USI, Watson also earned second-team All-GLVC honors in track and field last spring as he finished second in the high jump at the GLVC Outdoor Championships.

Seven new faces hope to play major roles for USI in 2012-13.

In the frontcourt, the Eagles add junior guard **DeAndre McCamey**, who averaged 8.5 points, 4.8 rebounds, and 3.2 assists per game in 33 appearances for South Suburban College in 2011-12. McCamey started his collegiate career

Kenyon Smith, a GLVC All-Defensive Team honoree a year ago, averaged 7.0 points and a team-high 6.6 rebounds per game, while Little and Jones averaged 4.7 and 3.6 points per contest, respectively, last season.

at Kaskaskia College, posting 9.2 points, 3.4 rebounds, and 3.1 assists in 31 games during 2010-11.

The balance of the newcomers will appear in the backcourt.

A 2012 NJCAA All-American, junior forward **Orlando Rutledge** comes to USI after posting 16.6 points, 6.8 rebounds, and 1.3 steals per game for Lake Land Community College in 2011-12. He also averaged 12.1 points and 4.7 rebounds during his initial season at Lake Land.

Junior forward **Aaron Nelson** joins the Eagles after seasons at Highland Community College and Southwestern Illinois College. He produced 10.2 points and 6.6 rebounds per game last year for HCC, while starting his collegiate career with 11.4 points and 6.1 rebounds per contest at SWIC in 2010-11.

Junior forward **Manny Ogunfolu** is from Frederick Community College, where he was a 2012 first-team All-Region performer after averaging 17.0 points and 10.6 rebounds. Ogunfolu also was named second-team All-Region in 2011.

USI also has added junior transfer forward **Chuck Jones** and freshman forward **Nick Hutcherson**. Hutcherson was a three-time Putnam County Player of the Year and four-time WCC All-Conference honoree at Greencastle High School, where he scored 1,467 career points and grabbed 1,060 career rebounds during his high school career. He finished his prep career as the 10th Indiana

high school player to reach 1,000 career points and rebounds.

Filling the middle for USI is senior forward/center **Keith DeWitt**, who transfers to USI from the University of Southern Mississippi after playing in two games, scoring two points, and grabbing two rebounds in 2011-12.

DeWitt was rated as the number two player by JucoJunction.com and earned first-team All-Panhandle Conference after helping Chipola College to a 23-4 mark in 2010-11.

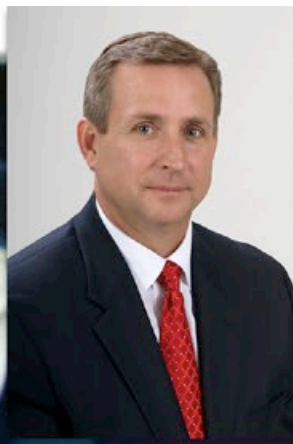


Junior forward **Taylor Wischmeier** averaged 6.1 points and 4.3 rebounds per contest as a sophomore in 2011-12.

The Eagles tip-off the 2012-13 campaign with an exhibition game against crosstown rival University of Evansville before opening a regular season calendar that includes 15 home games at the Physical Activities Center.

The schedule also includes a home-and-home series with NCAA Division II regional champion and GLVC rival Bellarmine University, along with the home-and-home series with the rest of the GLVC East Division—Kentucky Wesleyan College, the University of Indianapolis, McKendree University, Saint Joseph's College, Lewis University, and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

USI's home slate also includes the Bill Joergens Memorial Classic, November 23-24, and a meeting with last year's GLVC West Division champion, the University of Missouri-St. Louis.

MEET COACH WATSON

Rodney Watson, the ninth head coach for USI men's basketball, has had the Screaming Eagles soaring during his three seasons. Watson is 72-16 (.818) overall during his three years, including a 41-13 (.759) GLVC record.

In his third season, Watson directed USI to the 2012 GLVC Tournament championship. Watson's Eagles, who finished the 2011-12 season 24-7 overall and 12-6 in the GLVC, defeated three straight nationally ranked teams, including the number one team in the nation, to win the third GLVC Tournament title in the history of the program.

The 2010-11 season saw Watson lead the Eagles to a 24-6 overall mark and a second-place finish in the GLVC East Division with a 14-4 performance. USI also placed second in the GLVC Tournament and returned to the NCAA Division II Tournament under Watson's guidance.

Watson, the 2010 GLVC Coach of the Year led USI to a 24-3 overall mark and ninth-place finish in the national poll during his first season. The Eagles set a school-record with 23-straight wins and were ranked as high as second in the national rankings.

