# 1999 USI Baseball Outlook

The 1999 definition for *offensive punch* can best be illustrated by the University of Southern Indiana baseball team.

The Screaming Eagles, who were 26-19 overall and 9-13 Great Lakes Valley Conference last year, return one of the best offenses in the conference and the North Central Region. The squad, which had a team batting average of .349 and averaged 8.5 runs a game, returns 12 position players which include three .400 hitters and a combined 288 RBIs.

Head Coach Mike Goedde will be at the helm of the Eagles for his sixth season. He has led USI to 148-99 record in five years with the University. Three .400 hitters in the middle of the line-up will lead the way for Goedde in 1999.

Preseason All-American and senior outfielder Jason Folz (Mt. Vernon, Indiana), one of the top hitters in the GLVC the past two seasons, also has been one of the Eagles' top hitters, batting .400 in 1997 and a team-high .455 in 1998. Folz, an All-GLVC and All-Region performer, also was second with 44 RBIs and third with 14 doubles on the team.

While Folz has been Mr. Consistency the last two seasons, senior third baseman **Jeremy Jones** (Evansville, Indiana) had a career season in 1998, hitting .431 and 38 RBIs. Jones, who has improved offensively each season, also tied the team lead with 16 doubles.

Emerging as one of USI's top hitters in just his second season is junior outfielder **Mike Peerman** (Evansville, Indiana). As a sophomore, Peerman was third on the team with a .417 average and had a team-high 51 RBIs and tied Jones for the team lead with 16 doubles. The All-GLVC performer also was second on the team in home runs with five.

Augmenting this hot hitting trio in the line-up, Coach Goedde has added junior designated hitter **Dustin Greenfield** (Evansville, Indiana), who hit .458 at John A. Logan Junior College. Greenfield, a junior college All-American who drove in 48 runs and hit 12 home runs in 38 games for John A. Logan, can add to USI's power.

Along with Greenfield, junior infielder Scott Braun (Fishers, Indiana) joins the squad. Braun, who played for Northwest Shoals Junior College in Muscle Shoals, Alabama, hit .371 with 39 RBIs and 13 doubles in 46 games. The addition of Braun to the line-up allows Coach Goedde to move Peerman and his strong arm to the outfield.

In addition to his string of .400 hitters, Goedde returns nine position players four of whom four hit over .300.

Competing for the final outfield spot will be senior **Josh Heldt** (Evansville, Indiana). Heldt, who led off for the Eagles last year, had a .314 batting average and an on-base percentage of .422. He also had a team high 14 stolen bases.

Along with Heldt, senior outfielder **Todd Chase** will be working to latch onto the final starting slot. Chase, who became a starter when former All-GLVC performer Jason Engelbrecht went down with an injury, had his best season as an Eagle, starting 42 of 44 games and hitting .346 with 26 RBIs.

In the infield, USI returns its ironman, senior shortstop **Jeremy Cook** (Evansville, Indiana). Cook, who has played in 131 games of a possible 141 in four seasons, started 44 of 45 games as a junior and hit .296 with 29 RBIs and a team-high six home runs.

There will be a battle for the second base slot when practice starts in the spring between senior infielder **Drew Bailey** (Newburgh, Indiana) and junior infielder **Keith Kirkland** (Evansville, Indiana). Bailey, who was plagued by injuries and hit .262 as a junior, hopes to post the numbers he produced as a sophomore when he hit .321 with a .398 on-base percentage. Kirkland, who filled in for Bailey when he was injured, had a career high .320 batting average and was tied for third on the team with four home runs.

Returning to infield duties after spending last year as a relief pitcher will be sophomore infielder **Eric Morris** (Hawesville, Kentucky). Morris, who was 1-1 in eight appearances, also hit .220 with six RBIs in 23 games.

Behind the plate the Eagles come back with three solid back stops. Senior catcher **Corey Steele** (Evansville, Indiana) leads the way for the Eagles after a solid 1998 season. He played in 38 games, started 33, and hit .322 with 18 RBIs and 11 doubles.

Steele will be backed-up by sophomores Andy Cook (Evansville, Indiana) and Jon Salisbury (Berne, Indiana).

While the Eagles are set offensively and defensively, the pitching question mark remains for 1999. USI will be looking to significantly reduce the team ERA of 1998 and to become more consistent on the mound.

Coach Goedde's pitching staff ended 1998 on a high note with only a 2.61 ERA in the final four games.

Coming away with two wins in the final four games is senior right-hander **Rudy Boals** (Howe, Indiana). Boals led the Eagles in 1998 with an 8-5 record and 82.2 innings pitched. He also had the team's only shutout and a teamhigh 75 strikeouts.

