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ORIENTATION STARTS NEXT WEEK. The orientation meeting for new faculty members will be held at 8:30 a.m. Tuesday, August 20, in FWA 135, while student orientation sessions will run most of next week on the theme, "There's a Bright New Star in the Southern Sky . . . USI."

Student orientation will open at 8 a.m. Monday, August 19, in the Physical Activities Center, when a campus welcome and overview of 1985-86 programs will be presented. There also will be campus tours (10 a.m. to 12 noon), a picnic lunch on the Mall, and a Student Activities Fair (12:45 to 2 p.m.) On Tuesday, there will be special entertainment (10:30 to 11:30 a.m. at the PAC), a combined faculty-AMIGO meeting at 11:30, and another picnic lunch on the Mall. Specialized meetings will take up afternoon hours and at 6 p.m., a program on "If you want to look at Sororities" will be held in the UC Dining Center. Student registration will occur on Wednesday and Thursday. An all-campus dance will be held at 9 p.m. under the Bridge, winding up the week's orientation activities. Campus sororities also have activities planned most of the week, however, and sororities and fraternities will close the week with special parties.

AMIGOS (Ask Me I Give Orientation) will be in charge of most orientation activities, working under the supervision of a steering committee made up of **Mr. Timothy Buecher**, admissions director, **Mrs. Sandy Danks**, admissions counselor, **Mr. Robert Harper**, director of counseling, and **Mr. Barry Schonberger**, director of student activities. The committee is sponsoring a special program for families of incoming students on Sunday, August 18, that will include a buffet brunch and welcoming program at the PAC at 1 p.m., campus tours at 2 p.m., and a reception at the University Home at 2:30.
