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**FACULTY PARTICIPATE IN CAREER EXPO.** Several individuals from the University faculty will participate in a career exposition display at Eastland Mall August 11-12. Marilyn Walters, career placement director, will coordinate the two-day event. Faculty helping are professors Ken Creech, communications; Eric Sprouls and Larry Goss, engineering technology; Larry Arp, business; and Gordon Kelley, allied health.

The purpose of the exposition is to familiarize the public with career-oriented academic programs.

**McNAUGHTON RECEIVES FELLOWSHIP.** John McNaughton, professor of art, is one of ten Indiana artists chosen to receive a \$3000 Master Fellowship Grant from the Indiana Arts Commission. A special selection committee of 20 Indiana arts administrators and working artists reviewed 281 applications before choosing ten professional artists for master fellowships and six emerging artists for associate fellowships. This was the first year for this pilot program which awarded a total of \$36,000 directly to Indiana artists in all arts disciplines.