Following Boals, the Eagles have four junior pitchers who hope to regain the form they showed at the end of 1997. Right-hander **Steve Reed** (Clarksville, Indiana), who was redshirted last year with arm problems, was USI's top pitcher in 1997 with a 6-4 overall record in 75.7 innings pitched.

Left-handed senior **Ryan Martin** (Evansville, Indiana), junior **Brad Miller** (New Haven, Indiana), and right-hander **Matt Renn** (Floyds Knobs, Indiana) showed great promise in 1997 when they combined for a 7-3 record, but fell to 8-6 in 1998.

Additional help returning in the bullpen will be sophomore left-handers **Brad Hemmelgarn** (Richmond, Indiana) and **Steve Jones** (Indianapolis, Indiana). They combined for a 4-3 record in 26 appearandces as a duo.

Goedde will be leaning heavily upon three junior college transfers to fill the gaps on the mound.

Predicted to move into the number two and three starter slots are junior right-handers **Greg Keown** (Evansville, Indiana) and **Brian Kriner** (Indianapolis, Indiana). Keown transferred from Southeastern Community College (Illinois) where he was 5-0 with a 3.10 ERA and four saves, while Kriner transferred from Danville Community College and was 6-4 with a 3.15 ERA.

In the bullpen, right-hander **Rob Bowers** (Crawfordsville, Indiana) will start the year as USI's top reliever. Bowers, a transfer from Vincennes University, was 1-1 with nine saves in 1998. He finished his two-year career at VU with the single season and career record for saves.

In addition to the transfers, Goedde has added depth the pitching staff with nine freshmen.

The Eagles will have to be ready to compete with the first pitch. USI will play seven teams -18 games - in the preseason top 30, four from the GLVC.

The squad also will play NCAA Division I teams Austin Peay State University, Murray State University, and the University of Tennessee-Martin.

# Head Coach Mike Goedde

University of Southern Indiana Head Coach Mike Goedde will be directing the Screaming Eagles baseball campaign for a sixth season in 1999. During Goedde's tenure as coach, he has a 146-99 overall record; 60-49 in the Great Lakes Valley Conference.

In 1998, Goedde completed his fifth season with a 26-19 overall record, 9-13 GLVC. His team was one of the most offensive mined in USI history, setting the school record for batting average for the second straight season and boasting three .400 hitters

During the 1997 campaign, Goedde steered the Eagles to a 30-16 overall record and a 16-9 conference mark, missing the league divisional playoffs by a half game. At the conclusion of the season, he had led the Eagles to the 30-win mark for the second time in six seasons, and back into the regional races.

He successfully led the 1996 team to a 27-22 overall, 14-12 in the GLVC, while leading the 1995 team to a 29-23 record and a 10-8 GLVC record, just missing the GLVC Tournament each year.

In his first season, Goedde led the Eagles to a 36-19 record and berths in the Great Lakes Valley Conference and NCAA Division II Central Region tournaments.

Prior to coming to USI, Goedde was an assistant coach at the University of Evansville (UE) under Head Coach Jim Brownlee from 1986-1988 and 1990-1993.

While Goedde was at UE, the baseball team was the Midwestern Collegiate Conference champion in 1988 and 1990. In 1988, the pitching staff had the second best ERA in the country with a 2.99. This staff featured major league All-Star Andy Benes, who plays professionally in Arizona Diamondbacks.

In professional baseball, Goedde was signed as a pitcher in the fourth round of the 1983 draft by the Cincinnati Reds and spent three seasons in their farm system (1983-1985). In 1989, Goedde was a pitching instructor with the Cincinnati Reds organization in the Pioneer League at Billings, Mont.

The Evansville native graduated from UE with a degree in sports administration, and from Mater Dei High School.

In addition to his duties as baseball coach, Goedde also is a physical education instructor at USI.

# **Assistant Coach Chris Barney**

Assistant Coach Chris Barney will begin his sixth season at USI as the hitting instructor and will work with the infielders and outfielders.

Barney joined Goedde's staff in 1993-94 after spending the 1992-93 year at Tusculum College in Greenville, TN. Prior to working at Tusculum, Barney spent three-and-a-half years (1989-92) with Tennessee Wesleyan College as an assistant coach. At both schools, he was responsible for daily practices, field maintenance, and fund raising projects.

Barney, a 1992 graduate of Tennessee Wesleyan with a degree in business administration, coached the Quincy Gems in their inaugural season and won a Central Illinois Collegiate League Tournament Championship in the summer of 1996.