The 24 wins in 2009-10 were the most by a first-year USI head coach. The 2009-10 squad also featured *Basketball Times* Division II Player of the Year and All-American Jamar Smith.

Watson took the helm of the Eagles after 21 seasons at Southern Illinois University. He was the associate head coach during his last two seasons after spending 19 years as an assistant coach under head coaches Rich Herrin, Bruce Weber, Matt Painter, and Chris Lowery.



During Watson's tenure at SIU, the Salukis won 11 Missouri Valley Conference championships and qualified for nine NCAA Tournaments as well as six NITs. SIU also compiled a 430-237 record, a .645 winning percentage, and was ranked in the top 15, nationally, in scoring defense four times in Watson's last five seasons.

Watson helped direct five Salukis to MVC Player of the Year honors; four to Newcomer of the Year awards; five to Freshman of the Year accolades; and nine to Defensive Player of the Year honors. The Salukis had 30 players earn All-MVC honors (18 first team and 12 second) during Watson's 21 seasons.

The Salukis' success was not limited to the basketball court, with 23 of the last 24 seniors earning bachelor degrees since 2002. SIU had the Prairie Farms Student Athlete of the Year for men's basketball three times since the award was created in 2002.

A native of Paris, Illinois, Watson started his coaching career at Coulterville High School, where he guided the Eagles to the program's first regional championship. He moved to Madison High School in 1984 and led the Trojans to a regional and sectional championship, advancing to the Illinois Elite Eight.

Success at the high school level was a springboard to the college ranks, beginning with a two-year stretch in 1986 at the University of Nebraska-Omaha. He moved to SIU in 1988, beginning his 21-year association with the Salukis.

A 1982 graduate of Eastern Illinois University with a bachelor's degree in physical education, Watson earned a master's degree in guidance counseling from Nebraska-Omaha.

Watson and his wife Carol have four children, Ashley, Zachary, and twins, Olivia and Blake.

During the last 31 years, the University of Southern Indiana men's basketball program has become a force in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, the Great Lakes Region, and at the national level.

Since the beginning of the GLVC in 1978, the Screaming Eagles have become one of the premier teams in the league, winning 12 regular-season titles in the GLVC. USI's teams also have featured four GLVC Coaches of the Year and six conference Players of the Year.

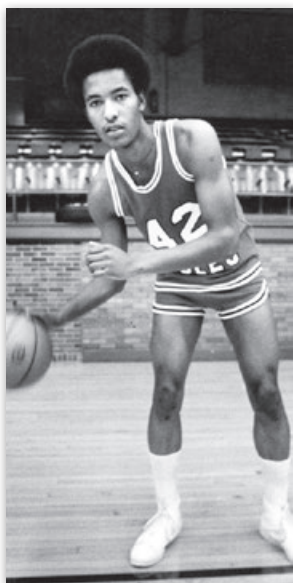
Starting with the 1992-93 team, the Eagles have made their mark on the Great Lakes Region and the NCAA Division II. USI has won 20 or more games 16 times in the last 18 years.

The Eagles stepped into the national spotlight in 1993-94 when they made their first trip to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight and the NCAA Division II Championship game.

The loss in the 1994 championship game propelled USI back into the NCAA Division II Championship game in 1995, and on to its first-ever national championship.

USI has been ranked number one nationally at one point during the season in eight of the last 16 years. In 10 of the last 18 years, USI has advanced to the NCAA Division II Sweet 16.

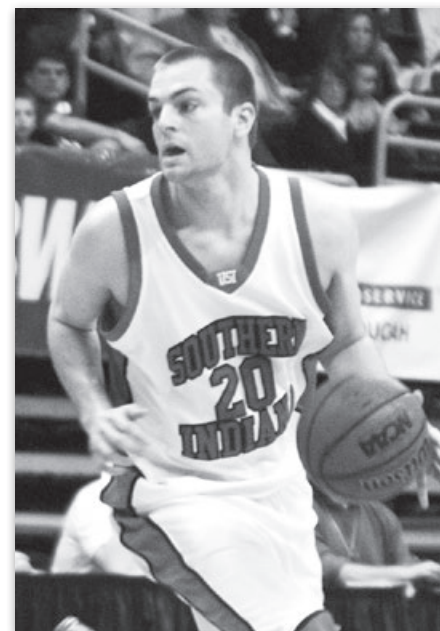
