

1994-95 Eagles Basketball Outlook

EAGLES ASPIRE TO MAINTAIN NATIONAL PROMINENCE IN 1994-95

In 1994 the University of Southern Indiana Screaming Eagles had the most successful season in their history.

The Eagles, who had a school record five Academic All-Great Lakes Valley Conference players, captured the University's first GLVC championship since 1985. The team marched to its first-ever NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional championship and advanced to the Elite Eight, playing in the national championship game, and coming within six points of capturing the title, losing to California State University-Bakersfield, who won 92-86.

In 1994-95 the USI men's basketball team, who is ranked third in *Dick Vitale's College Basketball*, fourth in *College Sports*, and fifth in the *Sporting News College Basketball Yearbook*, will try to repeat as conference champions and maintain its position as one of the finest programs in the country. With the graduation of five

seniors, including two All-Americans, the task will be challenging.

However, the bench is

far from bare. The Eagles return first team preseason All-American Stan Gouard, a 6-5 junior forward. Gouard is coming off a great first season with the Eagles, averaging 19.1 ppg and 7.7 rpg. He was named honorable mention All-American, the Most Outstanding Player of the

Senior guard Brian Huebner hopes to lead the Eagles back to the Elite Eight in 1994-95.

NCAA II Elite Eight, NCAA II Great

Lakes Regional All-Tournament team, second team All-Great Lakes Region, GLVC Newcomer-of-the-Year, and first team All-GLVC. Gouard nicknamed "Superman Stan" by the USI fans, had his best game of the season in the NCAA II championship game, scoring 30 points and grabbing nine rebounds versus CSUB.

Senior guard Brian Huebner, a preseason All-American candidate, joins Gouard in his second season with the Eagles. The 6-3 Evansville native averaged 11.2 ppg and 2.2 rpg and set a USI single season record for three-point field goal percentage, hitting 55.8 percent (29-52).

A true competitor, Huebner badly sprained an ankle in the final game of the regular season and was not 100 percent in the postseason games. A healthy Huebner might have brought the national championship to USI.

In 1994-95, Huebner will be asked to step up his scoring and provide the senior leadership essential to another championship season.

Also returning is **6-8 junior forward Neil Coyle**. Coyle, one of the best inside defenders ever to play for USI, became a starter in the NCAA II Tournament, beginning with the regional championship game. Playing his first full season without injury, Coyle averaged 6.3 ppg and 3.6 rpg.

Returning to challenge for the remaining guard position are **5-9** senior Ronnie Combs and **6-2** sophomores Shawn Aldridge and Marc Hostetter. Combs, who came off the bench at the point position, averaged 2.4 ppg and 1.3 assists in 28 games. Hostetter, who performed well in the NCAA II Tournament, played in 27 games as a freshman, averaging 1.2 ppg and 1.1 assists. Aldridge, an exciting penetrator from the guard position, sat out 1993-94 due to an injury in the preseason. In 1992-93, he averaged 5.1 ppg and 2.1 rpg as a freshman.

Juniors Scott Boyden, a 6-5 forward, and Scott Taylor, a 6-4 forward, are back to contribute in the frontcourt. Boyden came on at the end of the season, getting into the regular rotation and becoming a force around the basket and on the boards, averaging 3.5 ppg and 2.6 rpg. Taylor, one of the most athletic players on the team, averaged 5.8 ppg and 2.5 rpg.

The key for the Eagles in 1994-95 is to replace the offensive firepower and experience of the graduating seniors.

USI will miss two-time All-American forward/center Chris Bowles, who averaged 19.5 ppg and 9.7 rpg and 1993-94 All-American guard Tyrone Tate, who averaged 15.8 ppg and set an NCAA II Tournament record with 49 assists.

The Eagles also lost the three-point firepower of forwards Jeff Doyle and Todd Jones and guard Craig Martin. With Bowles and Tate, the five seniors had 75 percent of all three-point field goals made by the Eagles last season.

The Eagles expect a boost from eight newcomers to the squad. Competing for the guard position are senior Cortez Barnes,

6-7, juniors Kevin Caldwell, 5-10, Larry Eady, 6-1, and freshman Tim Tooley, 6-6.

Eady transferred to USI from Brown Mackie Junior College in Salina, Kan. He was All-District and BMJC's Most Valuable Player last season.

Caldwell, a transfer from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, has the talent to play at the point or to back up Huebner at the off-guard position.

Two of the most versatile players on the team may be Barnes and Tooley, who are skilled enough to play guard, and big enough to play forward.

Barnes, a transfer from the University of Tennessee, averaged 8.0 ppg, 3.9 rpg, and hit 45 three-point field goals in 28 games last year. Tooley played both positions this summer for the Indiana AAU national championship squad.

In the frontcourt the Eagles have four new players to fill the spots vacated by the three seniors.

At forward, the Eagles will be looking for big things from **6-8 junior Chad Gilbert**, a transfer from Indiana State University who sat out 1993-94.

Gilbert, in 1992-93 with the Sycamores, averaged 7.5 ppg and 4.7 rpg in 28 games.

Also joining the team at the forward position are **freshmen Ryan Greenwell**, **a 6-5** product from Union County High School in Kentucky, and **Ken Troutman**, **a 6-5** Presidential Scholar from Boonville High School.

With big shoes to fill at center, USI has a transfer player with size. **Senior Robert Carr**, who sat out last season, is a transfer from Indiana State. The 6-9 player averaged 1.0 ppg and 1.1 rpg in 1992-93.

From start to finish in 1994-95, the Eagles must be at their best to repeat their success of last season. They start the season with a tough non-conference schedule, which includes the Kenny Kent Toyota National Shootout, December 2-3, and the High Desert Classic in Las Vegas, Nev., December 20-21.

The "National Shootout" features NCAA II Tournament teams USI, University of Tampa, and Carson Newman College. The Eagles will be looking to reclaim the championship after losing a tough final to Missouri Southern State College a year ago.

The High Desert Classic will have USI up against Cameron University on the first day of competition and Washburn University on the second. In 1993-94, Washburn was an Elite Eight and Final Four participant.

In the middle of the non-conference schedule, USI will start GLVC action with Northern Kentucky University on December 10. The conference action, which is always some of the toughest in the nation, will include NCAA II tournament teams Kentucky Wesleyan College and St. Joseph's College.

USI Men's Coaching Staff

Bruce PEARL **USI Head Coach**

In two seasons Bruce Pearl has brought the USI men's basketball program into the NCAA Division II's elite.

Last year Pearl directed the Eagles to their best season in school history (28-4). The Eagles earned a Great Lakes Valley Conference championship (16-2), a Great Lakes Regional championship, and played as a finalist in the NCAA II championship game. Pearl has become only the second coach in GLVC history to be named conference Coach-of-the-Year in two straight seasons, and has reached 50 wins faster than any coach in USI history (50-11 overall).

In his initial season, Pearl, who at 34 is considered by many to be one of the brightest young coaches in the nation, led the Screaming Eagles to a 22-7 record, a second-place finish in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, a berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament, and received his first GLVC Coach-ofthe-Year award in 1993.

National rankings are issued weekly from the start of the season in November through its March conclusion. During Pearl's two-year tenure, the Eagles have held first place in the GLVC for 35 of 36 weeks and achieved national ranking for 24 weeks.

Pearl, who also serves as coordinator of athletic development at USI, has spurred unparalleled growth in the Varsity Club. This fan support, along with the creation of the Courtside Club, the student booster organization, has breathed new life into USI basketball enthusiasm.

Prior to coming to USI, Pearl was an assistant coach at the University of Iowa, where he was responsible for implementing full-court pressure defensive tactics. He was also responsible for the performance of Iowa's inside players, particularly the offensive and defensive post players. Coach Pearl taught many current pro basketball players, including Brad Lohaus (Milwaukee Bucks), Acie Earl (Boston Celtics), B.J. Armstrong (Chicago Bulls), Kevin Gamble (Boston Celtics), and Matt Bullard (Houston Rockets).

During Pearl's six-year stay at Iowa, the Hawkeyes received five tournament berths, one final eight appearance (1987), one final 16 appearance (1988), and placed eight players in the National Basketball Association. While at Iowa, Pearl helped head coach Dr. Tom Davis to a 129-63 record. For his efforts, Pearl was recognized in 1988 as one of the top Division I assistants in the country by Basketball Weekly.

In leaving Iowa Pearl ended 14 years as an assistant and right-hand man to Dr. Davis. Prior to joining Davis at Iowa, Pearl was Davis' assistant coach (1982-83) and an associate head coach (1983-86) at Stanford University. As an undergraduate, Pearl was Davis' administrative assistant at Boston College (1978-82).

Pearl received his bachelor's degree in business administration from Boston College in 1982, graduating cum laude. He is working toward a master's degree at lowa.

Pearl and his wife Kim have two daughters, Jacqui and Leah, and a son, Steven.

Rick HERDES

Assistant Coach

Rick Herdes enters his third season at USI as Coach Pearl's top assistant coach. Herdes is considered to be one of the best recruiters in Division II basketball, and this year's recruits are no exception. He also directs scouting and the highly successful Southern Indiana Summer Basketball Camps.

Herdes came to USI from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, where he was an assistant from 1986 to 1992. While at SIUE, Herdes helped Head Coach Larry Graham lead the Cougars to a 127-56 record and three NCAA tournament appearances. He was responsible for coordinating on- and off-campus recruiting. He also was academic advisor to the basketball team and director of summer camps and fund-raising events.

In 1991 and 1992 at SIUE, he was the head coach for the Illinois Prairie State Games, Southern Open Men's Division. His 1992 team received the silver medal. Prior to working at SIUE, Herdes was an assistant basketball coach and physical education instructor at Lawrenceville (III.) High School, where he worked for current Indiana University assistant coach Ron Felling. LHS was the Illinois Class A State Champion in 1982 and 1983 and had a 68-game winning streak.

Herdes graduated from Graceland College in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in education. He is completing a graduate program in secondary education at USI.

As a player, Herdes led Lincoln Trail College to a ninth-place finish in the national tournament and helped lead Graceland to its first-ever appearance in the NAIA Tournament.

Herdes and his wife, Lisa, have a daughter, Taylor.

Pearl on Heardes: "I am very fortunate to have Rick Herdes as my top assistant. He came to USI with a recommendation from Bob Knight and a wealth of experience in Division II. He is loyal, hard working, and the kind of person I want at my side.

"Rick was responsible for my quick transition to Division II basketball. His contacts in this region made him a highly effective recruiter and he is one of the best camp directors with whom I have ever worked. He is preparing himself to be a tremendous head coach."

Ron Felling, Assistant Basketball Coach at Indiana University, on Herdes: "I've known Rick since he was in high school on an "A" All-Star team. Rick is an outstanding young man who has the total package to be a coach. He has played the game, studied the game, and is a good teacher of the game. He is very enthusiastic and loyal, everything a top coach needs."

Craig MARTIN Graduate Assistant Coach

In his first season as a graduate assistant coach, Craig Martin, a record-setting basketball player in the last four seasons at USI, will be responsible for academic monitoring, practice preparation, scouting, preseason conditioning, and travel.

A USI Presidential Scholar and four-year letterman as an undergraduate, Martin finished his career ranked number one in games played (115), number two in three-point field goals made (329), number five in assists (300), and number ten in scoring (1,058) all time at USI. He also was named Academic All-Great Lakes Valley Conference three times (1992, 1993, 1994) and first team GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-District V (1993) as a junior.

As a senior Martin received the GLVC Richard F. Scharf Paragon Award. The award is given by the conference to one male and one female student-athlete each year, based upon athletic excellence, athletic ability and achievement, character, and leadership.

During Martin's tenure at USI, the basketball team was a 1994 NCAA II Tournament Finalist, Great Lakes Region Tournament Champion (1994), GLVC Champion (1994), and participated in two NCAA II tournaments defeating the Big Ten's University of Wisconsin (1990, 7866). In the four seasons, USI had an overall record of 79-38 (.675) and a GLVC record of 47-25 (.653).

Martin graduated from USI in 1994 with a bachelor's degree in business.

Pearl on Martin: "I believe that student-athletes and coaches should try to be role models, and Craig Martin is a great example for young people. I have respect for Craig as a person, a student, and a player. There is no doubt in my mind that he will be a great addition to our staff and a credit to our coaching profession."



Physical Activities Center

HOME OF THE SCREAMING EAGLES

The Physical Activities Center (PAC), home court for USI Screaming Eagles basketball, opened in 1980. The PAC accommodates physical education classes, intramural activities, student recreation, and provides an oncampus arena for USI basketball and volleyball.

The PAC has a multipurpose activity area, a gymnastics and dance module, an aquatics area, physical therapy and weight-training rooms, four general classrooms, men's and women's locker rooms, and offices for educational and athletic personnel.

The multipurpose activity area is the building's most versatile section. It can support several activities simultaneously when the floor-to-ceiling curtains separate it into three teaching modules. Without the curtains, it can accommodate activities of a larger scope. Indoor intramural activities are held in the multipurpose area. The gymnastics and dance module overlooks the multipurpose activity area and complements the teaching modules.

There is an enclosed 25-meter swimming pool with one- and three-meter diving boards in the aquatics area. Weight-training and physical therapy rooms are important support components. In the multipurpose area during spectator athletic events and public forums, chairback and bleacher seating for 3,000 people can be moved into place. The spectator capabilities were made possible through generous donations from businesses and individuals in Southwestern Indiana. More than \$300,000 was raised by the USI Foundation in the Health, Physical Education, and Recreation Building Fund Drive in 1979.

In addition to regularly scheduled credit and noncredit classes, health maintenance and open recreation periods are available. Information on use of the building is available by calling at 464-1945.

The PAC also houses USI and community special events such as concerts, convocations, and commencements.

GLVC Adds Three

INDIANAPOLIS, IND.—The Presidents of the ten Great Lakes Valley Conference member institutions have approved the addition of Quincy University, Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, and the University of Wisconsin Parkside to the league.


Quincy, SIUE, and UWP would begin competing for GLVC titles in 1995-96. The conference sponsors championships in baseball, basketball (m/w), cross country (m/w), golf (m), soccer (m), softball, tennis (m/w), and volleyball (w).

Currently, the GLVC is an NCAA II conference consisting of 10 schools located in four states. They are Ashland University (Ohio), Bellarmine College (Ky.), University of Indianapolis, Indiana University/Purdue University Ft. Wayne, Lewis University (III.), Kentucky Wesleyan, Kentucky State University, Northern Kentucky University, Saint Joseph's College (Ind.), and the University of Southern Indiana. Ashland and Kentucky State will be leaving the GLVC at the conclusion of the 1994-95 year. Considered one of the

toughest conferences in the nation (NCAA Division II), the GLVC sent three champions to the NCAA Final Four in their respective sports this past season. They were Bellarmine (women's basketball), Lewis (baseball), and USI (men's basketball national finalist).

The formation of the GLVC can be traced as far back as 1972 when the athletic directors of three member schools— Kentucky Wesleyan, Bellarmine, and USI (then Indiana State-Evansville) began preliminary discussions about forming a basketball conference. Four years later, Indianapolis and St. Joseph's expressed interest. On July 7, 1978, those

schools—along with Ashland University united to become the GLVC.



USI Wins 1993-94 GLVC All-Sports Trophy

USI won the GLVC men's basketball conference championship to lead the University to its second GLVC All-Sports Trophy since 1983.

What makes USI's championship even more impressive is that the Screaming Eagles accomplished the feat while participating in only 10 sports. USI participates in NCAA Division I soccer,

making the sport ineligible for the GLVC All-Sports standings.

This year's race for the All-Sports Champion was the closest ever, as the top four schools (USI, Lewis, Indianapolis, and NKU) all finished within just four points of each other. The race went right down to the final spring sport, when USI finished second in baseball, third in softball, and second in men's tennis to ease past defending champion Lewis by 1.5 points.

In what had to be the most balanced competition in the history of the conference, eight of the 10 schools won at least one GLVC championship. Lewis, Indianapolis, and Bellarmine each won two championships, while USI, NKU, Bellarmine, Ashland, IPFW and Kentucky Wesleyan each won one title.

The award is based on a point system determined by what place a team finished in the GLVC's 11 sponsored NCAA Division II sports.
